This three-day celebration has activities for everyone. It includes a flower and plant sale, culturally diverse performances, baseball games, a classic car show, vendor/craft fair, flea market, a pretty baby photo contest, children's activities, and of course good food. (See related articles throughout this paper). Carnival games and exciting rides are featured at the Duchesne Knights of Columbus Fairgrounds.

The official parade on Sunday, May 7 is a highlight of the weekend that leads up to the crowning of the Valley of Flowers Queen and Court at the Duchesne Knights of Columbus Pavilion. This year's parade will feature more than 100 participants beginning with mobile units departing from the James J. Eagan Center at 1:45 p.m. Decorated vehicles and floats will proceed west on Parker Road to New Florissant Road Where youth, walking units, and the marching bands will merge. The complete parade will then travel south on New Florissant prior to turning west on rue St. Francois past the official parade reviewing stands, then left on St. Ferdinand, proceeding then to Washington Street and concluding at the Knights of Columbus Fairgrounds.

The theme for the 2017 Valley of Flowers Parade is 'Wonders of the World'." The parade will feature many floats and units decorated to reflect any of the wonders found


throughout the world.

He graduated from McCluer North High School and the University of Missouri, Columbia Veterinary School. After practicing veterinary medicine away from Florissant, he returned to work at and to eventually buy his father's animal hospital, Cross Keys Animal Clinic.

In 1986 Florissant Police Officer Tom Jost tried to start a police K-9 unit on a shoestring budget. Tom approached his old high school buddy Dr. Jones to see if he might be able to help. Dr. Jones said he would gladly help the police department and the City of Florissant by donating all the veterinary care for the working dog. Neither one of them could foresee then how successful

the unit would become. Now over 30 years later, Dr. Jones still graciously donates his care for the unit which has grown to 4 dogs.

Dr. Jones reputation has grown throughout the police canine community and he also cares for working dogs from around the entire greater St. Louis area. He has become one of the top working dog veterinarians in the region. He has been presented with multiple awards over the years for his knowledge and generosity not only to the City of Florissant, but the St. Louis region. His care and advice to the Florissant Police Dog Handlers has helped keep the animals in top condition to help serve the citizens of Florissant and the entire north county region.

Pit Bull Ban Repealed

As of March 14, 2017, City Council amended ordinance 8302 Section 205.395 Regulation of Pit Bull Dogs. Pit Bull/Pit Bull Mix dogs CAN now be legally owned in the City limits of Florissant. In order to register a pit bull/pit bull mix with the City, the dog MUST be spayed or neutered and have a current rabies vaccine from a licensed vet. Once all requirements are met and brought into the Health Department/Animal Control, a free City tag will be issued.

With the warmer weather approaching, we would like to take a moment to remind all residents that dog waste must be cleaned up every 24 hours from the yard. Remember too, when taking animals for a ride in the car, they should not be left in the car unattended. The temperature in a vehicle can increase very rapidly and put your animal in danger Also, every dog and cat must be registered with the City of Florissant Animal Control. In order to obtain a free City tag, proof of rabies from a licensed vet must be brought into the Health Department/Animal Control.

Dogs and cats are NOT allowed to run at large. All animals must be on a leash no longer than 6 foot and be under direct control of the owner. Our pets are family. Let's keep them safe. If you have any questions, please contact the Health Department/Animal Control at 314-839-7654.

The City of Florissant is conducting its Beautiful Home Award Program again this year. The program was established to recognize homeowners who take pride in the appearance of their home and community.




Street Work: - The Public Works Department is preparing to do \$3,350,000 in street work this year 2017 which includes \$927,000 in slurry seal resurfacing work on 130+ different streets throughout the City, \$589,000 in concrete pavement replacement and repairs on 34+ streets, and \$1,834,000 in major street repairs with an asphalt overlay on 13+ different streets. Major street repairs will begin in early spring. Thanks to the passage of Prop S last November 2015 Florissant has the street maintenance funds available to keep up with our miles of streets and to begin a program of restoration. These funds will be used this year to make improvements to 11 different streets plus major improvements to Keven Lane and St. Marie Street which will include all new curbs, gutters, and asphalt overly and other needed improvements.

The Public Works Department has three grant projects in progress this year that are funded at 80 percent by a federal grants received in 2014 and 2015.

- Design work is nearing completion for the replacement of St. Anthony Lane Bridge over Fountain Creek a \$550,000 project which will be constructed this summer.
- Design work and pre-construction work continues for the North Lafayette Reconstruction project which will include repaving the street, installing storm sewers, and adding ADA-compliant sidewalk and bicycle facilities from North Highway 67 to Washington Street with a total estimated budget of approximately \$2.7 million. Construction is scheduled for 2018.
 Design work and pre-construction
- Construction is scheduled for 2018.

 Design work and pre-construction work continues for the Replacement of the Pedestrian Signal on Derhake Rd. at Robinwood Elementary. This project will replace the aging signal and bring the crossing into compliance with ADA requirements. It has a budget of approximately \$140,000 and will be complete in 2018.

The City has partnered with MODOT and has been awarded another 80 percent federally funded reimbursement grant to make improvements to the intersection of St. Ferdinand St. and N. Highway 67 ... the main entrance to our St. Ferdinand Park ... primarily to ease congestion entering and exiting St.



Ferdinand Park and to improve safety and pedestrian access.

We have had robust **Economic Development** success which continued in 2016. Economic development continues to be strong and very active. Companies of all sizes that include National brands and Developers' are proving that they believe in the future of Florissant.

- Jewel Banquet Center (the former Yac's restaurant) was approved by Council March 27th and was scheduled to open in April.
- **Regions Bank** is building a new facility on Lindbergh near Dierbergs.
- McAllister's Deli will open a new restaurant in the former Bob Evans location
- **Signature Sandwich**, affiliated with Max's Meats, opened in January 2017 **in the Train Depot building** next to our newly renovated Tower Park Tennis Courts.
- Raising Canes will build a new restaurant on Lindbergh at the Eastern end of Surrey Plaza II next to Cross Keys Shopping Center.
- **D'Vita Dialysis** will open a new facility in the **former Beauty Brands location** in Cross Keys.

There are other exciting projects that are in the Due Diligence and Planning Phase that we are working with Developers to help them assemble the property to locate even more exciting new venues to the Beautiful City.

Since October 2016 - March 2017 ... 16 New Commercial businesses & 7 Residential Businesses have opened.

St. Ferdinand Shrine Has Added New **Events for the Valley of Flowers Festival**


This year will bring new events to St. Ferdinand Shrine. During the Valley of Flowers Festival we encourage vou to visit us and take part in our many activities.

Can You Free Yourself of Some **Investment-Related Taxes?**

Tax Freedom Day generally falls around this time each year. This is the day when the nation as a whole has earned enough money to pay off its total tax bill for the year, according to the calculations made by the Tax Foundation. So you may want to use Tax Freedom Day to think about ways you can liberate yourself from some of the investment-related taxes you may incur.

Of course, Tax Freedom Day is something of a fiction, in practical terms, because most people pay their taxes throughout the year via payroli deductions. Also, you may not mind paying your share of taxes, because your tax dollars are used in many ways law enforcement, food safety, road maintenance, public education, and so on – that benefit society. Still, you may be able to reduce those taxes associated with your investments, leaving you more money available to help you work toward your important goals, such as a comfortable retirement.

Here are some suggestions for making investing less "taxing":

• Contribute regularly to tax-advantaged retirement plans. Contribute as much as you can afford to your IRA and your 401(k) (Taxes will be due upon withdrawal, howevyour account at least five years.

• Follow a "buy-and-hold" strategy. If you sell investments you've owned for less than


a year, and their value has increased, you will have to pay capital gains taxes at your personal income tax rate, which, in early 2017, could be as high as 39.6%. But if you hold investments for at least a year before selling them, you'd be assessed the longterm capital gains rate, which tops out at 20%. Be aware, though, that the Trump administration and Congress seem likely to change the tax rates. Early plans call for a maximum personal income tax rate of 33%, with the top rate for capital gains and dividends either staying at 20%, or possibly being reduced to 16.5%. In any case, you'll still come out ahead, tax-wise, by holding your investments long enough to receive the long-term capital gains rate.

• Consider municipal bonds. If you are in one of the higher income brackets, you might benefit from investing in municipal bonds, which are typically used to finance public projects, such as roads, schools, airports and infrastructure-related repairs. Interest payments from "munis" are typically exempt from federal income taxes and may also be exempt from state and local taxes, depending on the state in which the bond issuer is located. Interest payments from some types of municipal bonds may be subject to the alternative minimum tax (AMT). Again, though, watch for developments from Washington, as both the Trump administration and some congressional leaders favor eliminating the AMT.

When charting your investment strategy, consider your risk tolerance, time horizon, family situation and estate plans. But investment-related taxes should also be in your strategic mix - so look for opportunities to keep these taxes under control.


Eddie's Heroes


