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COUNCIL MINUTES

July 10, 2017

The Florissant City Council met in regular session at Florissant City Hall, 955 rue St. Francois on Monday, July 10, 2017 at 7:30 p.m. with Council President Pagano presiding. The Chair asked everyone in attendance to stand and join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

On Roll Call the following Councilmembers were present: Parson, Siam, Lee, Jones, Eagan, Caputa, Schildroth, Henke and Pagano. Also present was Mayor Thomas P. Schneider, City Attorney John Hessel and City Clerk Karen Goodwin. A quorum being present the Chair stated that the Council Meeting was in session for the transaction of business.

Councilman Lee moved to approve the Meeting Minutes of June 26, 2017 and the Work Session Meeting Minutes of June 19, 2017, seconded by Schildroth. Motion carried.

Councilwoman Pagano moved to amend the agenda to add a Presentation by the Florissant Rotary to the Agenda, seconded by Eagan. Motion carried. Rick Dorsey, Florissant Rotary, presented a donation of \$500 to the Florissant Police Explorers.

The Chair stated the next item on the agenda was Hearing from Citizens.

Brian Hoelscher, Executive Director of MSD, updated the Council on the meetings regarding the recent flooding. He stated that the residents were put into three categories and will soon be receiving letters about upcoming meeting dates. Based upon the category, one meeting will be held on July 20 at 6:00 and another at 7:30 at the James J. Eagan Center. Another group will meet on August 3 at 7:00 pm at the JFK Community Center. Outside of those three groups, letters will be sent to the remaining residents and MSD will address their issues separately. Mayor Schneider stated that there will also be FEMA representatives at these meetings.

Nicholas Hoechst, 955 Charbonier, informed the Council that the "Next Door" App is also available to local municipalities. It can be used as a tool for the administration to disseminate information to residents.

The next item on the Agenda was Communications of which there were none.

The City Clerk reported that Public Hearing #17-07-017 to be held this night on a request to approve the final subdivision plat of "Surry Plaza II" for the property located at 2710 North Highway 67 had been advertised in substantially the same form as appears in the foregoing publication and by posting the property. The Chair declared the Public Hearing to be open and invited those who wished to be heard to come forward.

Debbie Stosz, Premier Civil Engineering, stated that they were dividing the site into 2 lots. Raising Cain's will be located on Lot A. All the Preliminary Subdivision requirements have been met and approved by the City Engineer. This subdivision does not affect the B-5 Ordinance for Raising Cain's that was passed earlier.

The Chair asked if there were any citizens who would like to speak on said public hearing. Being no citizens who wished to speak, Councilman Siam moved to close P.H. #17-07-017, seconded by Parson. Motion carried.

Councilman Eagan moved that Bill No. 9287 <u>An Ordinance to amend B-5 Ordinance No. 6697 to allow for a building addition for the property located at 2505 N. Hwy. 67</u> be read for a second time, seconded by Caputa. Motion carried and Bill No. 9287 was read for a second time. Councilman Henke moved that Bill No. 9287 be read for a third time, seconded by Parson. Motion carried and Bill No. 9287 was read for a third and final time and placed upon its passage. Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard. On roll call the Council voted: Parson yes, Siam yes, Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes and Pagano yes. Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9287 to have passed and said Bill became Ordinance No. 8326.

Councilman Jones moved that Bill No. 9288 An Ordinance re-adopting a procedure to disclose potential conflict of interest and substantial interest for certain officials as set forth in Title 1, Section 105.130 "Compliance with State Conflict of Interest" law in the Florissant Code of Ordinances be read for a second time, seconded by Caputa. Motion carried and Bill No. 9288 was read for a second time. Councilman Lee moved that Bill No. 9288 be read for a third time, seconded by Jones. Motion carried and Bill No. 9288 was read for a third and final time and placed upon its passage. Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard.

John Engelmeyer, 1281 Graham Rd., made a presentation regarding Florissant's Conflict of Interest legislation, Bill No. 9288. He requested an explanation of the verbiage of the bill – specifically whether direct or indirect conflict. Mr. Engelmeyer also expressed his concerns regarding campaign

contributions to elected officials and suggested changes to the bill. He asked the City Clerk to read the bill in its entirety.

On roll call the Council voted: Parson yes, Siam yes, Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes and Pagano yes. Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9288 to have passed and said Bill became Ordinance No. 8327.

Councilman Henke moved that Bill No. 9289 An Ordinance establishing a trust agreement for the City of Florissant Employees' Pension Plan be read for a second time, seconded by Schildroth. Motion carried and Bill No. 9289 was read for a second time. Councilman Henke moved that Bill No. 9289 be read for a third time, seconded by Schildroth. Motion carried and Bill No. 9289 was read for a third and final time and placed upon its passage. Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard. On roll call the Council voted: Parson yes, Siam yes, Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes and Pagano yes. Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9289 to have passed and said Bill became Ordinance No. 8328.

Councilman Lee moved that Bill No. 9290 An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into an exclusive license agreement with Meridian Waste Missouri, LLC for solid waste collection services for the residents of the City of Florissant be read for a second time, seconded by Eagan. Motion carried and Bill No. 9290 was read for a second time. Councilman Lee moved that Bill No. 9290 be read for a third time, seconded by Jones. Motion carried and Bill No. 9290 was read for a third and final time and placed upon its passage. Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard.

Kevin O'Donnell, 512 Rancho Lane, asked when this contract would be going in to effect. Councilman Lee stated that it was a contract extension and, once passed, certain elements of the contract would take place immediately.

On roll call the Council voted: Parson yes, Siam yes, Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes and Pagano yes. Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9290 to have passed and said Bill became Ordinance No. 8329.

Councilwoman Pagano moved that Bill No. 9291 An Ordinance to enable the city of Florissant, Missouri to join Show Me Pace, pursuant to Sections §67.2800 to §67.2835, RSMo, the "Property Assessment Clean Energy Act," and stating the terms under which the city will conduct activities as a member of such district be read for a second time, seconded by Schildroth. Motion carried and Bill No.

9291 was read for a second time. Councilwoman Pagano moved that Bill No. 9291 be read for a third

time, seconded by Henke. Motion carried and Bill No. 9291 was read for a third and final time and placed upon its passage. Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard. On roll call the Council voted: Parson yes, Siam yes, Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes and Pagano yes. Dear Honorable Neighbors,

As Mayor of the City of Florissant with consent of the Florissant City Council I am submitting a proposal for your consideration. We are requesting that the small amount of Florissant Golf Club property currently located in the Black Jack City limits be transferred into the Florissant City Limits utilizing a simplified boundary change.

The laws related to boundary changes are contained in Sections 72.400 - 72.430, R.S.Mo., and the transfer of jurisdiction of the golf course property from Black Jack to Florissant would be a simplified boundary change.

Section 72.405(6) addresses circumstances in which two municipalities propose a transfer of jurisdiction of property between them. This is accomplished by each City Council passing an ordinance requesting a transfer of jurisdiction as a simplified boundary change and submitting an application to the Boundary Commission.

The Boundary Commission shall, within 21 days of receipt of the proposal, publish notice of such proposal and the date of the public hearing thereon in at least 1 newspaper of general circulation. The Commission shall, within 21 days of receipt of such proposal, mail written notification of such proposal and the date of the public hearing thereon to the County Clerk and to the City Clerk of each municipality.

The Boundary Commission shall hold a public hearing concerning the matter not less than 14 nor more than 60 days after such publication and notification is complete. Within 4 months of receipt of the simplified boundary change proposal, the Boundary Commission shall determine whether to disapprove the proposal or to approve the proposal and allow it to proceed as an approved boundary change. Transfer of jurisdiction through a simplified boundary change does not require a vote.

Section 72.423(1) provides that all boundary change proposals are subject to the five-year planning cycle with the latest cycle calling for map plan submissions between January 1 and July 1, 2018. The St. Louis County Boundary Commission will not consider annexations until after the end of the map plan submission, except that consolidations and transfers of jurisdiction pursuant to Section 72.405(6)(2), described above, may be sought at any time. Thus, if Black Jack and Florissant agree to the transfer, it can be proposed at any time.

As a gesture of good will in appreciation for your approval of this proposal the City of Florissant would be pleased to offer the residents of Black Jack the same valuable privileges enjoyed by Florissant Residents at the Florissant Golf Club for a period of ten years which may be renewed by mutual consent. We offer this benefit to your residents at no cost to the City of Black Jack.

Thank you for your prompt consideration of this request which we view as a win-win for both cities and we look forward to scheduling a meeting with you to discuss this proposal.



I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The request before the commission is for Recommended Approval of a Final Plat located at 2710 N. Highway 67 from 'B-3' Extensive Business District. The site was already rezoned to a 'B-5' Planned Commercial District to allow for the redevelopment of the shopping center and a sit-down, carryout restaurant with drive-up service. The property is approximately 4.08 acres to be subdivided into 2 lots. Lot A is proposed to be 1.18 acres, with a new restaurant. **Drawings included are Final Plat V-3 dated 7/29/16.**

II. EXISTING SITE CONDITIONS:

The property currently has a vacant bank building to be removed and parking area.

III. SURROUNDING PROPERTIES:

The property to the West is an Auto Parts store in a 'B-3' District, the properties to the south are in the 'R-4' Single Family Dwelling District and includes 2735, 2745, 2765, 2785, 2795, 2805 and 2815 Sorrell Drive.

IV. STAFF ANALYSIS:

1. The application is accompanied by professionally completed Plat identified as drawing V-3 date 7/29/16.

2. Final Plat Review: A copy of the Major Subdivision Administrative Review completed by the City Engineer. This review covers comments for both Preliminary Plat review and Final Plat Review. Mr. Goldkamp has informed us that all comments were answered in satisfactory manner by the revision drawings and the items were to be placed on the agenda.

3. A recommendation from the Commission is required per 410.020 of the Zoning Code:

3. "Final plat.

a. After all public or common use improvement plans have been approved by the Director of Public Works, the petitioner shall submit two (2) copies of the final plat for review and approval. The Director of Public Works will review the final plat for conformity to the requirements of the subdivision and zoning ordinances and with current engineering practice and shall complete the applicable portion of the administrative review form. If the final plat does not comply with all requirements, one (1) copy will be returned, with deficiencies noted, for correction and resubmittal. Should more than one (1) resubmittal be required, an additional application fee will be charged.

b. Upon approval of the final plat by the Director of Public Works, the petitioner shall submit the original of the final plat, fully signed and executed by all parties having a legal interest in the property, including mortgage holders, together with twenty-one (21) copies of the approved final plat. The date shown on the plat shall be the date of approval by the Director of Public Works. The original of the plat shall be on tracing cloth (linen), drafting film (mylar) or equivalent material suitable for recording and permanent recordkeeping.

The petitioner shall also submit with the original of the approved final plat the following:

A copy of the indentures, if any, containing deed restrictions and establishing trusts, unless
these items are set out in full text on the final plat. If separate indentures are to be recorded,
they shall be referenced by notes on the final plat. If no indentures pertain to the subdivision,
this fact shall be noted on the final plat.

2) A certificate from St. Louis County showing that all taxes due have been paid.

3) A set of plans for each type of building to be constructed in the subdivision, including floor plans, elevations, color scheme, materials of construction, landscaping and siting of the buildings on the lots. Such plans must be sufficient to allow review of the structural and landscaping improvements proposed against the standards of good architecture, civic design, the character of the neighborhood, and the requirements of all other ordinances of the City of Florissant. When the petitioner intends to sell improved lots in all or part of the subdivision without buildings erected thereon, he/she may certify this intent in writing in lieu of this requirement.

A letter from the local postmaster approving the names of the proposed streets and the proposed system of addresses along such streets.
 A letter from the St. Louis County Recorder's office approving the proposed name of the

subdivision.

6) A completed and executed land subdivision surety bond, escrow agreement or certificate of completion of all required improvements as required by Sections 410.050(8)(a) and 410.050(8)(b).

7) A completed and executed water main agreement, if the subdivision is to be served by the City of Florissant Water Company, or proof that water lines and hydrants have been or will be installed and maintained by another public utility in conformance with Sections 410.050(8)(c)(10) or 410.050(8)(c)(11).

- d. No final plat shall be placed on the agenda for review by the Planning and Zoning Commission until all above items have been received by the Director of Public Works. Upon receipt of the required documentation, the final plat shall be placed upon the next available agenda for consideration by the Planning and Zoning Commission.
- e. The Planning and Zoning Commission may recommend approval, approval with conditions or disapproval of the proposed final plat. If the Commission recommends approval with conditions and the conditions are acceptable to the petitioner, the petitioner shall make any necessary changes in the final plat and shall resubmit the original and twenty-one (21) copies of the revised plat to the Director of Public Works for verification that the conditions required have been incorporated. The date of the revisions shall be shown on the plat. The Commission may require that the revised final plat be resubmitted for their review, or they may elect to allow the plat to be presented to the City Council directly after verification of the revisions by the Director of Public Works.
- f. The recommendation of the Commission shall be noted on the original plat over the signatures of both the Chairman and the Secretary of the Commission. The original plat shall then be forwarded to the City Council for their consideration.
- g. Upon the issuance of a recommendation by the Planning and Zoning Commission, the City Council shall set a public hearing on such final plat provided that the petitioner has deposited funds with the City Clerk sufficient to cover the anticipated cost of advertising such public hearing. If no recommendation has been made by the Planning and Zoning Commission within sixty (60) days of the first (1st) meeting of the Commission to consider such final plat, the petitioner may request the City Council to set a public hearing on such final plat by filing a written request thereof with the City Clerk together with any required deposit to cover the anticipated costs of advertising such public hearing. Upon receipt of such written request and the deposit for advertising costs, the City Council shall set a public hearing and in the absence of a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission, the Planning and Zoning Commission shall be deemed to have made a recommendation of approval.
- h. At least fifteen (15) days' notice of such public hearing shall have been published in a legal newspaper of general circulation within the City of Florissant giving the time, date, place and purpose of such hearing, but no public hearing shall be commenced until the petitioner has provided payment for the notice of publication of such public hearing. If such payment is not provided by the petitioner within sixty (60) days of submission of a bill thereto, the petition shall be deemed abandoned and the request for public hearing withdrawn.
- i. Upon enactment of an ordinance approving a final plat, the City Clerk shall certify such enactment on the face of the original plat and shall return the plat to the petitioner for recording. Two (2) copies of the final plat, with the book and page where recorded noted thereon, shall be filed with the City Clerk after recording. No building permits shall be issued for any subdivision until said two (2) copies of the recorded plat have been filed with the City Clerk."

V. STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Final Plat was reviewed and approved by the City Engineer as part of the process and as a condition required for submission of a mylar for recording. Staff recommends the Subdivision as submitted and any additional requirements the Commission would entertain regarding this development.

Suggested Motion

I move to recommend approval the final plat as presented, per the drawing (Survey 1115-0024 revision date 2/9/16) and recommend that the Final Plat be forwarded for consideration by the City Council.

Section 210.1300 Graffiti.

[Ord. No. 7572 §1, 1-13-2009]

- A. As used in this Section, the word "graffiti" shall mean and refer to any unauthorized inscription, word, phrase, motto, name, figure, symbol, picture or design which is written, scribbled, marked, etched, scratched, burned, carved, drawn or painted on any exterior surface or structural component of any building, structure or other facility regardless of the nature of the material of that structural component. Graffiti shall constitute a nuisance.
- B. No person shall cause graffiti to be placed upon any public or private building, fence, wall, bridge, sidewalk, road, parking area, street or road signs, utility structures or traffic light standards, driveway or similar structure or surface, nor shall the owner thereof suffer the same to remain thereon for a period exceeding ten (10) days after the date notice is mailed by the City to such person by U.S. mail, postage prepaid.
- C. No person may be in the possession of any spray paint or any container thereof nor any permanent or semi-permanent paint pens or similar device while in or upon any public or private road or upon any public sidewalk, parking area, driveway, park or premises, with the intent of causing graffiti as defined in Subsection (A) above. Possession of a spray paint can in a public building, park, facility or alley shall create a rebuttable presumption of intent to use the spray paint to cause graffiti in violation of this Section.
- D. In addition to the abatement provisions of this Division, any person found guilty of violating any provision of this Section may, upon conviction, be punished as provided in Section **100.080** of this Code.
- E. Declaration Of Nuisance Prohibited Acts.
- 1. The presence of graffiti upon public or private property within the City is hereby declared to constitute a public nuisance. No person shall create graffiti on any public or private building, structure, place or personal property affixed to any real property within the City.
- 2. *Definition*. As used in this Division, "graffiti" shall mean either or both of the following, as the context requires:
- a. The intentional act of defacing, damaging or destroying any public or private building, structure, place or personal property affixed to real property, within the City, by spraying or marking with paint, ink, chalk, dye or other similar substance any drawing, inscription, figure or mark of the type commonly known and referred to as graffiti; or
- b. Any such drawing, inscription, figure or mark so sprayed or marked.
- 3. Abatement.
- a. *Notice to abate*. Whenever the Director of Public Works is informed and believes that a public nuisance by reason of the presence of graffiti exists on any private property within the City, he shall give written notice to the owner, possessor or occupant of such property of the graffiti and the duty to abate the graffiti within ten (10) days from the date the notice is given. The notice to abate shall also include notice of a date, time and place for a hearing to determine whether the City shall be entitled to enter onto the property to abate the graffiti if the graffiti is not fully abated in a timely manner.
- b. *Removal by property owner or occupant.* Upon receipt of notice to abate graffiti, it shall be the duty Packet Page 21 of 33

of the owner, possessor or occupant of private property upon which graffiti has been affixed to remove, obliterate or otherwise abate the graffiti existing on the property within the time specified in the notice. The owner, possessor or occupant may satisfy the duty to abate the graffiti by permitting authorized agents of the City or authorized community volunteers to enter onto the property in order to remove, obliterate or otherwise abate the graffiti.

- c. Removal by City upon failure to comply with notice. Upon failure of the owner, possessor or occupant of private property to abate or permit the abatement of graffiti within the time specified in the notice to abate, the Director of Public Works shall, at the time, date and place specified in the notice to abate, conduct an informal hearing to determine whether there is probable cause to believe that graffiti is present on the property in question and whether notice to abate has been given as required in this Section. If the Director of Public Works finds there is probable cause to believe that graffiti is present on the property and that proper notice to abate has been given, the Director of Public Works shall forthwith enter an order authorizing the City to enter onto the property in order to abate the graffiti. Any person aggrieved by an order of the hearing officer may appeal from the order in accordance with the appeal procedures set forth herein.
- d. Upon completion of abatement by or at the request of the Director, the cost of such abatement shall be certified to the administration and finance manager who shall upon approval transmit the certification to the Collector of Revenue for inclusion of the certified cost in a special tax bill or with the annual real estate tax bill for the property. If the certified cost is not paid, the tax bill shall be considered delinquent and collection of the delinquent bill shall be governed by the laws governing delinquent and back taxes. The tax bill from the date of its issuance shall be deemed a personal debt against the owner and shall be a lien on the property until paid.
- 4. *Procedure for hearing.*
- a. Upon the filing of a request for hearing under Subsection (**E**)(3)(a) above, the Director shall hold a hearing within five (5) days thereof. Formal rules of evidence shall not apply, however the parties shall have the right to have an attorney present, present evidence, confront and cross-examine witnesses and receive a written decision based upon the facts adduced at the hearing.
- b. The purpose of the hearing shall be to determine whether the condition as to which the owner was notified constitutes a public nuisance as defined by Subsection (E)(1).
- c. If the Director is satisfied that there are reasonable grounds to believe that a violation exists which affects public health or safety, he shall order abatement of the violation under such conditions and within such time period as is deeded appropriate under the circumstances. Alternatively, the Director may enter an order allowing the condition of the property to remain if no violation is found to have occurred.
- 5. *Penalty*. Any person convicted of a violation of this Section shall be subject to a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisonment not to exceed thirty (30) days, or to both such fine and imprisonment. When appropriate, in addition to such fine and/or imprisonment, the court shall require those convicted of violation of Subsection (**E**)(1) to remove the graffiti and restore to its original condition the property on which the graffiti was created.
- 6. Any person who provides information identifying any individual or group of individuals who are responsible for creating graffiti on private or public property which results in a conviction of such individual or individuals under this Division shall receive as a reward one-half (½) of the total fine collected from the convicted individual or individuals.
