The Shrine is the oldest Catholic Church in the area of the Louisiana Territory. The convent wing was built in 1819 and the Church proper was completed in 1820.

During the Festival the Friends of Old St. Ferdinand will host a variety of fund raising activities with proceeds going toward the preservation of this fascinating historic landmark. Activities at the Shrine begin Friday, May 3, from 4:00 to 9:00 p.m., Saturday, May 4, from 11:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., and Sunday, May 5, from 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Tours of the Shrine will be available both Saturday and Sunday from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.



To draw attention to this service the Police Department joins forces with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) along with other government, community, public health and law enforcement partners in a nationwide prescription drug "take-back" initiative that seeks to prevent increased pill abuse and theft. The program will take place on April 27 to drop off expired, unused and unwanted prescription drugs for destruction at the Police Headquarters lobby.

The City of Florissant Community Garden kicked off their season on April 6th with a work day for the installation of berms, planting of seeds and seedlings, layout of mulch and construction of compost bins.



We are pleased to announce that our Community Garden was selected as the St. Louis site for the P.A.U.S.E. (Pollinators/Art/Urban Agriculture/Society/and the Environment) project. The P.A.U.S.E project is a joint program between the St. Louis Zoo, National Museums of Kenya and Tohono Chul (Tucson, AZ) and funded by the US State Dept. The Public Works Department has already started bidding out street projects for the year which will include surface sealing, major street repairs and asphalt and concrete pavement improvement for various locations in the City. We will also be doing some HVAC improvements to City Hall, Police Headquarters and the James J. Eagan Center. Tower Court Park improvements are underway and will be done by various contractors. MSD remains very active in our City finishing up \$7,900,000 in projects. The latest one is a storm sewer project on Harrison Street and St. Marie totaling \$271,000.

## **Winter Storm Virgil Unloads Record Snow**



A Winter Storm... in Early Spring? That is just plain wrong! Just when we thought we were out of the woods, Mother Nature throws us a nasty knee buckling curve snowball. On March 24th and 25th, Florissant and the St Louis area were hit by Winter Storm Virgil, a long persistent winter storm that dumped 10 to 12 inches of snow over the City.

However, much to the chagrin of Mother Nature, Street and Parks Department employees were more than up to the task. Working through the night, crews were able to keep up with the onslaught of snow keeping businesses and City Hall open for work on Monday.

By the numbers: 475 tons of salt were used, 450 gallons of gasoline,

147 gallons of diesel fuel, only \$5,000 in equipment repairs, 288 hours of overtime hours equaling \$14, 131.35 plus an additional 136 hours in straight time amounting to \$4,448.78 ... all total this winter storm cost about \$49,701.43. This was our 7th winter storm event this season. The total of all winter storms so far this year (hoping this was the last one) came to a total of \$140,057.73. Except for this storm, we have had a relatively mild winter.

Our Street and Parks Department employees deserve our heart felt thanks and appreciation for persevering under long and adverse winter conditions and succeeding with yet another job well done.

### Is your portfolio truly diversified?

Life is full of ups and downs — and the financial markets are no different. As an investor, you're no doubt happy to see the "ups" — but the "downs" can seem like a real downer. Isn't there any way to help smooth out the volatility in your investment portfolio?

First of all, to cope with volatility, it's helpful to know what causes it — and there can be many causes. Computers that make trades in milliseconds, based on mathematical models, are sometimes blamed for intraday volatility, but large price swings can also occur following the release of government economic reports, such as those dealing with unemployment and housing starts. Global events, such as the European economic malaise, can also send the financial markets into a tizzy.

By being aware of the impact of these events, you can see that the workings of the markets — especially their volatility — may not be as mysterious as you thought. Still, while knowing the causes of volatility can help you prepare for market swings, it won't blunt their impact on your portfolio. To do that, you need to create a diversified mix of investments because your portfolio can be more susceptible to negative price movements if you only own one type of asset.

To illustrate: If you owned mostly bonds, and interest rates rose sharply, the value of your bonds would likely drop, and your portfolio could take a big hit. But if you owned stocks, bonds, government securities, certificates of deposit (CDs) and other investment vehicles, the rise in interest rates would probably affect your portfolio less significantly.

Unfortunately, many investors think that if

they own a few stocks and a bond, they're diversified. But you can actually extend your diversification through many levels — and you should. For the equity portion of your portfolio, try to own stocks representing many market sectors and industries. Also, consider international stocks. And rather than just owning U.S. Treasury bonds, consider corporate bonds and municipal bonds, and diversify your fixed-income holdings further by purchasing short-term, intermediate-term and long-term bonds. Work with vour financial advisor to determine the mix of asset classes and investments that are appropriate for your financial goals and objectives.

How you ultimately diversify your portfolio depends on your risk tolerance, time horizon and long-term goals — there's no one "correct" asset mix for everyone. And over time, your diversification needs may change. To cite one example, as you enter your retirement years, you may need to increase your percentage of income-producing investments while possibly reducing the amount of growth investments you own. These growth-oriented investments tend to be more volatile, and you may want less volatility during your retirement. However, even during retirement, you will need to own a certain percentage of growth investments to provide you with the growth potential you'll need to stay ahead of inflation.

Keep in mind that diversification can't guarantee a profit or protect against loss. Nonetheless, building a diversified portfolio may help take some of the volatility out of investing — so look for diversification opportunities whenever possible.

The secured, steel collection box in the lobby of the police department is accessible to citizens any time of the day or night 365 days a year. Once collected, the drugs will be properly disposed of by incineration.

### **Please Leave Your Pet at Home in HOT Weather!**



On an 85 ° day it may only take ten minutes for the inside of your car to reach in excess of 100°, even when the vehicles windows have been left open an inch or two. The inside of a car can be 20 degrees hotter even on a pleasant 70° day. Pets most at risk are: young animals, elderly and overweight animals, those with short muzzles and pets with thick or darkcolored coats.

Hot Weather Traveling Tips

- Provide shade when your pet is outside on a warm day.
- Exercise your pet during the coolest parts of the day and never exercise a pet immediately following a meal.
- Walk your pet (s) on grass or dirt when possible as hot asphalt and tar can burn sensitive paw pads.
- Carry a large container of cold water for you AND your pet!
- Get a veterinary checkup before


traveling and make sure you have with you all vaccination certificates as well as flea and tick treatments.

If Your Dog Is Overcome By The Heat Immediately bring down your pet's body temperature by soaking the animal in cool water. Make sure water does not get in to the mouth or nose of an unconscious animal and seek immediate veterinary care. **Animal Cruelty** 

Most states, county and municipal governments have laws that prohibit leaving an animal unattended in a vehicle under dangerous conditions, which include hot weather. Law enforcement officials including animal control officers, may be authorized to enter your vehicle by whatever means necessary to remove the animal if they feel the life of the animal is threatened. You could have your car damaged, be charged with a crime and fined or imprisoned.



## **How to Heal Your Dry Skin**

Spring is here, but you might still have dry, brittle skin left over from the harsh winter weather. If your skin feels dehydrated. dull or looks like a dilapidated brick wall, then it's time to restore its moisture barrier.

Most cases of dry skin are mild and manifest in fine flakes and dry, itchy patches. Some people

may even have cracks in their skin that bleed slightly or their skin might feel tight after showering, bathing or swimming.

These symptoms can be treated with liberal applications of thick over-the-counter topical creams. The thicker and greasier the moisturizer is, the better it is. In fact, the Cadillac of creams is Vaseline petroleum jelly (yes, the grease in the tub). Otherwise, Cera Ve cream, Vanicream Skin Cream or Cetaphil Cream ointments work well and are better than standard lotions. Apply any one of these creams several times a day and within three minutes of getting out of the shower to trap moisture in the skin and keep it supple.

Severely dry skin can cause open



wounds and itching bad enough to interfere with your sleep. At this point, you need to be treated by a dermatologist who will typically prescribe topical corticosteroids to prevent eczema and other secondary skin infections. A dermatologist will also teach you how to make changes to your lifestyle to prevent outbreaks.

You can prevent dry skin by avoiding hot showers, drinking lots of water and using a humidifier in your home. Also, wash your skin with mild cleansers like Cetaphil Gentle Cl, Cetaphil Restoraderm or CeraVe and avoid harsh soaps, such as Irish Spring, Zest and Lever 2000.

Your skin is your body's number one defense against the outside world so keeping it soft and healthy should be your number one priority.


