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8	February 8, 2016
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10	The Florissant City Council met in regular session at Florissant City Hall at 955
11	rue St. Francois on Monday, February 8, 2016 at 7:30 p.m. with Council President Joe
12	Eagan presiding. The Chair asked everyone in attendance to stand and join in the Pledge
13	of Allegiance.
14	On Roll Call the following were present: Siam, Lee, Jones, Eagan, Caputa,
15	Schildroth, Henke, Pagano and Schmidt. Also present was Mayor Thomas P. Schneider,
16	City Attorney John Hessel and City Clerk Karen Goodwin. A quorum being present the
17	Chair stated that the Council meeting was in session for the transaction of business.
18	Councilman Siam moved to approve the Meeting Minutes of 1/25/2016,
19	seconded by Jones. Motion carried.
20	The next item on the agenda was Hearing from Citizens.
21	Linda Church, 13 McNulty, Neighborhood Watch Captain, stated that she has
22	noticed a marked improvement in regard to her neighborhood. The quality of housing
23	has improved and many people are getting to know their neighbors.
24	Abeer Motan, expressed her concerns regarding various issues.
25	Kelly Eagan, 155 Paul, informed the residents of the various events and
26	deadlines for the upcoming Valley of Flowers festival. She stated that anyone
27	interested in volunteering or sponsoring the event would be more than welcome.
28	The next item on the Agenda was Communications of which there were none.
29	The next item on the Agenda was Public Hearings.
30	The City Clerk reported that Public Hearing #16-01-001 to be held this night on
31	a request to authorize a Special Use Permit to RF Alternatives, LLC d/b/a Cellective
32	Solutions, LLC, to allow for the construction and operation of a telecommunications

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facility for the property located at 837 Dunn Rd. had been advertised in substantially the same form as appears in the foregoing publication and by posting the property. The Chair declared the Public Hearing to be open and invited those who wished to be heard to come forward.

37 Mr. Russell Been, petitioner for Cellective Solutions, explained that his company 38 is hired by telecommunication companies to locate sites for cell towers. T-Mobile 39 would like to place a 120 foot tower at the North County Christian School on Dunn 40 Road. He explained that, as companies' networks mature and capacity issues become a 41 problem, a pole is needed in specific areas. In order to satisfy the school and meet T-42 Mobile's needs, Cellective Solutions would like to replace one of the field lights on the 43 soccer field with a combination light pole/cell tower. The new light on the 44 southeastern section of the field will include a 120 foot telecommunication structure. 45 The current light standard is 65 feet tall. Not only does this satisfy T-Mobile's coverage need requirement, it also allows for 3 additional future users. This co-locating 46 47 of telecommunication companies on a single pole reduces the proliferation of towers in 48 the area. Mr. Been further explained that there is an existing 8 foot chain linked fenced 49 area on the site which T-Mobile and/or any future carriers can use to house their 50 equipment. They would like to begin work on the tower as soon as possible. It would 51 take approximately 6 weeks to complete the work.

52 In addition, Mr. Been explained that the reduced setback was needed because the 53 school would like the light standard/pole to be located at a certain spot on the soccer 54 field. He added that the tower would be constructed by engineers and approved by the 55 City's Building Department to meet all safety requirements, including wind load. The 56 pole is located far from the residential area. Mr. Been showed pictures of the monopole they constructed in Bridgeton, Missouri which withstood a recent tornado. 57 The poles 58 are designed in three pieces so that they collapse in upon themselves in the unlikely 59 event that they would buckle.

60 Wesley Thomas, 90 Mission Walk Ct., stated his opposition to the construction 61 of the cell tower on the school grounds. He stated that the pole was too close to Dunn 62 Rd. and where spectators sit and where the students play soccer. The electrical 63 equipment surrounding the pole would also be too close to the bleachers. Mr. Thomas 64 felt that the setbacks established for that site were there for a reason and should be maintained according to the city's zoning ordinances. Aesthetically, the monopole will 65 66 not look the same as the other lights on the field and will devalue the property. He 67 understood that there was a monetary benefit to the school for allowing the pole. He 68 asked the Council visit the proposed site and vote against this bill.

69 Kevin O'Donnell, 512 Rancho, asked about the height of the various cell towers 70 in Florissant and how they compared to the proposed one. He did not have a problem with this one.

72 Sheryl Dampf, 123 Calverton Rd., Operations Director for the school, stated that 73 Mr. Thomas was correct in that the school would receive much needed financial 74 compensation for the tower. The school administration had reviewed the various 75 possible locations and decided that the pole on the southeast corner was the best option. 76 Security and safety are of primary concern to the school and if students were climbing 77 the fence, the school administration would be the first to know and would take action. 78 To her knowledge, no student has climbed the existing fence.

Councilman Eagan requested that the petitioner look into a climbing deterrent substance or barbed wire for the fencing which might help prevent students from climbing it, to which Mr. Been stated that he would.

82 Councilwoman Pagano stated that she felt that the barbed wire would not be 83 aesthetically pleasing. Mr. Been suggested straight wire in lieu of barbed wire which 84 would be less visible and threatening. In regards to the bleachers proximity to the pole, 85 Mr. Dampf stated that the bleachers sat on concrete slabs and were not movable. They 86 were 15 - 20 feet from the pole. Councilman Schmidt agreed that barbed wire would 87 not be an appropriate "look" for a school. Councilman Caputa noted that there was an 88 error on the petitioner's plans which indicated that the fence was 6 foot and not 8 foot 89 tall. Mr. Been stated that it was an error and the fence will be 8 foot tall.

90 Kenny Green, 1230 St. Richard, expressed his concern about who is responsible 91 for maintaining the power that runs to the pole. Mr. Been stated that they would be 92 using the existing power easement. The power from the street to the pole is supplied by 93 Ameren Electric Company.

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94	Linda Church, 13 McNulty, suggested that the school contact the parents to let
95	them know of any precautions that they should take with their children.
96	As a side note, Mayor Schneider added that North County Christian School has
97	been an excellent school and outstanding neighbor. The administration has kept their
98	campus, buildings, and lots in first rate shape.
99	Being no other persons who wished to speak, Councilman Schildroth moved to
100	close P.H. #16-01-001, seconded by Jones. Motion carried.
101	Councilwoman Pagano moved to approve the Mayor's appointment of Ken
102	Green, 1230 St. Richard, to the Traffic Commission as a member from Ward 7 for a
103	term expiring on 2/8/2020, seconded by Schmidt. Motion carried.
104	Councilman Eagan moved to approve the Mayor's appointment of Brian
105	Hallows, 695 Mescalero Ct., to the Disability Awareness Commission as a member from
106	Ward 3, for a term expiring on 2/8/2019, seconded by Caputa. Motion carried.
107	Councilman Lee moved to approve the Mayor's appointment of Alex Crockett,
108	1370 Verlene, to the Environmental Quality Commission as a member from Ward 1, for
109	a term expiring on 2/8/2019, seconded by Siam. Motion carried.
110	Councilman Siam moved to approve the Mayor's reappointment of Margaret
111	Buchholz, 2525 Greenberry Dr., to the Senior Citizen Commission as a member from
112	Ward 8, for a term expiring on 1/8/2019, seconded by Schildroth. Motion carried.
113	Councilman Schildroth moved to approve the request to transfer Special Use
114	Permit No. 8068 from Phat Boys BBQ, LLC to Show-MO BBQ, LLC for the operation
115	of a carry-out restaurant located at 300 St. Ferdinand, seconded by Eagan. Councilman
116	Schildroth moved to suspend the rules in order to hear from the petitioner, seconded by
117	Henke. Motion carried. Mr. Jeremy Mitchell, 8415 Bridlespur, stated that Phat Boys
118	had closed and he and his wife would like to take over their business as it is.
119	Councilman Schildroth explained to the petitioner that he would need to get his plans
120	approved by St. Louis County. Mr. Mitchell stated that he had gone to St. Louis County
121	and gotten the necessary paperwork.
122	In regard to his background, he stated that he had been "Red the BBQ Man's"
123	head cook and he opened and operated his own restaurant in St. Louis city. He felt

that Phat Boy's was a very good location and the equipment was in top shape. He will

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125 be strictly a carry-out business. The hours of operation will be from 10:30 to 8:00, three 126 days a week. There will be no alcohol served. Mr. Mitchell buys his food from Sam's, 127 seasons and marinates it, then starts cooking about 5-6 a.m. He will be cooking in the 128 rear of the site as the prior tenant had done. He will contact Florissant and construct a 129 privacy fence as well as place the wood off the ground as Councilman Schildroth 130 suggested. Mr. Mitchell clarified that his smoker did not need a tank, so there will not 131 be one located behind the building. He stated that he will not use propane fuel-only 132 wood and charcoal.

Councilman Lee emphasized that if the petitioner planned to cook his food outside, he would need a variance from the St. Louis County Restaurant Commission. It might take some time to get the necessary approvals. On the motion to approve the request, motion carried and the request was approved.

137 Council as a Whole introduced Resolution No. 985 A Resolution of the Florissant City Council, Florissant, Missouri, encouraging the decision to locate the 138 139 new site for the National Geospatial Intelligence Agency Western Headquarters in 140 North St. Louis and said Resolution was read for the first time. Councilman Siam 141 moved that Resolution No. 985 be read for a second time, seconded by Pagano. 142 Motion carried and Resolution No. 985 was read for a second time. Councilman 143 Henke moved that Resolution No. 985 be read for a third time, seconded by Jones. 144 On roll call the Council voted: Siam yes, Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, 145 Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes and Schmidt yes. Having received the 146 unanimous vote of all members present Resolution No. 985 was read for the third and 147 final time and placed upon its passage. Before the final vote all other interested 148 persons were given an opportunity to be heard.

149Being no persons who wished to be heard, on roll call the Council voted: Siam150yes, Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes151and Schmidt yes. Whereupon the Chair declared <u>Resolution No. 985 to have been</u>152adopted.

153Councilman Eagan introduced Bill No. 9161 An Ordinance amending154Ordinance No. 8182 establishing a length of service compensation plan for part-time155employees by adding a Community Development Specialist position and said Bill was

156 read for the first time. Councilwoman Pagano moved that Bill No. 9161 be read for a 157 second time, seconded by Eagan. Motion carried and Bill No. 9161 was read for a 158 second time. Councilman Henke moved that Bill No. 9161 be read for a third time, 159 seconded by Schildroth. On roll call the Council voted: Siam yes, Lee yes, Jones 160 yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes and Schmidt yes. Having received the unanimous vote of all members present Bill No. 9161 was read for 161 162 the third and final time and placed upon its passage. Before the final vote all other 163 interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard. 164 Kevin O'Donnell, 512 Rancho, asked if this was a new position. Councilman 165 Eagan explained that it had been a full time position and was reduced to a part time 166 position. 167 Being no other persons who wished to be heard, on roll call the Council voted: 168 Siam yes, Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes and Schmidt yes. Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9161 to have passed and 169 170 said Bill became Ordinance No. 8202. 171 Council as a Whole introduced Bill No. 9162 An Ordinance approving the 172 Florissant Complete Streets Policy and said Bill was read for the first time by title only. 173 Councilman Schildroth introduced Bill No. 9163 An Ordinance authorizing a 174 Special Use Permit to RF Alternatives, LLC d/b/a Cellective Solutions, LLC to allow for 175 the construction and operation of a telecommunications facility for the property located 176 at 837 Dunn Road and said Bill was read for the first time by title only. 177 Councilman Eagan introduced Bill No. 9164 An Ordinance authorizing a 178 transfer of \$11,000 from Acct. No. 5-06-28020 "Golf Course Merchandise" to Acct. 179 No. 5-06-50060 "Golf Course Professional Services" for the purpose of paying 180 personal property tax for the golf carts and said Bill was read for the first time. Councilman Lee moved that Bill No. 9164 be read for a second time, seconded by 181 Caputa. Motion carried and Bill No. 9164 was read for a second time. 182 Councilman 183 Lee moved that Bill No. 9164 be read for a third time, seconded by Siam. On roll call 184 the Council voted: Siam yes, Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth 185 yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes and Schmidt yes. Having received the unanimous vote of 186 all members present Bill No. 9164 was read for the third and final time and placed upon

187	its passage. Before the final vote all other interested persons were given an opportunity
188	to be heard.
189	Kevin O'Donnell, 512 Rancho, stated that he thought the city had decided to
190	buy its own golf carts. Councilman Lee stated that the City never decided to do that.
191	Furthermore, he explained that the process of determining the personal property tax
192	rates were computed by the County Assessor.
193	Being no other persons who wished to be heard, on roll call the Council voted:
194	Siam yes, Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano
195	yes and Schmidt yes. Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9164 to have passed and
196	said Bill became Ordinance No. 8203.
197	Councilman Schildroth introduced Bill No. 9165 An Ordinance transferring
198	Special Use Permit No. 8068 from Phat Boys BBQ, LLC to Sho-Mo BBQ, LLC for the
199	location and operation of a carry-out restaurant located at 300 St. Ferdinand and said Bill
200	was read for the first time by title only.
201	The next item on the Agenda was Council Announcements.
202	Councilman Jones encouraged everyone to contribute to the T.E.A.M. food
203	pantry. Ward 2 will be hosting a Neighborhood Watch Meeting on February 15 at the
204	JFK Center at 7 p.m. There will be an assessment along a 4 mile stretch of Coldwater
205	Creek from St. Denis Bridge to Old Halls Ferry Rd. The Missouri Primary will be held
206	on March 15 and the last day to register to vote in the upcoming election is February 17.
207	Councilman Eagan announced that the St. Ferdinand Charity Basketball is
208	scheduled to begin the February 26 th with proceeds to benefit the Handing family whose
209	child, Nicholas, was diagnosed with cancer.
210	Councilman Schmidt stated that he was putting together a Ward 8 Neighborhood
211	Watch Meeting for some time toward the end of March. He will let everyone know
212	when the date is finalized.
213	The next item on the Agenda was Mayor Announcements.
214	Mayor Schneider stated that he had attended a Public Hearing for Missouri
215	American Water Co. regarding their request for a rate increase. He informed the panel
216	that, overall, the City of Florissant was satisfied with their service but could not support

217	nor justify an 18% rate increase. He encouraged them to suggest a more moderate
218	increase.
219	Disaster relief is available through FEMA at 1-800-621-FEMA if you think you
220	are eligible for help from the federal government. Tim Barrett, City Engineer, is also
221	available to answer any questions you might have.
222	The Mayor encouraged residents to participate in a "Spring Clean Up" before the
223	Valley of Flowers Festival. March 19 is the date for the annual Trash Bash, which is
224	coordinated by Tim Barrett and is an effort to clean up the creeks in the area. April 16 th
225	is the Electronic Recycling Day at St. Ferdinand Park for residents and non-residents
226	alike. Document Shredding will be held on April 23 rd at St. Ferdinand Park.
227	Spring Break Camp for students will be held March 21-25.
228	Jedi-Night Training for 2-5 year olds & 6-10 year olds will be held on March 6 th .
229	The annual Florissant Garage Sale will be held at the Eagan Center Ice Rink on
230	April 30 th .
231	"Party on the Ice" will be held at the ice rink on March 4 th for 8 th graders.
232	The 2016 Poetry Out Loud Competition at the JJE Theatre was well attended and
233	winners were announced.
234	The next City Council Meeting is scheduled for Monday, February 22, 2016 at
235	7:30 pm.
236	Councilman Schmidt moved to call for a closed executive meeting to confer with
237	the City Attorney regarding contract negotiations pursuant to Section 610.021 (1) of the
238	Revised Statutes of Missouri, seconded by Pagano. On roll the Council voted: Siam

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8	WHEREAS, the City desires to encourage walking, bicycling and transit use as safe,	
9	convenient and widely available modes of transportation for all people; and

11	WHEREAS, the City of Florissant supports the use of guiding principles that foster sa	ıfe
12	and accessible modes of travel including walking and biking; and

14	WHEREAS, the City has previously partnered with Great Rivers Greenway to constru	ıct
15	the Sunset Trail; and

17	WHEREAS, the City is partnering with Trailnet to prepare a Bike & Pedestrian Maste	er
18	Plan for the City; and

20	WHEREAS, the City desires to adopt a "Complete Streets" policy which is to be used	
21	a guiding principle, where practicable and economically feasible, in the design, operation and	
22	maintenance of City streets to promote safe and convenient access and travel for all users,	
23	including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists, transit riders, and people of all abilities; and

25	WHEREAS, the City will strive to consult with business districts and neighborhood	
26	associations in consideration of functional facilities and accommodations in furtherance of the	•
27	Florissant Complete Streets policy; and	
28		
29	WHEREAS, Complete Streets are beautiful, interesting and comfortable places for	
30	people;	
31		
32	WHEREAS, the design of cities begins with the design of streets as community place	2S
33	where people want to be, and streets will be held to a higher standard for urban design at a	
34	human scale;

36	WHEREAS, multi-modal accommodations and all City projects in the right-of-way	
37	should be approached as opportunities to enhance the aesthetic qualities of Florissant and its	
38	public realm through the thoughtful creation of place;

- WHEREAS, transportation improvements, facilities, and amenities that may contribute
 to "Complete Streets" will be developed to fit in with the context of the surrounding community;

- WHEREAS, the City will consider such transportation improvements, facilities, and
 amenities where such are practicable and economically feasible during the construction,
 reconstruction, or other changes of transportation facilities on streets and redevelopment
- 47 projects.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLORISSANT, ST. LOUIS COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

51 SECTION 1 – TITLE

52 This policy shall be known as the "Florissant Complete Streets Policy."

53

54 SECTION 2 – PURPOSE

- 55 The city shall design, build, operate and maintain a safe, reliable, efficient, integrated and
- connected multimodal network that will provide access, mobility, safety, and connectivity for allusers.
- 58

59 SECTION 3 – APPLICABILITY

60 While this policy does not require certain designs or construction standards and does not require

specific improvements, this policy does require the Director of Public Works to approach every
 transportation project and program as an opportunity to incorporate Complete Streets practices in

63 the design, construction, operation, and maintenance of transportation projects, improvements,

and facilities. This policy further requires the Director of Public Works to develop safe,

65 convenient, multimodal transportation options through the planning, development review, and

66 approval process for private development.

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This policy is intended to cover all development and redevelopment in the public domain within

69 the City of Florissant. This includes all public transportation projects such as, but not limited to,

Mayor,

You previously directed me to review the "Complete Streets" initiative that was brought to your attention by representatives from AARP and Trailnet. After researching this topic I see the benefits it offers and I recommend consideration be given to passing a "Complete Streets" ordinance for the City. St. Louis City and County have passed similar ordinances in recent years. I've included a brief discussion of the concept and its benefits and costs below.

"Complete Streets" means streets that are safe for all users including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists and transit riders of all ages and abilities. "Complete Streets" are promoted to offer benefits including improved safety for all users through safe design and efficient access, reduced congestion through the availability of alternate transportation modes, improved health/quality of life through emissions reductions and increased physical activity and recreational opportunities.

A "Complete Streets" ordinance directs the City to routinely look for opportunities to enable safe access for all users. Opportunities include but are not limited to, upcoming City street projects and repairs, administrative review of private development projects, and partnerships with transportation agencies and other municipalities. Work associated with these concepts typically includes replacement or retrofitting of sidewalk, curb ramps, bus stops and crosswalks, etc. for ADA compliance, making sidewalk connections where short sections are missing, adding signage and striping, and including bike facilities where applicable. We are currently addressing many of these items through our annual street and sidewalk contracts and in our grant projects.

In addition, "Complete Streets" concepts are now strongly encouraged for nearly all federal transportation grant programs. By committing to implementing these concepts, the City positions itself to continue to bring federal dollars into the City.

Please let me know if you would like to discuss this further.

to be in excess of one hundred (100) feet would exceed the limit without involving
specialized consultant report submission. The height proposed is 120 feet.

Staff has determined that this proposal shall require the applicant to obtain a Special Use
 Permit from the Council. The applicant is required to meet the requirements of a Special
 Use Permit under Section 405.240:

63 "SECTION 405.240: COMMUNICATION ANTENNAE AND SUPPORT STRUCTURES 64 A. General Requirements. The requirements set forth in this Section shall be applicable to all 65 antennae and support structures installed, built or modified after July 13, 1998.

Building codes and safety standards. To ensure the structural integrity of antennae
 support structures, the owner shall see that it is constructed and maintained in compliance with all
 standards contained in applicable State and local Building Codes and the applicable industry standards
 including the latest version of TIA/EIA.

Regulatory compliance. All antennae and support structures shall meet or exceed
 current standards and regulations of the Federal Aviation Authority (FAA) such as FAA Part 77 and
 Advisory Circular AC-70/7460-1 and Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Part 17 and any other
 State or Federal agency with the authority to regulate communications antennae and support structures.
 Should such standards or regulations be amended, then the owner shall bring such devices and structures
 into compliance with the revised standards or regulations at such time as any substantive work is done.
 Height of antennae support structures. Any antennae support structure which is

3. Height of antennae support structures. Any antennae support structure which is 77 proposed to be in excess of one hundred fifty (150) feet in height and located in Zoning Districts "B-3", "B-78 4", "B-5", "M-1", "M-2", "M-3" or "NU" and any antennae support structure which is proposed to be in 79 excess of one hundred (100) feet and located in any residential districts, "H" Historic Districts, "A" 80 Recreational District, "B-1" Local Shopping District or "B-2" Central Business District shall require a 81 clear showing that such height is reasonably required to provide communications wireless services and 82 such showing is supported by the opinion of a telecommunications consultant hired by the City at the 83 expense of the applicant. The opinion of the consultant shall include a statement that no available 84 alternatives exist which exceed the height limitation or the reason why such alternatives are not viable.

Lighting. Antennae support structures which are designed as flagpoles may be lighted,
 but no other antennae and antennae support structures shall be lighted unless required by the FAA or a
 State or Federal agency with authority to regulate, in which case a description of the required lighting
 scheme will be made part of the application to install, build or modify the antennae or antennae support
 structure. For structures that require lighting per FAA requirements, the use of white strobe lighting after
 twilight is prohibited. The use of red incandescent lighting at night is encouraged.

91 Advertising. Unless a disguised support structure is in the form of an otherwise lawfully 5. 92 placed freestanding sign, the placement of signs on structures regulated by this Section is prohibited. 93 б. Design.

94 Unless subject to the requirements of the FAA or any applicable State or a. 95 96 97 Federal agency, towers shall maintain a galvanized steel finish or be painted a neutral color consistent with the natural or built environment of the site. If utilized as a flagpole, the tower shall be painted white. Antennae equipment shelters or cabinets shall have an exterior finish

98 compatible with the natural or built environment of the site and shall be brick or natural stone or 99 compatible material as required by the City Council in the case of a Special Use Permit. Cabinets shall 100 have an exterior finish compatible with the natural or built environment.

101 Antennae attached to a building or antennae support structure shall be painted C. 102 a color identical to, or compatible with, the surface to which they are mounted.

103 All antennae support structures shall be surrounded by a landscape strip of not d 104 less than ten (10) feet in width, with such plantings prescribed in the Special Use Permit. Said landscape 105 strip may also contain security lighting as may be prescribed by the Special Use Permit. It shall be 106 exterior to any security fencing. In lieu of the required landscape strip, a minimum six (6) foot high 107 decorative fence or wall may be approved if such fence or wall is approved as an alternative means of 108 screening by the Special Use Permit. On guyed towers, guy anchors shall also be fenced. The tower 109 owner shall display on the site the reference to its FCC tower site number.

110 All antennae support structures shall be set back from any dedicated public e. 111 street and any adjacent residentially zoned property a distance equal to the height of the tower, unless 112 otherwise modified by a Special Use Permit approved by the City Council. All towers adjacent to non-113 residential zoned property shall maintain setbacks from such non-residential zoned property as follows, 114 unless otherwise modified by a Special Use Permit approved by the City Council: guyed towers shall be 115 set back a distance equal to sixty percent (60%) of the tower height; support towers and monopoles shall 116 be set back at least twenty-five (25) feet. In all cases, towers and accessory buildings shall meet the 117 minimum setbacks of the applicable Zoning District in which they are located. 118

Ground anchors of all guyed towers shall be located on the same parcel as the f. 119 tower and meet a setback of ten (10) feet from the property line to the anchor concrete. 120

Vehicle or outdoor storage at any antennae support structure site is prohibited.

h. On-site parking for periodic maintenance and service shall be provided at all antennae or antennae support structure locations. Access to and parking for antennae or antennae support structure locations shall be provided on a paved surface.

125 a In order to maximize the use of an existing or proposed wireless tower, the 126 tower owner shall, prior to the issuance of any Building Permit or Special Use Permit to alter or modify 127 any tower existing as of July 13, 1998, provide to the City a written statement signed by a corporate officer 128 agreeing to make said tower available for use by others subject to reasonable technical limitations and 129 reasonable financial terms. The willful and knowing failure of a tower owner to agree to shared use or to 130 negotiate in good faith with potential users shall be cause for the withholding of future permits to the same 131 tower owner to install, build or modify antennae or antennae support structures within the City and 132 possible forfeiture of continued use of the existing tower.

133 b. Prior to the issuance of any Permit to install, build or modify any tower, the 134 tower owner shall furnish the Building Commissioner an inventory of all towers in or within one-half (1/2) 135 mile of the City limits of Florissant and shall certify to the Building Commissioner that they have not been 136 able to conclude a sharing agreement to use one (1) of the existing towers or that an existing tower will not 137 meet the technical needs or coverage required by the applicant. Copies of all rejection letters and of 138 engineering studies indicating the technical reasons that an existing structure is not acceptable shall be 139 included with the application.

140 Any new tower at a height of eighty (80) feet above ground level or higher shall 141 be designed and constructed to accommodate at least two (2) additional user(s) unless a larger number is 142 indicated by the City. The willful and knowing failure of the owner of a tower built for shared use to 143 negotiate in good faith with potential users shall be cause for the withholding of future permits to the same 144 owner to install, build or modify antennae or antennae support structures within the City.

145 These general requirements shall be observed unless otherwise waived or 146 modified by a Special Use Permit.

147 В, Permitted Use. Upon receipt of the appropriate Building Permit, the following are allowed; 148 The attachment of additional antennae or the replacement of antennae to any tower or I. 149 the addition or replacement of antennae equipment shelters existing on July 13, 1998, or subsequently 150 approved in accordance with these regulations, provided that additional antennae equipment shelters or 151 cabinets are located within the existing antennae support structure site.

152 The mounting of antennae in or on any existing building or structure, except for outdoor 153 advertising signs, not exceeding twelve (12) feet above the highest point of the structure or except that 154 antennae mounted on a water tank up to twenty-one (21) feet in length or on utility transmission line towers 155 not exceeding twelve (12) feet above the highest point or utility or lighting distribution poles not exceeding 156 six (6) feet.

157 3. The maintenance, without alteration, of any antennae or antennae support structure 158 existing on July 13, 1998. Modification to an existing antennae support structure, including, but not 159 limited to, the replacement or addition of any antennae or equipment shelters, shall be subject to all the 160 provisions of this Chapter. However, this Section shall not limit the replacement of any antennae with a 161 162 like model for purposes of maintenance.

Administrative Approval. Prior to the issuance of a Building Permit, plans for the following С. 163 administratively authorized installations shall be reviewed and approved by the Building Commissioner. 164 In the event of disapproval of any such plans, approval may be sought by way of a Special Use Permit.

165 1. The enlargement of the existing antennae support structure site to support co-user 166 location as approved by the Special Use Permit.

167 2. The one-time replacement of any antennae support structure existing on July 13, 1998, or 168 subsequently approved in accordance with these regulations so long as the purpose of the replacement is to 169 accommodate shared use of the site or to eliminate a safety hazard. The new antennae support structure 170 shall be of the same type as the original, except that a guyed or self-supporting (lattice) tower may be 171 replaced by a monopole or disguised support structure. The height of the new antennae support structure 172 may exceed that of the original by not more than twenty (20) feet.

173 3. An antennae support structure if located on property owned by the City of Florissant and 174 leased by the City to the applicant or used by the City following approval of the City Council.

175 4. The construction of a disguised support structure in the "A" Recreational District, all 176 "H" Historic Districts and all residential Districts provided that all related equipment shall be placed 177 underground or concealed within the structure. In addition, the construction of a disguised support 178 structure in all commercial districts, industrial districts and the "NU" Non-Urban District provided that all 179 related equipment shall be placed underground or concealed within the structure or placed in a cabinet if 180 the disguised support structure is accessory to an existing commercial, industrial, institutional or other 181 non-residential use. In the event that any support structure is of a design or type such that there is a 182 question of whether such design or type is effective to camouflage or conceal its presence as an 183 appropriately placed architecture or natural feature, the Building Commissioner may disapprove such 184 support structure.

185 5. The installation of antennae on buildings or structures or the construction of an antennae 186 support structure on land owned by a Federal or State agency, Federal or State board or Federal or State 187 authority.

188 Antenna dishes in excess of twenty-four (24) inches in diameter. However, such dishes б. 189 are required to obtain a Building Permit.

190 Special Use Permit Required. All proposals to install, build or modify an antennae support D, 191 structure not covered under Subsections (B) or (C) above or required by the Zoning District regulations 192 shall require the applicant to obtain a Special Use Permit. The applicant shall be required to meet the 193 requirements of a Special Use Permit.

194 Applications for a Special Use Permit shall be filed and processed in the manner and 195 time frame as established for all other Special Use Permits under the Zoning Code and shall include the 196 following additional information: 197

An analysis of the area containing existing topographical contours; and a.

198 An inventory of all owners of antennae in or within one-half (1/2) mile of the City Ь. 199 limits of Florissant. The inventory shall include the antennae reference name or number, the street 200 location, latitude and longitude, structure type, height, type and mounting height of existing antennae and

201 an assessment of available ground space for the placement of additional equipment shelters; and 202 c. Whether the proposed location for the antennae support structure is within or 203 outside of the antennae site area as identified by the radio tower siting master plan and if the proposed 204 location is outside of the antennae site area, then the petitioner shall submit a statement of conditions 205 which render said locations unsuitable.

2062.Findings required. In addition to any other determinations specified by the Zoning Code207for the consideration of Special Use Permits, the Planning and Zoning Commission shall make findings as208to the following:

a. The proposed antennae support structure is not and cannot be located within a potential antenna site area as designated by the radio tower siting master plan.

211 b. There are other limiting conditions that render existing towers, structures or 212 buildings within the applicant's required geographic area unsuitable.

c. The design of the tower or structure, including the antennae, shelter and ground layout, maximally reduces visual degradation and otherwise comply with the provisions and intent of this Chapter.

216 d. The proposal minimizes the number and size of the towers or structures that will 217 be required in the geographic area surrounding the proposed site.

218 e. The applicant attempted to take advantage of available shared use options 219 provided by this Chapter or otherwise.

E. Cost Reimbursement. In the event the City needs to retain a consultant to analyze the technical
 requirements and appropriate location of a telecommunication tower, the applicant shall pay to the City of
 Florissant any and all reasonable costs incurred.

F. Tower Removal. Any tower or the upper portion of any tower which is occupied by inactive
antennae for a period of twelve (12) months shall be considered a public nuisance and the tower and
support structure including footings, where appropriate, be removed at the owner's expense. Removal of
upper portions of a tower manufactured as a single object shall not be required.

227 G. Radio Tower Siting Master Plan. The radio tower siting master plan is made a part of this
 228 Chapter as if fully set out herein and may be revised from time to time at the discretion of the Building
 229 Commissioner. (Ord. No. 7249 §1, 2-13-06)"

231 VI. STAFF ANALYSIS:

The Radio Tower Master Plan, which is in need of revision, involves strategy issues regarding frequency of towers, staff suggests that the Commission consider setbacks in paragraph 'e' bolded above to be in conflict with the proposal. Setbacks for other structures in the 'R-4 district are Front 35 feet, Rear 30 feet and sides 10 feet. Setback for this tower is 120 feet. The tower proposed is a monopole, as it is not disguised.

East-West Gateway Council of Governments is soliciting project applications for inclusion in their Fiscal Year 2017-2020 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). <u>I would like to request that the City</u> <u>Council adopt a resolution of support for the City's upcoming grant application</u>. The City desires to apply for Surface Transportation Program - Suballocated (STP-S) funds which provide up to 80 percent Federal reimbursement (20 percent minimum local match). STP projects are eligible for funding in 2017–2020.

The application includes the design and construction of improvements to the intersection of N. Highway 67 and St. Ferdinand Street. The existing intersection configuration and signal timing result in congestion and lengthy delays for vehicles traveling southbound on St. Ferdinand Street, particularly those turning left onto N.
