COUNCIL MINUTES

February 22, 2016

The Florissant City Council met in regular session at Florissant City Hall at 955 rue St. Francois on Monday, February 22, 2016 at 7:30 p.m. with Council President Joe Eagan presiding. The Chair asked everyone in attendance to stand and join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

On Roll Call the following were present: Lee, Jones, Eagan, Caputa, Schildroth, Henke, Pagano, Schmidt and Siam. Also present was Mayor Thomas P. Schneider, City Attorney John Hessel and City Clerk Karen Goodwin. A quorum being present the Chair stated that the Council meeting was in session for the transaction of business.

Councilman Caputa moved to approve the Meeting and Executive Meeting Minutes of 2/8/2016, seconded by Pagano. Motion carried.

The next item on the agenda was Hearing from Citizens.

John Engelmeyer, 1281 Graham Rd., stated that he would like Bill No. 9162 to either be read in its entirety or receive an explanation from the City Engineer, Tim Barrett. He also questioned a proposed work session bill which dealt with assumed "criminal activity" of citizens living in rental property.

Kevin O'Donnell, 512 Rancho, noted the violation regarding painting the exterior of the new Jimmy John's restaurant. He was under the assumption that the ordinance required that it be stained. Councilman Eagan stated that he would look into the situation.

The next item on the Agenda was Communications of which there were none.

The next item on the Agenda was Public Hearings of which there were none.

Councilman Eagan moved that Bill No. 9162 An Ordinance approving the Florissant Complete Streets Policy be read for a second time, seconded by Schildroth. Motion carried and Bill No. 9162 was read for a second time. Councilman Eagan moved that Bill No. 9162 be read for a third time, seconded by Caputa. Motion carried and Bill No. 9162 was read for a third and final time and placed upon its passage. Councilman Eagan moved to suspend the rules to hear from the City Engineer, seconded by Schildroth. Motion carried.

Mr. Tim Barrett explained to the Council and residents exactly what the *Complete Streets* ordinance was. He stated that AARP and Trailnet have been encouraging the passage of this bill. *Complete Streets* will be a program that provides for streets that are safe for all users, regardless of their mobility and/or access to transportation. Safe design, efficient access and the encouragement of residents to walk/bike are all part of the program. The ordinance sets forth how the city will accomplish this goal: retrofitting existing sidewalks, working with incoming developers to make sure there is sufficient access, that ADA facilities are provided for and by providing bike lanes where possible. This will help the city obtain federal grant money since these types of programs are highly encouraged.

Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard. John Engelmeyer, 1281 Graham Rd., asked many questions including, would the Safe Streets Project be implemented if no grant was awarded? He asked if the city's street and public works departments would be involved in the project. Also he questioned if any taxes would be used, what was the cost and who would maintain the work once completed?

On roll call the Council voted: Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes, Schmidt yes and Siam yes. Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9162 to have passed and said Bill became Ordinance No. 8204.

Councilman Schildroth moved that Bill No. 9163 <u>An Ordinance authorizing a Special Use Permit to RF Alternatives, LLC d/b/a Cellective Solutions, LLC to allow for the construction and operation of a telecommunications facility for the property located at 837 Dunn Road be read for a second time, seconded by Henke. Motion carried and Bill No. 9163 was read for a second time. Councilman Schildroth moved that Bill No.</u>

9163 be read for a third time, seconded by Pagano. Motion carried and Bill No. 9163 was read for a third and final time and placed upon its passage.

Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard.

Wesley Thomas, 90 Mission Walk Ct., stated his opposition to the construction of the cell tower on the grounds of North County Christian School. Mr. Thomas felt that the setbacks established for that site were there for a reason and should be maintained according to the city's zoning ordinances. No variances or exceptions should be given. Secondly, he gave examples where monopoles do collapse and he had serious safety concerns. Finally, although he understood that there was a monetary benefit to the school, the monopole will not look the same as the other lights on the field and will devalue the property aesthetically. He asked the Council to postpone passing the bill so that they could hear from other parents.

On roll call the Council voted: Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes, Schmidt yes and Siam yes. Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9163 to have passed and said Bill became <u>Ordinance No. 8205</u>.

Councilman Schildroth moved that Bill No. 9165 <u>An Ordinance transferring Special Use Permit No. 8068 from Phat Boys BBQ</u>, <u>LLC to Sho-Mo BBQ</u>, <u>LLC for the location and operation of a carry-out restaurant located at 300 St. Ferdinand</u> be read for a second time, seconded by Caputa. Motion carried and Bill No. 9165 was read for a second time. Councilman Schildroth moved that Bill No. 9165 be read for a third time, seconded by Siam. Motion carried and Bill No. 9165 was read for a third and final time and placed upon its passage.

Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard. On roll call the Council voted: Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes, Schmidt yes and Siam yes. Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9165 to have passed and said Bill became Ordinance No. 8206.

Councilman Eagan moved to approve the Mayor's appointment of Ginger Mulanax, 730 Bellarmine, to the Disability Awareness Commission as a member from Ward 3, for a term expiring on 2/22/2019, seconded by Pagano. Motion carried.

Council as a Whole introduced Resolution No. 986 <u>A Resolution supporting the East-West Gateway Council of Governments Transportation Improvement Program FY 17-20 for improvements to the intersection of N. Highway 67 and St. Ferdinand Streets and said Resolution was read for the first time. Councilman Siam moved that Resolution No. 986 be read for a second time, seconded by Lee. Motion carried and Resolution No. 986 was read for a second time. Councilman Jones moved that Resolution No. 986 be read for a third time, seconded by Caputa. On roll call the Council voted: Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes, Schmidt yes and Siam yes. Having received the unanimous vote of all members present Resolution No. 986 was read for the third and final time and placed upon its passage. Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard.</u>

Kevin O'Donnell, 512 Rancho, stated that he opposed this Resolution because the city would have to pay a large portion of the expense. Also, he had expressed his concern about this intersection at the public hearing for Culvers Restaurant over a year ago. At that time, he had been assured by several Council Members that the intersection would be an issue that MODOT would address, not the City.

Being no other persons who wished to be heard, on roll call the Council voted: Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes, Schmidt yes and Siam yes. Whereupon the Chair declared <u>Resolution No. 986 to have</u> been adopted.

Council as a Whole introduced Resolution No. 987 <u>A Resolution of the City of Florissant application to the St. Louis County Department of Public Health Waste Reduction Grant Program and said Resolution was read for the first time. Councilman Eagan moved that Resolution No. 987 be read for a second time, seconded by Henke. Motion carried and Resolution No. 987 was read for a second time. Councilman Eagan moved that Resolution No. 987 be read for a third time, seconded by Schmidt. On roll call the Council voted: Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes, Schmidt yes and Siam yes. Having received the unanimous vote of all members present Resolution No. 987 was read for the third and</u>

final time and placed upon its passage. Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard.

Being no persons who wished to be heard, on roll call the Council voted: Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes, Schmidt yes and Siam yes. Whereupon the Chair declared <u>Resolution No. 987 to have been</u> adopted.

Ordinance No. 8197 appointing nine registered voters to a redistricting Commission by removing Bernice Foley, representing Ward 8, and adding Steve Podry and said Bill was read for the first time. Councilman Schmidt moved that Bill No. 9166 be read for a second time, seconded by Lee. Motion carried and Bill No. 9166 was read for a second time. Councilman Schmidt moved that Bill No. 9166 be read for a second time. Councilman Schmidt moved that Bill No. 9166 be read for a third time, seconded by Pagano. Councilman Schmidt explained that Ms. Foley would be unable to serve on the Commission due to health concerns and, as a result, Mr. Podry agreed to take her place.

On roll call the Council voted: Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes, Schmidt yes and Siam yes. Having received the unanimous vote of all members present Bill No. 9166 was read for the third and final time and placed upon its passage. Before the final vote all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard.

Being no persons who wished to be heard, on roll call the Council voted: Lee yes, Jones yes, Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Henke yes, Pagano yes, Schmidt yes and Siam yes. Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9166 to have passed and said Bill became Ordinance No. 8207.

The next item on the Agenda was Council Announcements.

Councilman Jones encouraged everyone to contribute to the T.E.A.M. food pantry. He thanked all the residents who attended the recent Ward 2 Neighborhood Watch Meeting. He especially thanked Carol Webb, the Ward captain, for all her hard work.

Councilman Schmidt stated that he was putting together a Ward 8 Neighborhood
Watch Meeting for some time toward the end of March, possibly March 31st. He will
let everyone know when the date is finalized.

Councilwoman Pagano stated the Emergency Management Commission will be
holding classes on being a "weather spotter" for the National Weather Service at the JJE
Center on March 28 from 6:30 to 9:30 pm. She encouraged interested residents to attend.

Councilman Eagan announced that due to health concerns, his current

Councilman Eagan announced that due to health concerns, his current Neighborhood Watch captain had to resign. He asked anyone who lives in Ward 3 and would like to serve to please contact him. Also, he announced that the St. Ferdinand Charity Basketball is scheduled to begin on February 26th with proceeds to benefit the Handing family whose child, Nicholas, was diagnosed with cancer.

The next item on the Agenda was Mayor Announcements.

At the Mayor's request, Councilman Eagan moved to suspend the rules to hear from Tim Barrett, City Engineer, regarding Duchesne Park, seconded by Henke. Motion carried.

Mr. Barrett stated that the Army Corp of Engineers will be working in one area of Duchesne Park behind the pavilion. In a conservative move, the City would like to keep the park closed during the operation for safety concerns. They will be providing air monitoring, dust control, and screening along the roads. The Corp will take the material out, load it onto a train and ship it to a licensed storage facility in another state. Late spring or early summer the park should be restored to full use. They will begin the next round of sampling from St. Denis to Halls Ferry Road later in the year, with all the sampling completed and areas cleaned up by 2020.

The Mayor stated that Deaver's Restaurant closed recently, but the Grewe property owners stated that they will be able to find another restaurant type establishment for that location before long.

He congratulated Senator Gina Walsh who was able to find the funds to complete the I - 270 Project.

The Mayor's Shamrock Ball, "The Prom of North County," is scheduled for March $5^{\rm th}$.

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I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

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This is a request for Recommended Approval to amend a Special Use Permit to allow for expansion of an Auto Repair shop to include Auto Body work at 8461 North Lindbergh (MAG Automotive) in a 'B-3' Zoning District.

STAFF REPORT

CASE NUMBER PZ-021616-1

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II. EXISTING SITE CONDITIONS:

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The existing property at 8461 North Lindbergh has been MAG Automotive for a year.

This applicant requests an expansion on the site which will rescind Ordinance No. 7722

which allowed an individual to work on personal vehicles at the same location. The site

is a Shopping Center that has multiple tenants and the proposal is to use add the 36

accessory structure to the Special Use for a paint spray booth for vehicles, therefore, 37 38

continuation of Mr. Pierce's Special Use is not plausible since it marks a clear intent not

. 39 to continue.

The site is predominantly paved. The affect of the new parking ordinance on the number of parking spaces required for Auto Repair is 1 space for every employee on the maximum shift and 3 spaces for every service bay and one space for every vehicle customarily used in the operation of the use. This proposal would reduce the number of vehicles required on the site, see below:

The proposed would minimally be: 6 spaces for (2) bays along the south side of the building, (1) space for employees, plus parking for cars waiting to be repaired, 9 total parking for the Cellular Store based upon 4/1000 s.f. and Parking will now be based upon the 3 spaces for the additional bay, instead of per Ord. No. 7722 As many as (5) parked cars and one for Mr. Pierce.= 6 total.

Therefore, total cars on the lot must be a minimum of 7+9+3=19.

The accessory building on the property contains 840 square feet. The walls of the building are concrete block unpainted.

There is currently no additional signage or landscaping proposed.

III. SURROUNDING PROPERTIES:

The property to the Southwest is the Pizza Hut restaurant at 8457 N Lindbergh in a 'B-3' District, it is also bounded by 8471 to the Northeast (Penn Station) in a 'B-5' District and the property to the rear, 700 and 710 Thompson are in an 'R-6' District.

IV. STAFF ANALYSIS:

The petitioner wishes to essentially install paint spray booth equipment without changes to the exterior of the facility.

The current zoning allows for Auto Repair or Auto body, by Special Use if granted by City Council.

There is existing signage for this business under permit.

There are no landscape plans presented for this proposal. Landscape requirements for this property would include (52) shrubs and (2) frontage trees at 2 ½" caliper if stipulated to be as approved by the Building Commissioner. Two landscaped islands of 180 s.f. are required within the parking lot.

There is some brick on the front of the Building but is predominantly concrete block which is currently painted white.

RESOLUTION NO. 988

A RESOLUTION APPROVING PARTICIPATION IN A FRIEND OF THE COURT (AMICUS) BRIEF ON THE AUTHORITY OF MUNICIPALITIES TO SET STANDARDS ABOVE STATE MANDATED MINIMUM STANDARDS AND AGAINST UNCONSTITUTIONAL RESTRICTIONS ON LOCAL CONTROL

WHEREAS, the Missouri Supreme Court has before it two cases concerning the authority of local governments to set standards appropriate for their communities on matters of local concern; and

WHEREAS, recent circuit court rulings in St. Louis and Kansas City have placed limits on that authority; and

WHEREAS, the City believes that while state government has an important role in setting minimum standards for Missouri's citizens, local governments should be allowed to build upon and improve upon those standards to meet local needs; and

WHEREAS, because municipalities vary in size and demographics, there is no one size fits all approach that meets the needs of every different municipality in Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the City believes it is best positioned to determine policies that best meets the needs of its citizens; and

THEREFORE, be it resolved that The City Council approves the City's participation in pending litigation in the Missouri Supreme Court in cases arising out of St. Louis and Kansas City, and authorizes Counsel from the Saint Louis University Legal Clinic and other private counsel who provide legal assistance to the Legal Clinic to file amicus briefs in those cases under the City's name and on the City's behalf arguing in favor of the authority of local governments to set standards higher than state minimums and against unconstitutional restrictions on local control.

The City Attorney will coordinate with Counsel from the Saint Louis University Legal Clinic and other private counsel who are providing legal assistance at no charge to the City in preparation of briefs for the Missouri Supreme Court.

The City Attorney will keep the City Council appraised of all developments and arguments in the pending litigation.
