

## REGISTRATION

### **Am I registered to vote?**

Visit [sl.sos.mo.gov/elections/voterlookup](http://sl.sos.mo.gov/elections/voterlookup) to check your voter registration status.

### **How do I register to vote?**

Visit [sos.mo.gov/elections/goVoteMissouri/register](http://sos.mo.gov/elections/goVoteMissouri/register) and choose between submitting an application online, printing and mailing an application or registering in person.

### **How do I update my information?**

Visit [sos.mo.gov/elections/goVoteMissouri/register](http://sos.mo.gov/elections/goVoteMissouri/register) and complete a new application via online, print or in person.

### **What is the cutoff date for registering for the November General Election?**

October 7, 2020

## ABSENTEE & MAIL-IN BALLOTS

### **What is the difference between a mail-in ballot and an absentee ballot?**

Mail-in ballots must be requested in-person or by mail and returned via USPS. Absentee ballots can be requested online, by mail or in-person and can be returned via mail or in-person.

### **How do I request an absentee or mail-in ballot?**

Visit [stlouiscovotes.com](http://stlouiscovotes.com) and choose the "Absentee Application" button. This application is for both the absentee and mail-in ballot. You may also call 314-615-1833.

### **When will I receive my absentee or mail-in ballot?**

Absentee and mail-in ballots are mailed beginning September 22nd. You will receive your ballot after this date. The status of ballots can be tracked at [MyBallotTracking.com](http://MyBallotTracking.com).

### **If my absentee ballot requires a notary, where can I get it notarized at?**

The Board of Elections (BOE) office and satellite sites will have notaries available from September 22 - November 2. Reference the schedule in the next question for exact dates and times.

### **Where and when will the BOE Office and satellite sites be available?**

September 22 - October 21 (Monday thru Friday, 8am to 4:30pm) \*ONLY APPLIES TO BOE OFFICE\*  
October 22 - November 1 (Monday thru Friday, 8am to 4:30pm)  
October 24 & October 31 (Saturday, 9am to 1pm)  
November 2 (Monday, 8am to 5pm)

## ABSENTEE & MAIL-IN BALLOTS (CONTINUED)

### When do absentee and mail-in ballots need to be sent back to the Board of Elections?

As soon as possible. The USPS recommends no later than 7-10 days prior to Election Day.

### If I change my mind or forget to mail my ballot in time, can I vote in person on Election Day?

Yes. Bring your ballot to a polling place on Election Day and surrender it. You may then vote in person at the polling place.

## POLLING PLACES

### Can I vote at any polling place in St. Louis County?

Yes.

### How do I find out which polling places are closest to me?

## ELECTION JUDGES

### How can I sign up to become an election judge?

Visit [vote4stlco.com/pollaccess/](http://vote4stlco.com/pollaccess/) and complete the application.

## OTHER

### What kind of ID do I need to vote?

- Current driver or non-driver license
- U.S. Passport
- Military ID
- Missouri Voter Identification Card
- Identification issued by the State of Missouri
- Identification issued by the U.S. Government
- State college/university ID
- Current utility bill
- Current bank statement
- Current government check
- Current paycheck
- Current government document

If you have no form of identification, but are a registered voter, you may cast a provisional ballot.

### How can I find out what's on my ballot before Election Day?

Sample ballots will be available beginning September 22. Visit [stlouiscovotes.com](http://stlouiscovotes.com) and choose the "Your Sample Ballot" button to preview your sample ballot.

### If I am physically disabled, what are my options for voting?

Curbside voting is available at the BOE office for anyone who is physically disabled September 22 through November 3.
