WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT COVID-19 AND VOTING

No voter should have to choose between their safety and their fundamental right to vote in November. If voting in-person is preferable or necessary, everyone can do things to minimize their COVID-19 risk.





Plan on where you will vote as you can now vote at any polling location in the county.



Wear a face covering when visiting a polling location.



Try to stay outdoors as long as possible when at a polling location.



Check for separate points of entry and exit to limit exposure.



Look for designated areas at the poll where voters will be required to show identification and have yours ready.



Maintain a distance of at least six feet from other voters and election judges when possible.



Look for tape or other markers that show six-foot distances in lines and at polling location tables.



Ask election judges any questions you have about safety measures that are in place.



Avoid bringing any unnecessary persons to the polling location such as children.



When leaving a polling location exit safely and efficiently to limit exposure.
