

**WHEREAS** adoption by the City of Florissant demonstrates their commitment to hazard mitigation and achieving the goals outlined in the *Plan*


**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY** the City of Florissant in the State of Missouri, THAT:

## CRS 510 - 2025 Annual Progress Report

### Action Items for Reducing Risk of Flood Damage:

- 1) **Protect stream buffers from development and create setback requirements along streams.**
  - a) Implemented.
- 2) **Municipalities should use floodplain best management practices (BMP).**
  - a) Implemented within the City's permitting process.
- 3) **Join or maintain participating status in National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and join FEMA Community Rating System (CRS).**
  - a) Completed.
- 4) **Use Green Infrastructure / Nature Based Solutions to manage stormwater where it falls.**
  - a) Currently developing a stormwater masterplan with HR Green.
- 5) **Restore floodplains and streams. Restoring the function of flood plains can provide benefits of flood risk reduction and improve water quality and habitat for fish and wildlife.**
  - a) No projects to report.
- 6) **Buy out frequently flooded properties.**
  - a) Currently undergoing HMGP Buyout process of seven (7) properties in the floodplain.
- 7) **Retrofit or reconstruct infrastructure.**
  - a) No projects to report.
- 8) **Structure elevation.**
  - a) No projects to report.
- 9) **Removal of public structures.**
  - a) No projects to report.
- 10) **Dry flood proofing historic buildings.**
  - a) No projects to report.
- 11) **Dry flood proofing non-residential structures.**
  - a) Floodproofing is underway for one (1) non-residential structure.
- 12) **Localized and non-localized flood risk reduction.**
  - a) Currently developing a stormwater masterplan with HR Green.
- 13) **Soil stabilization.**
  - a) Soil stabilization is being implemented within the City's land disturbance ordinance.
- 14) **Post-disaster code enforcement.**
  - a) Post-disaster code enforcement is being implemented, and damage assessments are being performed as required.
