

## Valley of Flowers Festival May 4, 5 & 6 "Valley of Flowers Celebrates the Muny's 100th"

Since 1963, the Valley of Flowers Festival celebration has been the "first festival of spring" featuring a variety of events, including a superb parade!

This three-day celebration has activities for everyone. It includes a flower and plant sale, culturally diverse performances, baseball games, a classic car show, vendor/craft fair, flea market, a pretty baby photo contest, children's activities, and of course good food. (See related articles throughout this paper). Carnival games and exciting rides are featured at the Duchesne Knights of Columbus Fairgrounds.

The official parade on Sunday, May 6 is a highlight of the weekend that leads up to the crowning of the Valley of Flowers Queen and Court at the Duchesne Knights of Columbus Pavilion. This year's parade will feature more than 100 participants beginning with mobile units departing from the James J. Eagan Center at 1:45 p.m. Decorated vehicles and floats will proceed west on Parker Road to New Florissant Road where vouth and walking units, as well as the marching bands will merge. The complete parade will then travel south on New Florissant prior to turning west on rue St. Francois past the official parade reviewing stands, then left on St. Ferdinand, proceeding then to Washington Street and concluding at the Knights of Columbus Fairgrounds. The theme for the 2018 Valley of Flowers Parade is "Muny's 100th" and will feature many floats and units decorated to reflect themes of the Muny's plays which have taken place over the last 100 years. Many City officials and local municipal emergency responder vehicles, the Valley of Flowers reigning Queen and Court, and all seventeen 2018 Candidates as well as car clubs, walking units, horse groups, dog clubs, dance schools and scout groups, that make up the fabric of our community, will participate to help create a colorful and fun parade!

When the parade concludes at the Knights of Columbus Grounds, the Candidates will proceed to the pavilion stage where Mayor Thomas Schneider will crown the 2018 Valley of Flowers Queen and Court at 4:00 p.m. Prior to the crowning ceremony, awards will be presented to the various winning parade units and their sponsors, and the Pretty Baby Photo Contest winners.

Please arrive early to get good seats along the parade route for one of the largest and most colorful spring parades in the St. Louis Metro area; then join us at the Knights of Columbus Pavilion for the exciting award and crowning ceremonies! COMPLETED applications will be accepted Tuesday, May 1, 2018 on a "First-Come-First Serve" basis until all funds have been awarded.

The Home Improvement Program offers forgivable loans to income eligible Florissant homeowners. Applicants must be Florissant homeowners and they must have owned and occupied the house for at least two years prior to application.

Homeowners accepted into the program must remain in their home five years from the date of completion of the program requirements.

The 56th Annual Valley of Flowers Festival takes place May 4, 5 and 6. The theme this year is the "Valley of Flowers celebrates the Municipal Opera (Muny) at Forest Park's 100th"anniversary. This is the oldest, largest and most enjoyable community festival in the metropolitan area every year, with a wide variety of family fun at two main venues. Long-time Circus Flora performer Nino the Clown is bringing his Zoppe Italian Family Circus back to Florissant for free performances at the Valley of Flowers Festival, two for the public on Friday evening May 4 and three on Saturday May 5. Visit the Eagan Center for indoor and outdoor entertainment or the Knights of Columbus grounds for a day of family fun on the rides and midway followed by some famous Valley of Flowers barbeque.

Old Town Partners will kick off their first Wednesday Night Out (WNO) event "Proud to be an American!" at 6:00 p.m. on May 30th in front of the VFW Post on rue St. Francois. At 5:45 we will dedicate a Walk Thru History Plaque in honor of the Vietnam Unknown who was later identified as Florissant Son, First Lieutenant Michael Blassie, a fighter pilot who was shot down May 11, 1972. The next (WNO) event in Old Town will be held on June 27th at 6:00 p.m. site to be determined and we will be dedicating a Walk Thru History plaque in honor of Dr. Paul Detrick, Sr. The third (WNO) event "Movie Night" will be on July 25th at the Old St. Ferdinand Shrine and we will dedicate a Walk Thru History plaque at 5:45 PM in honor of the late Kay Spring. August 30th will be the fourth (WNO) event "Dancing in the Street" at 6:00 p.m. from Stems Florist to Bunkers and we will dedicate our last plaque of the vear in honor of the late Lowell Girardier. On September 27th we will host the last (WNO) event of the year at Hendel's starting at 6:00 p.m. For more information contact the Old Town Partners' office at 314-837-0033.

The first Florissant Food Truck Knight was held on Friday, April 20th sponsored by the Knights of Columbus and the City with future food truck nights scheduled for June 15th, August 17th and October 12th. There will be barrels to collect non-perishable canned and dry food for the nearby TEAM food pantry, and proceeds from the event will benefit Knight's sponsored charities including TEAM. The 10th Annual Trash Bash litter cleanup was a huge success. I want to thank City Engineer Tom Goldkamp along with all the City staff for all of their hard work. We

had over 30 volunteers that turned out at Sunset Park to pick up litter along the banks of the Missouri River. The event was part of the 10th Annual Trash Bash which was organized by MSD, Greenway Network, Great Rivers Greenway, Missouri American Water, St. Louis County, Missouri Department of Conservation, St. Louis Audubon Society and various municipalities and agencies, including Florissant.

Florissant is blessed with an outstanding Police Force. If you see something suspicious, call the **Police Department** immediately. By recycling your electronic equipment, you saved the energy that would be required to produce useful material and prevented hazardous components from entering the environment in landfills.

The 7th Annual Florissant "Free Resident Document **Shredding Day"** was held on Saturday, April 21st at St. Ferdinand Park. The service allows residents to have their sensitive tax, bank or financial records from home shredded right in front of their eyes for peace of mind. Cintas Document Management Company was there to professionally shred the material, which was processed in a manner in which it can not be recognized or recreated. All material was then recycled. A special thanks to Meridian Waste Services for assisting the City with this event. These two events were coordinated by Health Department Supervisor Greg Koester and his staff at the Health Department. This past tax preparation season the Senior Office helped more than 1,000 senior residents prepare their 2017 tax returns. I would like to commend Senior Coordinator Peggy Hogan and her staff, who always do an outstanding job in assisting seniors with this service that uses many valuable volunteers to make this available free of charge. ## Our Town from the Mayor



We are pleased with the improvements at the Florissant Golf Club made by **Course Superintendent Andy** Sprunt who has modified our 18hole championship golf course into a beautiful facility to appeal to golfers of all skill levels. Andy hails from Great Britain, the home of golf, and has brought a taste of the old country to his adopted new home.

The Public Works Department is preparing to do \$5,527,000 in street work which includes \$990,000 in slurry seal resurfacing work on 112 different streets, \$450,000 in concrete pavement replacement and repairs on 23 streets, and \$1,700,000 in major street repairs with an asphalt overlay on 19 different streets. Work also includes replacement of the St. Anthony Lane Bridge over Fountain creek estimated at \$550,000 and major street and storm water work on North Lafayette Street (N.Hwy.67 to Washington) estimated at \$2,327,000. Major street repairs will begin in early spring.

The street work on N. Lafayette Street and the replacement of St. Anthony Lane Bridge over Fountain creek are made possible from grants received from East-West Coordinating Gateway and the Council Missouri Department of Transportation. Recently MoDOT completed inspections of all bridge structures in the City and found no major problems on any of our structures.

The City has been officially notified that the Insurance Services Office (ISO) an independent insurer-supported organization has upgraded our Building Code Effectiveness grade from a Class 4 to a Class 3 (Class 1 being the highest). Effective code enforcement helps keep insurance rates down and has a major influence on the economic well-being of a municipality.

The new Municipal Court **Building and Police Substation** (formerly the Dick Weber Bowling Lanes on Washington Street) is nearing completion and will accommodate a large, modern municipal court-room, court office facility and a police sub-station. Renovations will be completed and a dedication ceremony will take place this summer. The Public Works Department has also implemented a new program to monitor and maintain vacant properties and residential rental properties in the City. If vacant residential property owners refuse to maintain the exterior of their properties, then the City will contract to have the work done and will bill the owner. Vacant properties left vacant for over six months must have them registered with the City so the Police and Public Works departments can keep an eye on them. Owners of residential rental properties must attend a Crime Free Seminar before they can renew their residential rental licenses for the year. These mandatory Crime

**Free Seminars** have been well received and are very informative to landlords and explains in much more detail how the City partners with landlords to monitor and maintain their properties and help keep good tenants thereby increasing all property values.

We continue to have robust **Economic Development** success. Companies of all sizes, including National brands and Developers, are proving that they believe in the future of Florissant.

There are many exciting projects that are in the **Due Diligence and Planning Phase** and we are working with the Developers to bring them to fruition anticipating more public announcements this year. BJC Hospitals has announced plans to develop a Multi-Million Dollar Siteman Cancer Center at the Christian Northwest Campus on Graham Road near 270 which are sure to stimulate even more economic growth.

# Old Town Partners Presents the Valley of Flowers Car Show





### What Should Investors Know About Recent Volatility?

We've often experienced big sell-offs, but they've generally been followed with strong recoveries. Of course, past performance is not a guarantee of future results, but history has shown that patient, persistent investors have often been rewarded. Fundamentals are strong. While short-term market movements can be caused by a variety of factors, economic conditions and corporate earnings typically drive performance in the long term. Right

now, the U.S. economy is near full employment, consumer and business sentiment has risen strongly, manufacturing and service activity is at multi-year highs, and GDP growth in 2018 appears to be on track for the best performance since 2015. Furthermore, corporate earnings are expected to rise this year.








## North County Inc. Leadership Supports State Transportation Task Force Recommendations to Increase Funding

Last year, the General Assembly established the 21st Century Missouri Transportation System Task Force, a 23-member bipartisan panel comprised of participants from the House of Representatives, Senate, Executive Branch and private sector. The City of Florissant's Mayor Tom Schneider was chosen to represent the North County community as part of this panel. The Task Force was charged to evaluate and make recommendations a



about Missouri's transportation system and its funding.

It released its report January 2 recommending a 10 cent increase to the state's gas tax for each gallon and a 12-cent tax increase for diesel fuel to maintain Missouri's more than 3,000 miles of highway. North County Inc., along with the Greater North County Chamber of Commerce, supports the fuel tax increase.

"It is critical MoDOT receives a revenue stream that provides the ability to maintain its roads and bridges as well as funds for major capital improvements such as the reconstruction of I-270 in North County." said NCI Board Member, Florissant Mayor Tom Schneider.

"North County is among Missouri's aging, deteriorating transportation infrastructure and is in dire need of repair, maintenance and upgrades. This investment in transportation would go a long way to improving travel safety and economic development," said North County Inc. President and CEO Rebecca Zoll.

The tax increase is estimated to generate a revenue stream of \$50 to \$70 million transit and other multi-modal transportation and an additional \$430 million a year for roads and bridges. For nearly two decades, gas and diesel taxes haven't increased from 17 cents.

"Many portions of 1-270 are over 50 years old and in desperate need of repair. As vehicles become more fuel efficient, there won't be sufficient funding for critical projects, such as the 1-270 corridor unless the fuel tax increase recommended by the Transportation Task Force is approved by voters," said NCI Board Member, Venus Martz, president of Greater North County Chamber of Commerce and.

Transit funding in Missouri was cut to \$1.7 million for State Fiscal Year 2018. Currently, Missouri ranks 46th in the country with respect to transit funding. The proposed fuel tax hike would have to be passed by the legislature and Missouri voters.

Other organizations that are supporting additional funding for transportation infrastructure include the Kansas City area Municipal League, Kansas City Mayor Sly James, Missouri Chamber of Commerce, the Missouri Mayors United for Progress, Missouri Municipal League, Municipal League of Metro St. Louis, the St. Louis Engineers Club, along with various other leaders from design and construction engineering firms and labor organization's leadership throughout the State.

North County Incorporated (NCI), founded in 1977, is an economic and community development advocacy organization serving the North St. Louis County community with a focus on education, healthcare, infrastructure and transportation. NCI builds collaborative partnerships and coordinates resources and efforts of civic and business leaders to speak as a unified voice on regional issues.
