Wednesday, May 30th was the first (WNO) with the theme "Proud to Be an American". We also had a very special plaque dedication in honor of First Lieutenant Michael J. Blassie who was shot down on his 138th combat mission and whose remains occupied the Tomb of the Vietnam Unknown at Arlington National Cemetery. DNA science identified him and he was returned to his Florissant home for a funeral at St. Dismas. I would like to thank the members of the VFW Post 4105 for hosting the event.

Before the start of the second (WNO) on June 27th we had a plaque dedication ceremony in honor of the late Dr. Paul Detrick, Sr. this was the 33rd Walk Through History plaque. Before the start of the July 25th (WNO) the city will be dedicating a Walk Through History plaque in honor of the late Catherine "Kay" Spring. In August we will be dedicating another Walk Through History plaque in honor of the late Lowell Girardier.

The second Florissant Food Truck Knight was held on Friday, June 15th sponsored by the Knights of Columbus and the City with future food truck nights scheduled for August 17th and October 12th. There were barrels to collect non-perishable canned and dry food for the nearby TEAM food pantry and proceeds from the event will benefit Knight's sponsored charities including TEAM. The Fiesta in Florissant, which is sponsored by the Hispanic Festival, Inc. of Greater St. Louis, was a two day event held on June 23rd and June 24th and featured entertainment with live Latin bands and Folk dancers from various Latin American countries. The funds raised are used to fund scholar-

ships distributed to college bound students and underprivileged children.

The July 4th celebration is on a Wednesday this year and starts at 7:30 p.m. with a concert performed by the Northwinds Concert Band in front of the James J. Eagan Center followed by our exciting annual Fireworks display. Chief Lowery and I remind you that Fireworks are dangerous to all especially children in the hands of amateurs and are illegal in Florissant.

Florissant is blessed with an outstanding Police Force. If you see something suspicious, call the Police Department immediately. Your assistance to our low crime rate has been an essential help appreciated by all the men and women of the Police Department. We need your eyes and ears to help to keep your neighborhood safe. I commend all the members of the Neighborhood Watch Program (over 1000 members) which continues to grow with new members. Our Crime Prevention Officer (CPO) Steve Michael joins me to thank you for your assistance. If you are interested in becoming a part of the Neighborhood Watch Program or would like more information on how to start one please call his office at 314-830-6042. I would also like to encourage residents to sign up for the NIXLE program that has been in effect since March 2013. This program allows the City to send important valuable community information directly to residents using the latest technology. Subscribers can instantly receive information via cell phone text message and/or email allowing the City to communicate with the residents during emergency situations. The Law Enforcement Torch Run which benefits the Missouri Special Olympics came through the City of Florissant again this year on Thursday, May 31st. Selected runners from the police department received the torch from officers from the St. Louis County Police Department. The runners from Florissant headed south on 67 until reaching the city limits of Hazelwood where the torch was handed off to runners with the Hazelwood Police Department.

The Florissant Fish Swim Team's season is underway as they seek to win the North County Swim League Championship for the 9th straight year. I would like to wish all of the coaches and swimmers the best of luck and hope they and their many fans have another great and enjoyable season. Go Fish!

Street Work - The Public Works Department is preparing to do \$5,527,000 in street work which includes \$990,000 in slurry seal resurfacing work on 112 different streets, \$450,000 in concrete pavement replacement and repairs on 23 streets, and \$1,700,000 in major street repairs with an asphalt overlay on 19 different streets. Work also includes replacement of the St. Anthony Lane Bridge over Fountain creek estimated at \$550,000 and major street and storm water work on North Lafayette Street (N.Hwy.67 to Washington) estimated at \$2,327,000. Major street repairs will begin in early summer.

The street work on N. Lafayette Street and the replacement of St. Anthony Lane Bridge over Fountain creek are made possible from grants received from East-West Gateway Coordinating Council and the Missouri Department of Transportation. Recently MoDOT completed inspections of all bridge structures in the City and found no major problems on any of our structures.

The City has been officially notified that the Insurance Services Office (ISO) an independent insurer-supported organization has upgraded our Building Code Effectiveness grade from a Class 4 to a Class 3 (Class 1 being the highest). Effective code enforcement helps keep insurance rates down and has a major influence on the economic well-being of a City.

The new Municipal Court Building and Police Substation (formerly the Dick Weber Bowling Lanes on Washington Street) is nearing completion and will accommodate a large, modern municipal court-room, court office facility and a police sub-station. Renovations are nearing completion and a dedication ceremony is scheduled for Monday evening July 30th.

The Public Works Department has implemented a new program to monitor and maintain vacant properties and residential rental properties in the City. If vacant residential property owners refuse to maintain the exterior of their properties, then the City will contract to have the work done and will bill the owner. Vacant properties left vacant for over six months must have them registered with the City so the Police and Public Works departments can keep an eye on them. Owners of residential rental properties must attend a Crime Free Seminar before they can renew their residential rental licenses for the year. These mandatory Crime Free Seminars have been well received and are very informative to landlords and explains in much more detail how the City partners with landlords to monitor and maintain their properties and help keep good tenants thereby increasing

The Florissant Police Department recognized that social media was a developing way to inform the public about issues concerning the police department, so in June of 2012, the Florissant Police Department began a FACEBOOK page. The Police Department has found that residents, business owners, organizations, and the media monitor our Facebook page for updates on information. Currently, the police department has 8,758 "Likes," which means that they are being updated firsthand on information that is posted by the police department on FACEBOOK.

In September of 2014 the Florissant Police Department increased its outreach on Social Media by creating a Twitter account. The Police Department utilizes this medium to keep our followers up-to-date on current events in the Police Department and also to keep followers informed of any emergencies or developing incidents. Currently the Police Department has 860 followers. Follow the Florissant Police Twitter Department on at @FlorissantPD.

The Florissant Police Department utilizes NIXLE service which allows us to send important, valuable community information directly to residents using the latest technology. The NIXLE Community Information



Service allows us to create and publish messages to be delivered to subscribed residents instantly via cell phone text message and/or email. Notifications can also be accessed online at NIXLE's web site at www.nixle.com. Messages may include Missing Persons/Amber Alerts, road closures and other relevant safety and community event information. The messages can be sent specifically to residents registered within a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mile radius, giving them the opportunity to receive trustworthy information relevant only to their neighborhood. Residents decide from which local agencies they want to receive information. Subscribers can also choose the way in which alerts are received. whether it is by email, text message, or over the web. Residents of the City of Florissant and those in neighboring communities can immediately begin receiving pertinent information via text message, email, and web by registering at www.nixle.com.

Our other newest Social Media addition's made in March of 2017 was the Florissant Police Instagram and use of Nextdoor. These were created to show pictures and upload information so the residents can keep informed.

# **Safety Town Returns for 2018**



Florissant "SAFETY TOWN" is sponsored by the Florissant Police Department, Florissant Rotary Club, Stygar and Sons Funeral Homes, and the School Districts of Hazelwood and Ferguson/Florissant. "SAFETY TOWN" is a nationally recognized safety program for 4, 5, and 6 year old pre-school children. Topics such as Walking Safety, Bicycle/Tricycle Safety, School Bus Safety, Poison Safety, Playground Safety, Stranger Danger, Tool and Toy Safety will be covered. A visit from Eddie the Florissant Police Dog and the Florissant Valley Fire Protection District is also scheduled.

This comprehensive program allows children ages 4-6 the opportunity to see a Police Officer as their friend and teacher. # Home Safety Tips While You Are On Vacation

With vacation season quickly approaching, the Florissant Police Department wishes to pass along a few tips to keep your home secure while you are on your trip:

1). Don't talk about it! Be cautious about who you tell about your trip. It is okay to tell a neighbor that you trust, but be careful about letting your whole neighborhood know that your house will be empty for an extended period of time. Also, don't post comments of social networking sites that you are leaving for a trip, or post comments while you are on vacation. You never know who is seeing those comments, and you don't want to advertise the fact that no one is at your house.

**2).** Use timers! Hook up timers to lights, televisions, and radios, and adjust the timers to your normal routine. This will help hide the fact that no one is home.

*3). Lock up!* Before leaving, make sure all of your doors, windows, garages, and sheds are secured.

**4). Remember your mail!** It is a good idea to request the post office to hold your mail while you are on vacation. This can be done either thru their website, or you can fill out a form at your local post office. Another option is to ask a trusted neighbor to collect your mail and newspapers while you are away.

5). Remember your answering machine and email! Don't tip anyone off that you will not be home by creating a new outgoing message for your answering machine saying that you are on vacation. Also, be cautious on what you put in automatic reply email messages.

6). Lock away your valuables! Keep valuables and important documents in a fire safe box or a safe deposit box. Also, it is always a good idea to record the serial and model numbers for your valuables so you can accurately report them missing if needed. 7). Park a car in the driveway! Give your home an appearance that someone is living there by asking a



trusted neighbor to park his or her car in your driveway while you are away.

8). Outdoor lighting! Consider motion sensing lights on the outside of your house. Criminals typically do not want to be seen, so if a light comes on as they are walking around your house, it may prevent you from becoming a victim.

**9).** *Make notifications!* If you have an alarm system, make sure that they know how to get ahold of you while you are away. This can also be said about the trusted neighbor who is picking up your newspapers and mail, and who is parking a car in your driveway.

10). Complete a Vacation Check Form! The Florissant Police Department offers a free program to its residents where we check your house daily while you are on vacation. You can complete this form on our website at www.florissantmo.com/police or you can fill out a form at the Florissant Police Department.

The Police Department will be strictly enforcing the fireworks ordinances which can carry up to \$1000 fine if a summons is issued to offenders.

# **Home Improvement Mechanical Program Can Help with Air Conditioning**

# Take Care of "Your" **Florissant Sidewalks**



Help your Florissant neighbors stay safer and healthier. Many of our residents are making walking, running, biking and other physical activities a bigger part of their daily lives. The City's Centers, gyms and parks, are in full use, but the most obvious and easiest avenue, no puns intended, to get in that workout are the use of our streets and sidewalks. You can help by maintaining your sidewalks and the streets in front of your home to keep them safe, walkable and passable.

Please do not park your car on the sidewalk. Parked cars block the way of pedestrians and can cause cracks and uneven surfaces. Walkers, joggers, persons using wheelchairs, pushing strollers, or using canes, might find it difficult or impossible to navigate around or over these hazards on the sidewalk. Other ways you can help: Avoid obstructing your sidewalks with garbage and recycling carts and bins. Please place them in the parking lane or at the end of your driveway for pick up.

Please remove other sidewalk obstructions as soon as you are aware of any possible hazard. Clear sidewalks of vegetation, trim back trees and shrubs that grow over the sidewalk. Keep the sidewalk surface clean all year round by raking up leaves in the fall, sweeping off debris, especially sweetgum balls, removing any moss or other naturally occurring vegetation that tend to become slippery.

Many of our residents continue to use the sidewalks when it snows, so please clear the sidewalk along your property during the winter months. Spring/Summer is here, consider working with other residents on your block to organize a work party to clear your streets and sidewalks of obstructions and hazards such as litter, vegetation and overgrown tree limbs. Talk to your neighbors or contact the City at 314-921-5700 or 314-839-7648 to report safety concerns and obstructions.

Walking, running and biking are popular forms of exercise for Florissant's residents. It requires no special skills and takes a minimal amount of time in return for an abundance of energy and health. Please help the City and your neighbors by maintaining the streets and sidewalks in front on your homes. A little pride will go a long way in keeping Florissant safe, walkable and passable.



# Things you can do to help your AC cope with a long hot summer

parts of the inside and outside units and increase efficiency and also reduce noise.

More Tips to Save On Energy Costs...

These general energy-saving tips will help support your HVAC system and save energy around the house.

• Install a programmable thermostat. You can set these units to raise or lower the temperature while you are at work and asleep. "Smart" WIFI capable thermostats can also be controlled from smartphones or tablets via the web, even while you are away.

• Seal your HVAC ducts and make sure doors, windows, and other possible "air leaks" are properly sealed. Less cool air escaping means less energy use and more comfort.

• Set the thermostat only as low as necessary. Setting it to a lower temperature doesn't speed up the cooling, it merely keeps the unit working longer. Each degree the theromstat is raised will significantly lower the annual cooling bill. Most people feel comfortable at about 78°, that setting can reduce costs and with the addition of fans to move the air, it can feel very comfortable.

# 10 Approved to Public Works & Health Dept.



Now that those long days of warm weather are here, remember that summer in the city can be hazardous for your pet if you are not careful.

A routine romp in the sun, for example, can throw your dog into shock if proper caution is not exercised. Likewise, a window left carelessly open in your home can mean tragedy if your cat falls out of it. Please remember the following twelve tips from the City of Florissant Health Department to keep your pets safe during another long, hot summer.

1. Never leave your pet in a car. An automobile can quickly turn into an oven for a dog or a cat, even with the windows open and the car parked in the shade. Open windows do not provide enough ventilation and the shade shifts along with the sun as the day progresses.

2. Always provide plenty of cool, clean water for your pet. When traveling, carry a gallon thermos filled with cool water.

3. Never let your dog or cat out to run loose. Pets can get stolen, injured and even killed while running loose. In particular, be careful with your cat. Make sure there are no open windows in your home for your cat to jump through.

4. Always keep a current Florissant City Pet Tag and current rabies vaccination tag on your pet incase your pet would get lost. Those tags do not do any good at home in your drawer.

5. Never give your pet forced exercise after feeding, especially in very hot, humid weather.

6. Always exercise your pet in the cool of the day. Early morning and early evening are optimal times to exercise your pet.

7. Never tether or cage your pet outside in the summer heat for long periods of time without shelter, food and water. Bring your pet inside during the heat of day. 8. Always keep your pet well groomed. Do not shave off your pet's coat because it gives them protection against heat and insects. Your pet's coat also holds cool water after a refreshing swim or wetting with a hose. You may comb your pet to remove excess undercoat. Keep the coat free of mats by brushing regularly. A clean coat also helps to prevent summer skin problems.

9. Never go on vacation and leave your pet shut in an empty house or tied up outside. Be sure to plan for someone to provide for your pet when you plan your summer trip.

10. Always watch for fleas and ticks that may infest your pet. Bring your pet to your veterinarian for a thorough summer check up, including a test for heart worm. Ask your vet if they can recommend a good flea and tick repellent for your pet.

11. Never walk your pet in areas that you suspect have been sprayed by insecticides or other chemicals. Dog poisoning, in particular, always increases considerably during the summer when gardens, lawns and trees are usually sprayed for control of weeds, insects and pests. Many of these chemicals can sicken or even kill your pet. Keep your pet away from these areas, observe it closely and call your veterinarian if your pet begins to act suspiciously.

12. Lastly, if in spite of your care, the hot days of summer cause your pet to twitch, pant rapidly, bark, or have a wild "staring" expression, call your veterinarian immediately. Quick cooling may save your pets life. Immerse your pet in water, spray it down with a hose or pack ice packs around its head, stomach and groin.

# In Case of Emergency Don't Forget the Pets!



It's a typical summer day when you start to notice changes in the sky. Clouds begin to gather. Soon the sky darkens and begins to look threatening. Ask yourself, am I prepared for what lies ahead?

Emergencies come in many forms. The best thing you can do for you and your pets is to be prepared for one. Have a disaster plan for your family but don't forget to include your pets. To help you plan ahead we have listed a few things for you to keep in mind.

1. During storms, bring your pets inside and make sure they have plenty of food and water. If you are not home when the weather turns bad, plan ahead and ask a neighbor to help, just remember to keep those phone numbers handy. 2. Arrange a safe place to take your pets in the event you have to evacuate, Do NOT leave pets behind. Keep in mind that during a disaster many emergency shelters will not accept animals because of health and safety regulations, because of this it is very important you determine where you will take your pets ahead of time.

**3.** *Keep important pet papers at hand.* Put together a kit containing all vaccinations records, veterinary contacts, micro-chip/tag information, emergency contact information for someone outside the area and also include a picture of your pet(s), preferably with you in the picture. Keep all information in a water-tight container or bag. *Make sure every member of your family knows where this information is kept!* 

**4.** Bring along enough food/water for 7 days. Extra collars, leashes, pet first aid supplies and portable bowls may be needed as well.

5. Make sure your pet(s) has identification on at all times!

Planning ahead will improve the animal outcome of an emergency as well as enhance human response to evacuations and other disaster relief efforts.

# **Street Work**

City crews have begun this season's maintenance of replacing deteriorating concrete slabs and patching other areas that need repair with hot asphalt mix. Eighteen city streets will have new asphalt and curb-
