

22nd Annual Florissant Old Town Fall Festival - Sunday October 13th

Florissant Old Town Partners and the City of Florissant, along with the entertainment sponsors, the Florissant Fine Arts and Employees Community Fund of Boeing host the Florissant Old Town Fall Festival on rue St. Francois each year on the 2nd Sunday in October. In past years over 30,000 visitors attended the weekend events and we expect this to be the biggest and best ever!

The Old Town Fall Festival kicks off at 11 am on Sunday October 13th and runs until 5pm on rue St. Francois Street in the heart of Old Town Florissant. Eleven full blocks from Florissant Road down to the St. Ferdinand Shrine are closed off for this event. All side streets will be blocked off to accommodate the festival. The street will be filled with activities for everyone with over 150 booths including a full craft fair area, games to play, sale items, food and beverages. We will have the old favorites like the Chili Cook-off, the wine garden, pumpkin decorating, and entertainment on almost every block.

Fido Follies Dog Contest!

Everyone's favorite event the Fido Follies dog show returns and will be re-locating to the old Bank of America drive-through parking lot in the 900 block of rue St. Francois toward the top of the street. We have categories such as smallest dog, best kisser, best costume, best trick and largest dog to name a few.

Duchesne coming here to Florissant and her 250th birthday!





We recently wrapped up our summer weekend Music Under the Stars concerts at St. Ferdinand Lake. The 22nd annual Florissant Old Town Fall Festival will be held on Sunday October 13th as the biggest **block party in the state** blocking off St. Francois Street from Florissant Road to St. Ferdinand Shrine. The festival is sponsored by Florissant Old Town Partners, the City of Florissant and the Missouri and Regional Arts Council. This important cultural community family friendly togetherness event runs from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and will feature the Bob Kuban Brass with a wide variety of other musical and performing arts entertainment. There will be a mile of arts and crafts and delicious food and beverages highlighted by the Florissant Police Antique and Classic Car Show and the famous Chili tasting contest in front of Click's Heating and Cooling.

The VFW Post 4105 and the City hosted a 9-11 **Remembrance Ceremony** on Wednesday, September 11th on the parking lot at 410 rue St. Francois. This solemn event is to reflect on the 18th anniversary of the September 11, 2001 attack on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon by terrorist. Members of the VFW 12th District posted the colors. Members of the American Legion Post 444 performed taps with a gun salute. I was invited to provide the opening remarks and Fire Chief Jason Hoevelmann with the Florissant Valley Fire Protection District was the featured speaker and reflected on the 100th Anniversary of the Florissant Valley Fire Protection District.

Florissant is very proud once again to co- host with the St. Louis County Veterans Coalition this year's Veteran Day Parade which will be held on Sunday, November 10th. Parade participants will assemble and start the parade at Bangert Park and precede North on Florissant Road and then turn left on St. Francois and end the parade at VFW Post 4105 where the ceremony will take place to honor the 2019 Veteran of the Year. I would to thank all the seniors who

attended the Senior Town Hall **meeting** on September 12th to be informed about the progress in the beautiful city and to get an opportunity to speak with the City Administration. We would like to thank the Desmet Retirement Community for providing the breakfast and to all the organizations that participated in the Senior Town Hall meeting and for making the event a successful one. The 6th annual Race to the Shrine 5K run will be held on Saturday, **Ferdinand Shrine grounds.** The 1 mile Fun Run starts at 3:30 p.m. – 5k Race starts at 4:00 p.m. Whether you are a runner, walker or just enjoy being a spectator, families can gather to enjoy the beauty of the City of Florissant. Experience the Shrine of St. Ferdinand, the oldest standing church in the Louisiana Purchase territory. Enjoy some delicious BBQ by the Knights of Columbus, live music by local musicians, and have a wonderful day outside.

The Public Works Department is doing \$4,302,000 in street work which included \$300,000 in slurry seal resurfacing work on 34 different streets, \$550,000 in concrete pavement replacement and repairs on 6 streets, and \$1,1500,000 in major street work on 8 different streets. Work also includes major street and storm water work on North Lafayette Street (N.Hwy.67 to Washington) estimated at \$2,327,000.

The street work on N. Lafayette Street is made possible from grants received from East-West Gateway Coordinating

Council and the Missouri Department

The City has been officially notified that the Insurance Services Office (ISO) an independent insurer-supported organization has upgraded our Building Code Effectiveness grade from a Class 4 to a Class 3 (Class 1 being the highest). The Public Works Department will be implementing a new program this winter. It will be spraying brine (salt water) on the streets be for storms. This treatment is in lieu of the rock salt that is currently spread. The brine application can be done up to 72 hours in advance of a snow event. Being a liquid, it does not get pushed to the sides of the street like rock salt does. The brine will also be used to pre-treat the rock salt used during storms, adding to the effectiveness.





Safeguard Your Children Get them ID'd with MoCHIP! IT'S FREE!

The Florissant Police Department along with the Missouri Freemasons will be hosting a one day Missouri Child Identification Program (MoCHIP) during the Florissant Fall Festival on Sunday, October 13th, 2019, 10:00 AM - 3:00 PM. The event will be held at the Florissant City Hall inside the Council Chambers.

October 2019

This program, FREE OF CHARGE, provides parents with critical information on their children in the event their child turned up missing or abducted. This nationally recognized program provides parents with a digital photograph, digital fingerprints, DNA swab, child information and emergency contacts, a dental bite impression, and two (2) laminated ID cards. Most importantly, all information is turned over to a parent or legal guardian on completion of the process. No child information is stored or kept by the MoCHIP program or the Florissant Police.

If you've been through the MoCHIP program and have had your child ID'd, bring the mini CD back and we'll update it for you. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) strongly urges parents to have the most up-to-date information, including pictures – so if you've had your 0-4 year old ID'd in the last 6 months, it's time to do it again. It is recommended to have children ages 5-10 ID'd once a



year, and when children 10 and over enter puberty you should consider having them ID'd every 6-12 months, as their features and bodies are changing drastically. Often overlooked are older teens and young adults who are actuallv most at risk – please urge your 14 - 21 year olds to get ID'd. It typically takes only 10-15 minutes. As a result of the efforts by the

Missouri Freemason through the MoCHIP program, parents/legal guardians of over 125,000 have received this critical identification information free of charge. Make sure you mark your calendars for this event and keep your eves open as the date approaches for more information. For more information visit the

Neighborhood Watch Program

This program encourages citizens to take an active role in keeping their neighborhoods safe by reporting suspicious activity, practicing effective personal safety techniques to reduce the risk of becoming a victim of a crime, watching out for each other in their neighborhood and staying in touch with fellow neighbors to encourage keeping your neighborhoods safe and free from crime. Chief Lowery says, "Our residents are our eyes and ears in the neighborhoods, I encourage every resident in the city to participate in this very important program.

Those who volunteer to become a block captain will be trained on how to conduct a neighborhood watch meeting, pass along important safety information, discuss issues in the neighborhoods and keep their group members up to date on crime trends in their neighborhoods. Once a block captain you'll receive daily updates, via emails from the police department, on notable criminal activity.

You can also register for the Florissant Neighborhood Watch Program by picking up a form at the Florissant Police Station or by visiting our Department website and filling out the registration form online.

Estate Plans Can Help You Answer Questions About the Future

The word "estate" conjures images of great wealth, which may be one of the reasons so many people don't develop estate plans - after all, they're not rich, so why make the effort? In reality, though, if you have a family, you can probably benefit from estate planning, whatever your asset level. And you may well find that a comprehensive estate plan can help you answer some questions you may find unsettling – or even worrisome. Here are a few of these ques-

What will happen to my children? With luck, you (and your co-parent, if you have one) will be alive and well at least until your children reach the age of majority (either 18 or 21, depending on where you live). Nonetheless, you don't want to take any chances, so, as part of your estate plans, you may want to name a guardian to take care of your children if you are not around. You also might want to name a conservator – sometimes called a "guardian of the estate" - to manage any assets your minor children might inherit.

Will there be a fight over my assets? Without a solid estate plan in place, your assets could be subject to the time-consuming, expensive - and very public - probate process. During probate, your relatives and creditors can gain access to your records, and possibly even challenge your will. But with proper planning, you can maintain your privacy. As one possible element of an estate plan, a living trust allows your property to avoid probate and pass quickly to the beneficiaries you've named.

Who will oversee my finances and my living situation if I become incapacitated? You can

build various forms of protection into your estate planning, such as a durable power of attorney, which allows you to designate someone to manage your financial affairs if you become physically or mentally incapacitated. You could also create a medical power of attorney, which allows someone to handle health care decisions on your behalf if you become unable to do so yourself.

Will I shortchange my family if I leave significant assets to charities?Unless you have unlimited resources, you'll have to make some choices about charitable gifts and money for your family. But as part of your estate plans, you do have some appealing options. For example, you could establish a charitable lead trust, which provides financial support to your chosen charities for a period of time, with the remaining assets eventually going to your family members. A charitable remainder trust, by contrast, can provide a stream of income for your family members for the term of the trust, before the remaining assets are transferred to one or more charitable organizations.

As you can see, careful estate planning can help you answer many of the questions that may be worrying you. Be aware, though, that certain aspects of estate planning, especially those related to living trusts and charitable trusts, can be complex, so you should consult your estateplanning attorney or qualified tax advisor about your situation. But once you've got your plans in place, you should be able to face the future with greater clarity and confidence.

Fall Tips for Pets



Here come the changing seasons again. Crisp, cool air, luscious foliage and a welcome break from summer's hot sticky weather. As much as we enjoy it, there are lurking dangers for our furry family members as well. Here are some tips to keep your pets happy and healthy during the autumn

• Be cautious of Rodenticides and Cold Weather Poisons

Rat and mouse poisons are used more in the winter to keep the rodents from attempting to move indoors. Rodenticides are highly toxic to pets and can be fatal if ingested. If you use these products, please do so with caution and put them in a location inaccessible to your pets.

In the fall when you are changing your car's engine coolant, the ethylene glycol based coolants are highly toxic so please make sure spills are cleaned up immediately and keep away from pets. Propylene glycol based coolants aren't completely nontoxic but much less than other engine coolants

• School Supplies We all know back to school time and time to stock up on school supplies. Most school supplies (glue sticks, pencils, magic markers) are low toxicity to pets but can cause gastrointestinal upset and blockages can occur if ingested. Please keep school supplies out of reach of all pets

• Mushrooms

Fall and spring are mushroom seasons. While 99% of mushrooms have little or no toxicity the 1% that are highly toxic can cause life-threatening problems in pets. Since it is difficult to distinguish from nontoxic ones, the best way to prevent pets from ingesting these poisonous plants is to keep animals away from areas where mushrooms grow. Contact your vet or ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center at (888) 426-4435 immediately if you witness your pet eating a wild mushroom

Also, please remember ALL dogs and cats need to be registered with the City of Florissant Animal Control. The pet license is free to residents and can be obtained at the Florissant Health Department #1 Saint Ferdinand Park Dr. Florissant, MO 63031 by bringing in a valid proof of rabies shot from a licensed vet. Please call (314) 839-7654 with any questions.






