The city continued to address the challenges like many other cities faced in 2021 and was able to find solutions to those challenges. As your Mayor, I am committed to make sure the city heads in the right direction. I would like to share some news and what we can look forward to in the next couple of months:

Please join the Administration in an initiative to kick off a **pre-Valley of Flowers Spring Cleaning Campaign to recapture the spirit of the original Valley of Flowers.** The original idea was to clean up, spruce up, fix up the city culminating in what has become the Valley of Flowers Festival which will run sometime in the middle of March to the start of the Valley of Flowers Festival.

The Electronic Recycling Event, sponsored by Midwest Recycling Center, is scheduled for Saturday, April 2nd from 9am-1pm (or until trucks reach their capacity). The Document Shredding Event, sponsored by Shred-It and Gateway Disposal STL, is scheduled for Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> from 9am-1pm (or until trucks reach their capacity). Both of these popular events will be held at St. Ferdinand Park and more information will follow as the events get closer.

The City along with Florissant Old Town Partners will host a plaque dedication before the start of the first Wednesday Night Out Event on Wednesday, May 25<sup>th</sup> in honor of Richard "Dick" Kellett. Further details will be sent out as we get closer to the event.

We are very pleased with the continuous improvements at the Florissant Golf Club made by Course Superintendent Andy Sprunt and Golf Course Manager Sam Freihoff. The City continues to work on completing the Comprehensive Plan. What is a comprehensive plan?

- 1) An official document adopted by a city as a policy guide to decisions about the physical development of the
- community. The plan acts as a guide to be used when regulatory ordinances are developed and administered. 2) While a comp plan doesn't provide detailed capital improvement or precise locations of facilities, it does provide a
- guide in the detailed planning that must occur before those facilities are built.

Thank you to H3 Studio for all that they have complied as they continue to work with the Administration.

**Missouri American Water Company** is currently working on a main replacement project on Lindbergh that started this past January and should be completed by the Fall of 2022. The purpose of this project is to provide upgrades and improvements to aging water pipes along Lindbergh from Elm Grove to Charbonier. This project will improve the water flow which in return will be cost savings to the customer. The cost of this project is approximately \$4.3 million. The construction times will be from 6pm-6am with one lane open in both directions on Lindbergh during construction. Missouri American Water Company is committed in continuing to invest dollars in Florissant and in North St. Louis County. Please be mindful of the construction work zones and the workers as you travel on Lindbergh.

The Public Works Department is preparing to do \$2,00,000 in street work in 2022 which includes \$500,000 in asphalt preservation work, \$500,000 in concrete pavement replacement and repairs and \$1,000,000 in major street repairs. The City is also in the process of designing street replacement projects for St. Dennis and Mullanphy Road. These projects are in conjunction with the federal government which will reimburse 80 percent of the cost of the project.

**On April 5th Election**, the city will have Proposition C (County Wide Use Tax), Proposition U (Local Use Tax) and a Bond Issue for a new Aquatic Center on the ballot where you will have the opportunity to exercise your civic duty and vote. I encourage all eligible voters to vote.

We continue to have Economic Development success. Companies of all sizes, including National brands and Developers, are proving that they believe in the future of Florissant.

There are many exciting projects that are in the Due Diligence and Planning Phase and we are working with the Developers to bring them to fruition anticipating more public announcements this year.

I look forward to seeing you at the Valley of Flowers Festival and other wonderful outdoor events in our city has planned this year

# FLORISSANT HOME IMPROVEMENT RPOGRAM

Applications for the 2022 Home Improvement Program will be made available on **April 1, 2022** and can be found online at www.florissantmo.com under the Community Development Department tab or in the Community Development Office. Completed applications will be accepted on a first come, first served basis starting **Monday, May 2, 2022 at 9am.** 

The Home Improvement Program offers forgivable loans to income eligible Florissant homeowners. Applicants must be Florissant homeowners and they must have owned and occupied the house for at least two years prior to application. The funds will first be used to address health and safety code requirements for the home. Any remaining funds may be used for other necessary home repairs.

Homeowners accepted into the program must remain in their home five years to have the loan forgiven. A seminar explaining the 2022 Home Improvement Program will be held on **Tuesday, April 5, 2022** at 6pm in the Council Chambers of City Hall.

Beautiful Home Awards

Nominations for the City of Florissant Beautiful Home Award Program will open May 1, 2022. The program was established to recognize homeowners who take pride in the appearance of their home and community.

In order to be eligible for the contest a home must be an owner-occupied single-family dwelling. Residents may nominate either their own home or other homes in the city. The judging criterion includes, but is not limited to, landscaping, attractive exterior, overall curb appeal and maintenance of the property.

One winner will be chosen from each of the city's nine wards. The winners will receive recognition from the City Council and a Beautiful Home yard sign. Previous winners must wait 3 years before consideration for another award.

## The Dangers of Leaving your Vehicle Running and Unattended

The Florissant Police Department is warning residents to be wary of thieves who are targeting unattended vehicles warming up during frigid temperatures.

There have been a number of vehicles stolen in Florissant during the cold mornings this winter.

The Florissant Police Department sees an increase in stolen vehicles that were left unattended at convenience stores or warming up in driveways each year when the temperatures get cold.

"We need residents to stop leaving their car running, unattended." These thefts are 100 percent preventable," said Chief Tim Fagan.

We also would like to remind residents that leaving your vehicle running unattended on the street is a violation the Florissant Municipal Code.

## Please do not leave Guns in Vehicles

The Florissant Police Department is continuing to see a disturbing trend where guns have been being stolen from unlocked vehicles. This negligence by the gun owner could be prevented if they would properly secure their firearms and vehicles. These guns that are stolen fall into the hands of criminals all because they were left in unlocked vehicles.

"Again, we plead with residents to be a responsible gun owner and properly secure your guns". said Chief Tim Fagan.

The majority of the stolen guns have come from unlocked cars. Other victims have told police they did lock their cars, but when police investigate they find no sign of a forced entry, leading them to believe that the vehicle was left unlocked.

The Florissant Police Department urges all residents to lock their vehicles at all times, and to never leave a firearm unsecured in a vehicle.





## **Resident Camera Program**

Do you currently utilize private video surveillance at your home or business? If you do, we'd like to hear from you.

Video surveillance is one of the best methods for apprehending criminals and convicting suspects who are caught in the act of committing a crime. Installing video surveillance is a great example of community-police partnerships and is something the Florissant Police Department values highly.

#### How Does it Work?

The Resident Camera Program allows residents and business owners to register locations and capabilities of their security camera systems with the Florissant Police Department. Using this information, when a crime occurs, the Florissant Police Department will know the locations of nearby video cameras and be able to collect video evidence and follow up on leads.

#### What are the Benefits of Registering your Camera?

Because they are caught in the act of committing the crime, video surveillance is one of the best methods to catch suspects and convict them. As crimes occur nearby, many residents and business owners are unaware that their camera systems may have captured information that could help solve a crime. Likewise, police are not always aware of who may have potentially vital video evidence.

By registering your camera with the Florissant Police Department, officers can quickly identify nearby cameras that may have captured criminal activity. After registering your camera, you will only be contacted by the Florissant Police Department if there is a criminal incident in the vicinity of your security camera and police personnel believe viewing your video footage will assist in the investigation.

#### Registration

If you would like to register your security camera system with the Florissant Police Department and allow officers to contact you should a crime occur in or near where your cameras are installed, please fill out the online form below.

#### **Terms and Conditions**

The information you provide regarding your camera systems will be for official use only. Your personal information will remain confidential and not be distributed except as required by law or court order. This program is entirely voluntary and you can withdraw consent to view video footage from your camera system at any time by calling the Florissant Bureau of Investigation. If necessary, the Florissant Police Department will contact you directly, using the information provided by you at the time of registration, to request the appropriate video surveillance footage. Any footage containing or related to criminal activity collected by the Florissant Police Department may be used as evidence during any stage of a criminal proceeding. Under no circumstances shall the registrants construe that they are acting as an agent and/or employee of the City of Florissant and/or the Florissant Police Department through the program.

Family memberships include individuals living in the same household and listed on the permit if applicable. Additional eligible members may be added for \$20 per person for residents and \$30 per person for nonresidents. Individuals interested in purchasing a membership must provide proof of residency at time of purchase and occupancy permit will be checked. Passes are valid for one year (or 6 months) from date of purchase.

#### **Register Early for Programs**

All programs must meet minimum enrollment in order to be offered. If there are not enough registrants, a course will be canceled. Minimum enrollment must be met at least one week in advance of the start date of the class. Florissant Parks and Recreation reserves the right to cancel, postpone, combine classes or change instructors as needed. If a class is canceled due to lack of enrollment, registered participants will be notified of an alternate class or program if one is available, or offered a full refund or account credit for registration fee paid.

#### **Registration Policy**

Registration begins shortly after 8am on the date indicated and will continue on a space available basis. Current residents' cards must be presented at the time of registration in order to receive resident rates. Children under four years of age must have a parent's resident card. Phone registration begins at 9 am on the date indicated as the first day of registration.

#### **Refund Policy**

Registrants' cancelling before a class begins will receive a full refund minus \$5 processing charge. Participants canceling after a class begins will receive no more than a 50% refund. No refund will be given after the session is ½ complete or for classes that require less than a \$5 registration fee. No refund will be given on pool or facility memberships, Summer day camp (1 week before the start of camp), or pavilions rentals. All refunds request must be made at least 24 hours before the start of any program or class. All refund request may take up to 14 business days to process.

#### **Gymnasium Hours**

Gymnasium hours vary. Please call 314.266.7335 and select extension 1 for JJE Center and extension 2 for JFK Center. You may also download the free app, Rainout Line, to see gymnasium hours. Hours are updated daily.

#### Gymnasium Capacity Policy

Once the gymnasium has hit capacity, we will use a one in, one out rule to keep the gymnasium at capacity. Those wishing to enter will need to sign a wait list and will be given access in the order they arrive as others leave. Fridays are reserved for residents. No nonresident passes will be issued on Fridays. Gymnasium capacities will still be enforced. Nonresidents may still use our other amenities on Friday.

#### Full Court Basketball

In order to maximize the space in our gymnasium and serve as many guests as possible, full court play will only be allowed during the final hour of the building in question on M/W/SU. Outside of these times, only half court games will be allowed.

#### **Racquetball Court**

Come enjoy our racquetball court at the JFK Center. Reservations can be made one week in advance by residents or day of for nonresidents. Individuals ages 13 and older may use the court, individuals 12 and under may use the court with adult supervision (adult 18+). Call 314.921.4250 for court availability or for reservations.

Use of the Racquetball Court is included in a Facility Membership or the Daily Facility Fees.

The Florissant Parks and Recreation Department does not provide insurance coverage for injuries suffered while participating in our programs or while using parks or facilities. Any cost related to such injuries should be presented to your personal hospitalization carrier.

Photographs taken during programs and activities sponsored by the Florissant Parks and Recreation Department are the property of the City of Florissant and may be reproduced without consent of the participants. If you do not want yourself or your child photographed/filmed, please notify the Parks and Recreation Administration Office in writing prior to the program starting.

#### Accommodation Policy

The Florissant Parks and Recreation Department welcomes people of all abilities to use any of our programs, facilities, or services. We will make every effort to incorporate your individual needs. If special accommodations are needed to participate in a program, please call our office at 314.839.7670 at least 48 hours in advance of the start of the program.

#### **Payment and Returned Checks**

Full payment is required at the time of registration, unless otherwise noted. A \$20 charge will be applied for all returned checks.

Please note if using a credit or debit card a 2.5% service charge will be charged with a minimum of \$1.50

#### **Resident and Nonresident Definitions**

A Florissant resident is one living within the defined city limits of the City of Florissant and listed on the occupancy permit. City limits and Post Office boundaries are not the same, so it is possible to have a Florissant mailing address yet live outside the city. Check with the Recreation Staff to see if your address qualifies for resident status. See information below on obtaining a resident card. Family passes consist of four individuals living in the same household and listed on the occupancy permit if applicable. Additional members may be added if they are eligible for \$20 per person for residents and \$30 per person for nonresidents. Anyone wishing to use the facility must have a resident or nonresident identification card which will be kept at the reception desk during their use.

#### **Resident Card Information**

A current Florissant resident card allows Florissant residents to do the following:

- Obtain a pavilion rental permit for one of our many parks.
- Register early for programs and classes (before nonresidents).
- Pay resident rates for admission to facilities, programs, and classes.

#### To Obtain or Renew a Florissant Resident Card

Everyone in the household, including all children receiving a card, must be listed on the occupancy permit. This will be looked up in our system by recreation staff. Paper copies of the occupancy permit will be accepted for 60 days from the date of original issue only. In addition, residents who rent their home must bring a photo ID and proof of residency. Residents who own their home and are listed on the occupancy as the owner and occupant only need to bring a photo ID. See below for proof of residency requirements:

#### 15 yrs and Under

- Must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian as proof of residency.
- 16-20 yrs
  - May either be accompanied by a resident parent/legal guardian OR present a proof of residency item listed to the left in their own name

#### 21+ yrs

- Utility bill showing service address that matches resident address. Electronic copies will be accepted. Must be dated within 30 days of current date.
- Paycheck stub (mailed or electronic stub), mailed bank statement. Must be dated within 30 days of current date.

Resident/nonresident cards are valid for two years from the date of purchase. If your card is lost during this time and you need a replacement, a \$5 fee for all ages will apply for each replacement card. Nonresidents wishing to purchase a daily facility pass must have a nonresident identification card which will be held at the reception or fitness desk and returned upon their departure from the facility. Nonresident card fees are the same a resident card fees. A photo ID or parent/ guardian must be present (for minors under 18) in order to make a nonresident card.

All resident/nonresident cards are the property of the City of Florissant and must be shown or surrendered to city employees upon request. For safety and security of our staff and guests, cards will be kept at the desk during usage of the facility and returned upon their exit.

#### **Florissant Business Owners**

The owner of any business located within the city limits, along with immediate family members living in their household, shall be deemed a resident and therefore eligible to receive a resident card. This applies to the individual listed on the business license only. To obtain a resident card as a business owner in the city, you must visit the JJE Center or JFK Community Center with a photo ID. You will only be issued a card upon verification of your business ownership and current business license through the Finance Department. This verification can only be done Mon-Fri 8am-4:30pm. It may take up to two business days to verify.

Resident/nonresident cards can be made up to 30 minutes prior to facility closure at either JJE or JFK Community Centers.

#### Living Memorial Tree Program

Honor your loved one with a living memorial through our Memorial Tree Program. To participate in the Living Memorial Program, the donor selects a tree from a predetermined list of trees and pays the City the cost of that tree. At the donor's request, the tree will be planted in one of the city's beautiful parks. As acknowledgment of the donation, an engraved brass plate will be installed in the Living Memorial Display located at the lower level of the James J. Eagan Center. The donor will receive a certificate suitable for framing. Contact Sarah Skaggs at sskaggs@florissantmo.com or 314.921.4250 for more information or to request your memorial tree. Cost is \$275 per tree.

#### Fitness Center Rules & Policies

#### Requirements

- Liability release form 18 & older:

- Parental liability release form and must be accompanied by the parent or legal guardian 12-15: during the fitness center visit

#### **Dress Code**

Exercise attire is required. Appropriate exercise attire includes comfortable, loose-fitting clothing, as defined below.

- · Pants: Short or long exercise/warm-up pants are acceptable. Pants with belts, cut-off pants and/or jeans with metal rivets are dangerous and not allowed. Street clothing and/or business attire (suit & tie or skirt) compromises the safety of the wearer and reduces the acknowledged atmosphere and is not allowed
- · Shirts: For hygiene purposes and to preserve a family environment, a shirt, which covers the torso, is required at all times. Cut-offs, sports bras, string tank tops, halter-tops or altered shirts of any kind that allow the full torso to show are not permitted. Altered shirts include any shirts that have cut-off sleeves, neckline or bottom. Shirts that are not altered but show the torso due to oversize armholes are also not acceptable.
- · Shoes: For safety purposes, closed-toed athletic footwear is required in all areas except the pool, shower/locker rooms or during Yoga. In an effort to minimize damage to the wood & rubber floors and carpet, the following footwear is prohibited:
  - dark-soled shoes which may damage or mark the wood floor/carpet;
  - · any shoe suspected of damaging or marking the wood floor/carpet;
  - · open-toed athletic footwear, sandals or flip-flops;
  - · muddy, dusty or dirty shoes:
