This is a dog friendly event, water bowls will be provided on every block. (Properly licensed and leashed of course) and enter them in the dog show. We have categories such as smallest dog, best kisser, best costume, best trick and largest dog to name a few.

Once again, if you are looking for the **Children's Hands-On Art Projects** sponsored by the Hazelwood Head Start Program it will be up at the top of St. Francois on the City Hall lawn. Children will have the opportunity to create their own masterpiece with the help of volunteer teachers.

kits free of charge. They will be set up in the Council Chambers near the Children's Hands-On art at City Hall.

Save the Shrine!

The last issue of the Florissant Focus informed readers of the pressing need for repairs of St. Ferdinand Shrine. The establishment of the historic St. Ferdinand Parish, now St. Ferdinand Shrine, paved the way for the growth of our community, region, state and country. The convent, built in 1819, predates Missouri being accepted as a state. The Church, built in 1821, was completed just after statehood. Two more buildings, the Rectory built in 1840 and the Schoolhouse, complete the group of buildings standing today.

The Friends of Old St. Ferdinand is a non-profit organization with the goal of preserving and managing the historically significant landmark. The group raises operational funds through a variety of efforts which include; tours of the Shrine, weekly Book Sales, rentals of the schoolhouse hall for celebrations along with offering the facilities for weddings and funerals. The Friends of Old St. Ferdinand also participate in celebrations like the Valley of Flowers Festival, Florissant Fall Festival, Old Town Christmas Celebration, Feast Day Celebration, and more.

Much of the funds raised from those efforts are used for normal day-to-day expenses and minor repairs. But a 200 year old complex needs a great deal of tender care that goes well beyond that regular upkeep.

In preparation for the upcoming 200th year anniversary celebration, a "Save the Shrine" campaign has begun that is aimed at raising the necessary funds to restore and preserve these historic buildings.



A huge "Thank You" and great appreciation goes out to supporters and friends for past donations and there is hope for their continued support. All donations of any amount are greatly needed and very important.





Weather has been a major factor in the successful completion of our street and sidewalk projects all year ... we appreciate your patience will we make every effort to complete these projects.

- The 2016 Slurry Seal Resurfacing Program has been going on since the late spring. The project was awarded to Missouri Petroleum for \$850,000 in slurry seal resurfacing work on 124+ different streets.
- The 2016 Sidewalk Repair & Replacement Program began work in September The program will remove trip hazards and improve ADA accessibility on the City's sidewalks. The bid has been awarded to Spencer Contracting for \$200,974 and is scheduled to be completed within 120 days.
- The 2016 Major Street Repairs project has begun in August to repair and perform an asphalt overlay on a few of the worse streets in the City. The bid has been awarded to Spencer Contracting for \$357,728 and is scheduled to be completed within 60 days.
- The 2016 PCC (Portland Cement Concrete) Street Repairs project was bid out in July. Repairs will be performed on 20+ streets. Amcon Contracting was awarded the project for \$315,921 ... and is scheduled to be completed within 60 days.
- Work has begun on the renovation of the old Dick Weber Bowling Lanes into our new **Municipal Court Facility**.
- Asbestos Removal has been bid and awarded to Spray Services for \$23,861. Work is to begin the end of August and be completed in September.
- Interior Demolition Work is out for bids and due August 23rd ...
- New sign for the Municipal CourtsFacility is under design and will be out for bids in September ...New exterior building and parking
- lot lighting is under design and will be out for bids in September...

 The City has applied for a grant
- from MoDOT to do major street renovations and asphalt overlay to Keeven Lane from Rosetta to Paul ...
 • Design work and field investigations continue on the North Lafayette Street and Stormwater
- Reconstruction project ...
 Design work and right-of-way acquisition continues on the St. Anthony Lane Bridge Replacement

project over Fountain Creek ...

- The City continues to monitor and work with MSD on many projects in and around the City of Florissant totaling over \$35 Million ...
- The City continues to monitor and work with St. Louis County on the major Shackelford Road Capital Improvement project ...
- Improvement project ...

 Note that some funds from Proposition S were received and will be used in 2016 but that we will have the full benefit of those funds in 2017 and beyond. Thank you.

Chief Lowery Announces Promotions



This program, FREE OF CHARGE, provides parents with critical information on their children in the event their child turned up missing or abducted. This nationally recognized program provides parents with a digital photograph, digital fingerprints, DNA swab, child information and emergency contacts, a dental bite impression, and two (2) laminated ID cards. Most importantly, all information is turned over to a parent or legal guardian on completion of the process. No child information is stored or kept by the MoCHIP program or the Florissant Police.

If you've been through the MoCHIP program and have had your child ID'd, bring the mini CD back and we'll update it for you. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) strongly urges parents to have the most up-to-date information, including pictures - so if you've had your 0-4 year old ID'd in the last 6 months, it's time to do it again. It is recommended to have children ages 5-10 ID'd once a year, and when children 10 and over enter puberty you should consider having them ID'd every 6-12 months, as their features and bodies are changing drastically. Often overlooked are older teens and young adults who are actually most at risk – please urge your 14 - 21 year olds to get ID'd. It typically takes only 10-15 minutes.

As a result of the efforts by the Missouri Freemason through the MoCHIP program, parents/legal guardians of over 125,000 have received this critical identification information free of charge.





Although diversification can't guarantee a profit or protect against losses, it can help reduce the impact of volatility on your portfolio.

Not only could you strain your neck, but you'll also be unprepared for the ups, downs, twists and turns that await you. When you invest, you want to keep looking forward as well. By keeping your eyes, and your focus, on your long-term goals, such as a comfortable retirement, you can be better prepared to follow a consistent strategy designed to help get you to your destination.
- Don't bring extra baggage. For obvious reasons, it's not a good idea to bring any loose or extra baggage inside a roller coaster car that may have you going upside down at 90 or so miles per hour. As an investor, you don't want to be saddled with any extra "baggage," either - and one of the biggest sources of this baggage is unrealistic expectations. Fall Tips for Pets



Here come the changing seasons again. Crisp, cool air, luscious foliage and a welcome break from summer's hot sticky weather. As much as we enjoy it, there are lurking dangers for our furry family members as well.

Here are some tips to keep your pets happy and healthy during the autumn months.

• Be cautious of Rodenticides and **Cold Weather Poisons**

Rat and mouse poisons are used more in the winter to keep the rodents from attempting to move indoors. Rodenticides are highly toxic to pets and can be fatal if ingested. If you use these products, please do so with caution and put them in a location inaccessible to your pets.

In the fall when you are changing your car's engine coolant, the ethylene glycol based coolants are highly toxic so please make sure spills are cleaned up immediately and keep away from pets. Propylene glycol based coolants aren't completely nontoxic but much less than other engine coolants

School Supplies

We all know back to school time and time to stock up on school supplies.

Most school supplies (glue sticks, pencils, magic markers) are low toxicity to pets but can cause gastrointestinal upset and blockages can occur if ingested. Please keep school supplies out of reach of all pets

Mushrooms

Fall and spring are mushroom seasons. While 99% of mushrooms have little or no toxicity the 1% that are highly toxic can cause life-threatening problems in pets. Since it is difficult to distinguish from nontoxic ones, the best way to prevent pets from ingesting these poisonous plants is to keep animals away from areas where mushrooms grow. Contact your vet or ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center at (888) 426-4435 immediately if you witness your pet eating a wild mushroom

Also, please remember ALL dogs and cats need to be registered with the City of Florissant Animal Control. The pet license is free to residents and can be obtained at the Florissant Health Department #1 Saint Ferdinand Park Dr. Florissant, MO 63031 by bringing in a valid proof of rabies shot from a licensed vet.



The (putting) surfaces (at Forest Park) were pretty darn good. (Almost as good as those at Florissant Golf Club). So, if you could get things going your way, the surfaces were good enough to make some (putts)." Estes, who plays regularly at the Florissant Golf Club ,stated that "The putting surfaces at the Florissant Golf Club provide an excellent opportunity for all golfers to hone their short game skills"

Florissant Mayor Thomas Schneider, who oversees the only 18-hole municipal golf course in St. Louis County, said that "Mr. Estes has been kind enough to lend his time and ideas to assist the Florissant City Council/Administration's Golf Course planning committee. We are fortunate to have someone, with the ability to continue to win championships, help us with our golf-related, decision-making process."




