Fill up the big blue recycling bin and put it out on the designated pick up day. Show your fellow neighbors by example how easy and proactive it is. Call the city to have your big blue recycling bin delivered for free if you don't already have one.

Reusing items many times cuts down on the load our landfills retain. Simply reusing a paper towel several times helps. Or you can become more creative in repurposing other items. When my IPad 2 became a brick, I discovered that it, coupled with the stand we purchased for it, makes a great book holder freeing my hands for breakfast reading.

Choosing items to buy that have the least packaging helps a great deal. The manufacturers see that trend and become more efficient in their packaging practices. This gift-giving season you can help by using



reusable gift bags to reduce the amount of stuff that then ends up in our systems. Tissue paper is not recyclable. It fouls the machines. Compost it or simply don't use it in the first place. In other countries, gifts are given without the gift wrapping or bagging. Instead, they use the personal touch and hand the gift to the recipient at the gathering.

The greatest gift you can give Mother Nature this Holiday Season is a commitment to recycle what you can, reuse items fully, and reduce packaging of all kinds. Florissant offers Christmas tree pick-up after the holidays to make that easier. 

# Voter I.D. and Registration Information

### **Voter Identification**

The St. Louis County Election Board requires all voters to show some form of identification in order to vote. A government issued photo I.D. is the preferred form of identification because it can be scanned, allowing the lines to move quickly. If you forget your ID, or simply do not have a government issued photo I.D., YOU CAN STILL VOTE! However, you will need to either present some other approved form of identification or fill out a provisional ballot and sign a statement confirming your identity.

In general, there are 3 options for showing ID in order to vote:

Option 1: A Government Issued Photo ID.

Provide a government issued photo ID (e.g. CURRENT Missouri Driver or Non-Driver License, Military ID, US Passport), you can show it to the Poll Worker at your polling place who will process you normally.

Option 2: Secondary form of ID

Provide a secondary form of identification (Voter Registration Card, ID from a MO University or College, Utility Bill, Bank Statement, Government Check, Government document showing your name and address) and sign a statement confirming your identity. Option 3: No ID

If you have neither of the above IDs, but are a registered voter, you will cast a provisional ballot. Your vote will only be counted if the signature on the ballot matches the signature we have on the Voter Registration file.

More information about the Voter ID law can be found at the *Missouri Secretary of State's website*.

Replacement Voter I.D. Cards may be requested by contacting the Election Board, giving your name and address. New I.D. Cards will be mailed to all voters in each even numbered year, to new voters when they register and to anyone who changes his or her address.

### **Voter Registration**

Who Can Register:

To register to vote, you must meet the following qualifications:

• Be a U.S. citizen

• Must be 17 1/2 years of age (18 years old by Election Day)

• Be a resident of St. Louis County

Where to Register:

There are several different options to register to vote in St. Louis County:

1. The St. Louis County Election Board at 725 Northwest Plaza Dr., St. Ann MO, 63074.

- 2. Most city halls
- 3. Most libraries
- 4. Most schools and Special School District facilities
- 5. Most local branches of the Junior College District, Universities and Colleges
- 6. Various businesses, union halls and churches within St. Louis County
- 7. All County Department of Motor Vehicle registration offices
- 8. All State offices providing public assistance while conducting other official business at their establishment.
- State election laws also provide for registration by:
- 1. Mail by going to the Secretary of State's website and requesting an application to be mailed 2. Online by going to the Secretary of State's website and filling in the application.

### When to Notify the Election Board to Update Your Information

Notify the Election Board if there is a legal name change either in person or in writing. Notify the Election Board if there is a change in address either in person or in writing. ALL address changes must be submitted to the Election Board by the 4th Wednesday before an election to make sure you receive your Notice of Election and that you can vote at the correct Polling Place.

### IMPORTANT NOTE:

Any person moving into St. Louis County is considered a new registration and must re-register by the deadline date prior to each election. (Example: If you move from St. Louis City to St. Louis County, you must re-register as your City registration does not automatically carry over into a new Jurisdiction.

Political party preference is only required when requesting ballots for Primary Elections.

The Florissant Police Department will host another C.E.R.T. training course beginning Wednesday, February 20th, 2018. C.E.R.T. is an acronym that stands for Community Emergency Response Team. Participants will meet one day a week for eight weeks. Class times will be from 6:30 P.M. until 9:30 P.M.

The United States is the most severe weather-prone country in the world. Each year, people in this country cope with an average of 10,000 thunderstorms, 5,000 floods, 1,200 tornadoes, and two landfalling hurricanes. Approximately 90% of all presidentially declared disasters are weather-related, causing around 500 deaths each year and nearly \$14 billion in damage.



SKYWARN® is a National Weather Service (NWS) sponsored program developed in the 1960s that consists of trained weather spotters who provide reports of severe and hazardous weather to help meteorologists make life-saving warning decisions.

Even with all of the high-tech tools at their disposal, the National Weather Service still needs spotters to report vital "ground truth" about how storms and other weather phenomena are impacting their area.

Spotters are concerned citizens from various walks of life and public safety officials who volunteer their time and energy to report on hazardous weather impacting their community. The National Weather Service encourages anyone with an interest in public service to join the SKY-WARN® program. Volunteers include police and fire personnel, dispatchers, EMS workers, public utility workers and other concerned private citizens.

Training is free and typically last about 2 hours. You'll learn: basics of thunderstorm development & storm structure, identifying potential severe weather features, information to report & ow to report and basic severe weather safety.

 If you are shopping with children, make a plan in case you are separated from each other.







# Required Withdrawals from Retirement Plans: What Should You Know?

You may spend decades contributing to your IRA and 401(k). But, eventually, you'll need to use this money. Before that day arrives, you'll want to be familiar with the rules governing withdrawals — and you'll want to know just how much you should take out.

To begin with, withdrawals from traditional employer-sponsored retirement plans like these fall under the Internal Revenue Service's "required minimum distributions" (RMD) guidelines. (You aren't required to take these distributions from a Roth IRA.) Here are some of the key RMD points to keep in mind:

• You need to take distributions by age 70-1/2. You generally should begin taking RMDs in the year in which you turn 70-1/2. If you don't take your first RMD during that year, you must take it no later than April 1 of the following year. If you do put it off until April 1, you must take two distributions in one year.

If you don't take your RMDs on time, you may have to pay the IRS a 50 percent penalty tax on the taxable portion of your uncollected distribution — so make sure you know your dates.

- You can take more than the minimum. You can withdraw more than the RMD, but, as the word "required" suggests, you can't withdraw less.
- You may be able to delay RMDs in an employer's retirement plan if you're still working. If your employer's retirement plan permits it, you may not have to take RMDs if you are still working and you are 70-1/2 or older. However, this exception won't apply if you own 5 percent or more of your company.

To determine your RMD, you'll need to use either the Uniform Lifetime Table, which is

based on your life expectancy, or the Joint Life Table, if you have a spouse who is the sole beneficiary and who is more than 10 years younger. Your tax advisor can help you make this selection.

So, now that you know the basic rules of RMDs, you'll need to consider their impact on your retirement income. As mentioned above, you can certainly take out more than the RMD, but should you?

If you need the extra money, then you'll have to take it. However, when determining how much you should take beyond your RMDs, you'll need to weigh some other factors.

For one thing, if you can delay taking Social Security, you'll get bigger checks, so you might be able to lower the amounts you take from your 401(k) and IRA.

Another factor to consider is the size and composition of your investment portfolio held outside your retirement accounts. If you have a sizable amount of investments, with some of them providing regular income, you may be able to afford to take out only your RMDs, or perhaps just slightly more. On the other hand, if your 401(k) and IRA make up the vast majority of your investment holdings, you might need to rely on them much more heavily.

In any case, though, you will need to establish an appropriate withdrawal rate for all your investments to ensure you won't outlive your money. A financial professional can help you calculate this rate.

Do whatever it takes to maximize your benefits from your IRA and 401(k). They're valuable assets – so use them wisely.





# **Cold Weather Tips For Your Pets**

Take your dog outside only for as long as it takes to relieve him or herself. Small, shorthaired breeds such as Chihuahuas and terriers suffer from the cold despite their seemingly warm

He or she may also pick up salt and other chemicals on their feet accidentally. As we all know dogs lick their feet and these chemicals could hurt your pet if swallowed.

Antifreeze, even in very tiny doses, is a lethal poison for dogs and cats. But because of its sweet taste, animals are attracted to it. Be sure


