## CITY OF FLORISSANT <u>CITY COUNCIL</u> <u>WORK SESSION MINUTES</u> August 21, 2018

The City Council of the City of Florissant met in an open Work Session on Tuesday, August 21, 2018 at 6:30 pm. in the Council Chambers at 955 rue St. Francois, with President Caputa presiding. On Roll Call the following Council members were present: Jones, Eagan, Caputa, Schildroth, Henke, Pagano, Parson, Siam (Via Skype), Harris. Also present was Mayor Schneider, City Clerk Karen Goodwin.

Council President Caputa stated that the first item on the agenda is the discussion of Texting.

Mr. Hessel gave a brief background about his experience with the sunshine law with cities and working with the press. He reminded the council that the sunshine law defines a document as any document made or received in connection with official business, it is a public record. The document has to be retained and the custodian of record has to have it.

Mr. Hessel reviewed some tips for handling texts and email as follows:

- Do not use an official email address for personal business
- Strongly recommend do not use personal email or text messages for city business
- Email related to public business sent to 2 or more members is a public record
- If the email is sent to a majority of the government body then it is a public meeting without being posted.

Council discussed the definition of a public record vs. a public meeting.

## Introductions:

Kimberlee Johnson, Finance Director introduced herself and thanked the Council for the opportunity to be at the meeting. She stated that she has looked at the processes and noticed that some things are still being done manually. She stated that she has already implemented some processes to make things more efficient. She has been working closely with the auditor. She is looking at things that could be changed in the future. Looking to be able to present information that is more useful and understandable.

Mrs. Johnson stated that the employees are very responsive and care about the city. They have embraced the changes she has suggested. She described some instances where processes could be changed.

Councilman Jones asked if Mrs. Johnson has used the IT department to help. Mrs. Johnson stated that she has. She has communicated with the other departments and they are working to be proactive.

Councilman Parson asked if additional training is necessary to bring employees up to speed. Mrs. Johnson stated that it is not all training, the software program is not being supported as well as it should. She has done some research on what the city has currently and others that may be available. She stated that she is impressed with the employees in the finance department. Jennifer Morris has done a wonderful job of not only learning her own position but training the other employees in the department. She said that the systems were not set up for someone else to understand the processes. Mrs. Morris has been invaluable with finding and identifying the information she needed.

Councilwoman Pagano asked about the format of the budget. In past years it has been difficult to understand the budget. She asked that in the future if it could be simplified and made easier to read. Mrs. Johnson stated that she is looking at different ways to make it easier to read. She asked what she meant by difficult to read. Councilwoman Pagano stated that it was just a bunch of numbers that was hard to decipher. She suggested that Hazelwood's budget was a good example. Councilman Jones added that there are several in the area with a similar format.

Councilman Caputa thanked Mrs. Johnson and welcomed her.

Todd Hughes, Public Works Director, stated that he already provided a background of his professional experience. He described his relevant training and skills he has acquired over the years. He gave a personal background including his family makeup.

His plans to change the Public Works department includes changing the code enforcement program to proactive and not reactive. He discussed a de-icing program. He is excited about the software program. He wants to implement a checklist system that does not exist. Standard operating procedures.

Councilman Parson asked how he planned to make the code enforcement proactive instead of reactive. Mr. Hughes stated that he is still working on a plan.

Councilman Schildroth asked Mr. Hughes to explain the savings with the brine solution. Mr. Hughes explained the savings.

Councilman Siam asked about the workload in Public Works. Mr. Hughes explained the backlog and within the budget they are doing what they can. Councilman Siam asked about his thoughts on slurry seal. Mr. Hughes stated that they are putting some curbs back in but needs to look at that in the future.

Councilman Harris asked about zoning, could it be made easier for businesses to develop. Mr. Hughes stated that Florissant's zoning is fairly flexible as compared to other cities especially with a B-5. Mr. Harris asked about the building permit processes and does he think there are areas that can be improved. Mr. Harris suggested a potential flow chart for approvals.

Councilman Jones asked about the current salt trucks and if any of them could be used for the brine. He stated that the commercial district has issues with parking lots and inside some of the stores that are not kept up. He would like a proactive approach to checking on the businesses.

Councilwoman Pagano suggested a program that requires all employees to report issues they see in the city.

Councilman Eagan asked if there are some ways to streamline processes in the public works department. He asked if the I pads are still useful.

Steve Weiersmueller discussed that Skeleton Key was awarded the bid. He gave a quick over view of the flow the system will work after the new system is implemented. He described what the Simply City Software does for inspections. Council discussed the details of the process and equipment.

Mr. Weiersmueller also explained the scheduling process at the police department and the solution they use called Planet Scheduling. They would like to incorporate that through the rest of the city. He described how the software works. He suggested that an additional \$10,000 would get the process going this year.

#### A&R Fund

Mrs. Johnson stated that she has questions about the intent of the separate funds. She pulled the reports for the Public Works Department. Mr. Hughes discussed the accounts in the A & R fund. He discussed the line items the fund pays for.

Councilwoman Pagano asked if all of the landlords have taken the class. Mr. Hughes stated that they have a class scheduled for September and feels they have had good compliance with the program.

Councilwoman Pagano made a motion to postpone the discussion of the A&R funds to another time. Henke seconded. Motion carried on voice vote.

#### Public Trash

Councilman Jones stated that he provided sections of the code regarding trash. He asked the council to take them home and they may need to make some changes. He stated that he drove through the city and many do not have waste baskets in front of their businesses. He questioned who is responsible for the wastebaskets in shopping centers. He feels they need to make some strong moves to make them responsible for this trash problem. He would also like some feedback from the residents about a new trash slogan for the city.

Councilman Henke stated that he has a slogan – stop throwing your money out the window.

Councilman Caputa stated that all businesses have trash service.

Councilman Eagan asked Mr. Hessel if the council needs to add to the ordinance. Mr. Hessel stated that in his opinion they do not. The code addresses that it is illegal to litter. He suggested that going forward when a special use or a B-5 is approved, they can require a number of cans outside the businesses. He said retroactively it may be more difficult to require.

Councilman Caputa suggested a letter to the businesses to suggest being a better steward.

Councilwoman Pagano stated that she has brought this issue up every year and it gets dropped. She asked when the city requires a trash can are they required to empty it.

The Mayor asked for bullet points and he would put together a letter. The Council suggested an article in the Focus as well. Mayor Schneider stated that they can put a letter in their business license.

#### **Clothing Donation Boxes**

Councilman Caputa asked Mr. Hughes about the clothing donation boxes. Mr. Hughes stated that the ordinance requires an annual permit fee to have one of these boxes. He stated that there are 11 that have obtained a permit. He said of the 11, 2 were trashy and were cleaned up.

There are 20 that did not receive a permit. He reviewed the reasons they could revoke the right to have the boxes. No permit fee is one reason.

Councilman Caputa would like to ban the use of these clothing boxes. Council concurred that they would lie to ban the boxes.

\*\*Council directed the staff t prepare an ordinance to ban the use of donation boxes and provide a deadline to allow them time to get rid of the boxes.

Councilman Siam asked if the owners do not pick them up, can the city take them. Mr. Hessel agreed that they can be taken after a period of time to remove them is given.

Councilman Harris stated that he is curious what other cities are doing about this issue.

Sub Committees

Mr. Hessel stated that when you create sub committees you are creating a separate governmental body. He said that the purpose of the subcommittee needs to be written down, when or if the purpose is satisfied. Identify the time when the sub-committee is to report back.

#### Waiving the Occupancy fees for Veterans

Councilman Eagan would like the council to consider waiving the occupancy fee for an honorably discharged veteran. Councilman Caputa asked the Mayor to see if the Finance director would have those numbers. He said it would be limited to those who have an Honorable discharge and a form DD214.

Councilman Parson stated that is the intention to limit it to 1 dwelling per veteran. Councilman Eagan said yes.

Council discussed the benefits of the proposal.

#### Citizen Comment

Mr. Engelmeyer stated that he appreciated the comments of the new finance director.

Mr. Smith commented on the efforts to get control of the trash around the city and with the businesses.

Mr. ODonnell stated he drove through Patterson Plaza and noticed that the small kiosk does not have a trash receptacle and there was a lot of trash. He asked if donation boxes could be prohibited at churches. Mr. Hessel said based on health and safety, outside boxes could be prohibited.

# 55 IV. STAFF ANALYSIS per drawing:

# 56 C3 of 7 Comments:

- 57 This drawing matches that of the ordinance. What does not match is what was built in 58 the field along the north property line. There is what appears to be what staff will refer to 59 as the 'access drive' or approach to the property to the north which has not been 60 constructed. During the course of sewer work, 2 manholes were placed near this area and
- 61 the area was left undeveloped and sodded. A continuous retaining wall (keyed note 20)
- and 6" curb (keyed notes 7, 8) and an undetailed "barrier" (keyed note 21) along the
- 63 north line, none of which is currently constructed.
- 64

65 One problem with this is that now we are aware of a contractual agreement between

66 parties for an access easement through this area. Staff recommends this be resolved prior

67 to amending the 'B-5'. The Collision Center is operating at 955 N Highway 67, in an

- 68 'R-4' Zoning District, under Special Permit.

70 **MSD2 Comments:** This drawing was not part of the ordinance, but indicates the

- 71 manholes installed near the missing concrete paving of the 'access drive'. It is not known
- 72 whether the owner or contractor deleted the paved area, but it was decided to do so after
- 73 constructing (2) manholes, one (1) shown on the plan. The owner claims that both
- 74 Ameren and MoDOT have something to do with no paving in this access drive area.
- 75

176 L1 Comments: Generally this plan matches with a few exceptions. Next to the 'access 177 drive' to the West, 3 Hughes Junipers, 4 Goldmound Spirea and 3 Dwarf Fragrant Sumac 178 shrubs have been replaced with 13 Little Bluestem and 22 Meadow Phlox, but again no 179 plantings in this island area have been made alongside this island.

# IV. STAFF ANALYSIS:

- 46 Under the Building Code and definition of a ground sign:
- 47
- 48 SECTION 520.050: GROUND SIGNS
- 49 Location. No ground sign shall be nearer than two (2) feet to any other sign, building or
- 50 structure. No ground sign shall be nearer the street than the building line established by
- 51 law. Ground signs are prohibited in shopping centers and all existing ground signs in a
- 52 shopping center shall be removed by July 31, 1973; however, a special permit
- 53 authorizing the location of a ground sign may be issued by the Council if the Council
- 54 finds that the issuance of such permit shall alleviate a hardship and is not simply for the
- 55 convenience of the applicant, that such proposed sign would be consistent with good
- 56 planning practices, can be maintained in a manner which is visually compatible with the
- 57 use of the property in the surrounding area and other signstructures within the
- 58 surrounding area and is not located in the historic district.

- 60 In addition, this sign is in the Historic District therefore a review of the sign code was in
- 61 order for commercial signs, however, digital signs are not specifically covered by this
- 62 section of the sign code and LHDC does not regulate digital signs, but only regulates
- 63 signs that are internally illuminated and/or :
- 64 520.330 Signs On Property Used For Commercial Purposes.
- 65 [Code 1980 §23-43; CC 1990 §5-235; Ord. No. 6366, 2-14-2000]
- 66 *A. The following regulations shall govern all signs on property used for commercial* 67 purposes:
- 67 purposes:
- 68 1. Size. The total gross sign area per use for all permitted signs, exclusive of parking
- 69 *direction and parking regulation signs, shall not exceed twenty-five (25) square feet.*
- 70 However, the total gross sign area may be increased to forty (40) square feet if the
- 51 building frontage of the part of the building occupied by the business exceeds twenty (20)
- 72 *feet and may be increased to eighty (80) square feet if such frontage exceeds ninety (90)*
- 73 *feet.*
- 74 2. Types of signs permitted. The following types of signs are permitted:
- 75 *a. Real estate signs as provided in Section 520.020(1)(a).*
- 76 b. Construction signs as provided in Section 520.020(10).
- 77 c. Identification signs.
- 78 (1) Each ground-floor occupant shall be permitted one (1) identification sign facing each
- street upon which such business fronts. A freestanding identification sign shall be
- 80 permitted only on the major street and only when the street frontage of the use exceeds
- 81 one hundred fifty (150) feet. Freestanding signs shall not exceed the building height or a
- 82 maximum height of twenty-two (22) feet, whichever is the lower, and shall not be located
- 83 within five (5) feet of any public right-of-way.
- 84 (2) A shopping center or group of businesses may erect one (1) collective business
- 85 identification sign for all of the uses in the center or grouping. The gross sign area of

such a collective sign shall not be deducted from the gross sign area allotted to the 86 87 individual uses. Such collective sign shall not exceed ninety (90) square feet in 88 gross sign area, shall not exceed the building height or a maximum height of twenty-two 89 (22) feet, whichever is the lower, and shall not be located within five (5) feet of any 90 public right-of-way. 91 d. Accessory signs. Accessory signs, not exceeding three (3) square feet each in 92 gross sign area, shall be permitted if they comply with the other provisions of this 93 Section. Accessory signs may be wall signs or window signs. 94 e. Parking direction signs. One (1) freestanding parking direction sign shall be permitted 95 for each driveway. The signshall not exceed five (5) square feet in gross sign area and 96 shall not project higher than five (5) feet. 97 f. Parking regulation signs. One (1) parking regulation sign shall be permitted for each 98 parking lot plus one (1) additionalsign for each twenty-five (25) parking spaces. 99 Such sign shall not exceed five (5) square feet in gross sign area, shall not be located 100 within five (5) feet of any public right-of-way and shall not be illuminated. It may only 101 contain parking regulations, rates, time of use and other pertinent parking information. 102 g. Opened lettered window signs stating the name of the business are permitted. 103 h. Projecting signs which hang perpendicular to a building are permitted if they are at 104 least eight (8) feet above the ground level, do not project more than five (5) feet from the 105 building and are at least two (2) feet from the edge of the public right-of-way. 106 *i.* Portable signs as provided in Section 520.020(1)(c). 107 3. Character of signing. All signs shall be so designed as to enhance the historic 108 character of the Old Town area. The Landmark and Historic District Commission shall 109 develop a series of performance-design criteria which shall serve as guidelines 110 for signing of property used for commercial purposes. These regulations shall be 111 published by the Commission and shall be on file in the office of the City Clerk and the 112 Building Commissioner. 113 114 1. The application is accompanied by a Drawings of the existing and proposed sign 115 built within the same cabinet 78"x 34" about 18 s.f. The digital portion of the sign is within regulations otherwise at 2'-7" tall and 6'-9" wide or about 18.4 s.f. 116 117 2. Mason Sign company obtained a detailed site plan from St. Louis County Highways that indicates that the sign is on private property and about 17 feet from 118 119 the right-of-way. 





#### 51 **III. SURROUNDING PROPERTIES:**

#### 57 **IV. STAFF ANALYSIS:**

- 58 Special Uses for this zoning district includes Adult Day Care and Assembly Hall.

60 The application is accompanied by a revised floor plan showing 3 gathering spaces with 61 overall dimensions of 40' x 86' approx. = 3440 s.f. noted as Assembly Hall Use with no 62 changes in plan expected.

64 The applicant indicates a hall for hire type business only with no cooking equipment. 65

- 66 No exterior changes to the site are anticipated. No outside equipment is anticipated.
- 67
- 68 Now new signage is proposed, therefore signs must meet 40 s.f. max. size requirement.
- 69

70 Occupant Load: The architectural plan shows one room with 11 tables and the other 2 71 rooms have 6 tables of 6 people. This would result in 138 plus staff. The building code

- 72 would require a maximum of occupants pertaining to the area of the space, however, 73 which could be a different number based on tables/chairs or without tables or chairs.

- Therefore the total number of occupants likely is up to 200 per the building code for the 75 same table/chair arrangement.







Subject: Budget Transfer for Building and Equipment Maintenance

Due to higher than forecasted expenditures the Building Maintenance and supplies account and the Equipment Repairs – Vehicles account need more money to cover anticipated repair costs. The higher costs to the Building Maintenance account include \$5,000 for an elevator repair and \$11,000 to replace a heat exchanger. The higher costs for the Equipment Repairs account include approximately \$5,000/ month for Auto parts,\$5,000 every two months to Danmark Tire, \$3,000 for repair to the emergency generator, \$3,200 to attempt to repair a Chevy hybrid pick up, and approximately \$4,000 in repairs to the police motorcycles.

Therefore, I respectfully request that \$40,000 be transferred from Capital Improvement Fund Account 03-5-03-52000 – Street Contracts. Of that \$40,000, \$10,000 is to be transferred to Account 03-5-03-29000 – Building Maintenance and supplies and \$30,000 is to be transferred to Account 03-5-03-30010 – Equipment Repairs - Vehicles.

WHEREAS the current code provides for an exception for Sergeant, Lieutenant and Captain stating that these positions remain on the promotion list for no longer than four (4) years; and

WHEREAS the city council believes that if an officer has successfully completed all written tests and other steps of the promotional process, they should remain on the list permanently and not be required to retest after four years; and

WHEREAS the City Council feels it is in the best interest of the city to eliminate the exception for remaining on the promotion list as it applies to the Sergeant, Lieutenant and Captain positions in the police department.

Sir;

I am requesting a change to the City of Florissant Ordinance Section 125.220. In this section I would like to remove the exception wording that states that a promotion list for the position of Sergeant, Lieutenant and Captain shall not exceed four (4) years. At that time an Officer applying for one of these positions would have to retest to again be placed on the promotion list.

I would like to remove this wording so when an Officer applies for these positions and has successfully completed all written tests and other steps of the promotional process they are placed on the promotion list. The Officer would then permanently stay on the promotion list and not have to retest.

I feel this change would expand our list of promotional candidates. It would reduce the costs associated with the constant repeated testing of employees. Most importantly I think it would improve our promotional process.

I have attached a copy of the Ordinance with the wording highlighted that would need to be removed.

## Section 125.220. Promotion Lists.

#### [Ord. No. 7328 §1, 8-28-2006]

The Personnel Officer shall prepare and keep available a promotion list of persons who are in classified positions and who desire promotion to higher-rated positions. Such lists shall show the employee's name, department, title, rating of his/her supervisor (numerically rated on the same scale as for personnel interview of an applicant), length of service in present title and period of continuous service with the City. Such an employee shall be required to take the tests provided for applicants, and his/her test results and earned ratings shall appear on the list. No time limitation applies to promotion lists (with the exception of the promotion lists for Police sergeants, lieutenants and captains, which such promotion lists shall be maintained for a period of not to exceed four (4) years.)Names from the promotion lists may be removed in the manner set forth in Section 125.225. It shall be the responsibility of the department heads to keep the Personnel Officer advised of the names of employees seeking promotion, but nothing in this Section shall prevent any employee from requesting the Personnel Officer to place his/her name on such a list. Nothing herein shall be deemed to require that promotions be limited to employees who have requested promotion or who have placed or caused their names to be placed on such a list.

## Section 125.225. Maintenance and Review of Lists — Removal of Names.

[Ord. No. 7328 §1, 8-28-2006]

- A. Maintenance of employment, re-employment and promotion lists shall be the responsibility of the Personnel Officer. To the extent appropriate, he/she shall review the lists, determine eligibility and interest status of applicants listed thereon and remove names for the following reasons, among others:
  - 1. Refusal to accept appointment or report after appointment, unless a satisfactory reason is established which justifies continuance of his/her name on the list;

Recently the City built the Municipal Court Florissant Division and Police Annex. The utilities used during the construction phase of this building are considered construction costs and should be recorded as such. Erroneously utility charges to date were recorded under the Public Works Department.

This appropriation will allow the utility charges to date and charges through August 31, 2018 (not yet invoiced) to be charged to the correct account.

Please consider this for an emergency reading due to the fact that the error is causing the Public Works Utility account to be short of funds.

Therefore, it is requested that \$40,000 be appropriated from the Public Safety Fund Reserve and distributed as follows:
