

21st Annual Florissant Old Town Fall Festival - Sunday October 14th

The Old Town Fall Festival kicks off at 11 am on Sunday October 14th and runs until 5pm on rue St. Francois Street in the heart of Old Town Florissant. Eleven full blocks from Florissant Road down to the St. Ferdinand Shrine are closed off for this event. All side streets will be blocked off to accommodate the festival. The street will be filled with activities for everyone with over 150 booths including a full craft fair area, games to play, sale items, food and beverages. We will have the old favorites like the Chili Cook-off, the wine garden, pumpkin decorating, and entertainment on almost every block.


Fido Follies Dog Contest!

We kicked off the May (WNO) with "Proud to be an American" theme that was sponsored by the VFW Post 4105. On that night we dedicated our 32nd Walk Through History plaque in honor of the First Lieutenant Michael J. Blassie, Repatriated Vietnam Era "Unknown Soldier". His name is also etched with his comrades who gave all on the Vietnam Memorial Obelisk at the entrance to Koch Park.

Rachel and I recently had the honor to attend the military retirement ceremony of Colonel Patricia Blassie which celebrated her 40 year Air Force Career as well as reflect on the sacrifice of her Brother Michael and the epic journey he and the Blassie Family went through before he was returned home to Florissant. Florissant is proud of the entire Blassie Family and the sacrifice they made for our Nation. Members of that family still live and work in our beautiful city.

First Lieutenant Michael Joseph Blassie Vietnam era Unknown Soldier 4 April 1948 – 11 May 1972

Florissant patriot graduated Air Force academy, fighter pilot 8th Special Ops Squadron Vietnam. Silver Star, Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal. May 11, 1972 his A-37 Dragonfly shot down during 138th combat mission! His remains, classified unknown but to God, randomly chosen Vietnam Unknown at Arlington with full military honors, Medal of Honor by Pres. Reagan. Advances in DNA identified remains 1998 and he returned home to Florissant for funeral at St. Dismas, internment at Jefferson Barracks.

In June before the 2nd (WNO) event which was hosted by Kortes Custom Framing & Antiques, we dedicated our 33rd plaque in honor of Paul Detrick, Sr.

Paul F. Detrick, Sr. 6 September 1923 – 31 August 1999 **Christian Hospital Founding Father**

Paul Detrick named President of Christian Hospital 1960. Paul and Mary raised three children in North County, their home for life. His vision and leadership instrumental developing Florissant healthcare services opening Christian Hospital Northwest 1968 and Northeast Campus 1973. Worked with Florissant civic leaders and board member of community organizations including Boatmen's Bank. Committed to the prosperity and well-being of Florissant area residents and businesses. He and Family were proud to serve the community.



Our Town from the Mayor

Greetings Everyone,

Please take the time to familiarize yourself with **Proposition D** which the State Legislature has placed on the November 6, 2018 Ballot. Prop D, which has the support of Governor Mike Parson and many organizations from both rural and urban Missouri will ask Voters to increase the fuel user fee 2 ¹/₂ cents per year for the next four years in order to address the maintenance of our valuable MO transportation highway infrastructure.

The last time the flat gas user fee was increased was 1996 and inflation has resulted in a loss in purchasing power of that revenue stream ranking Missouri 46th in highway revenue trying to maintain the 7th most miles in the nation. This proposal follows the recommendation of the 21st Century Transportation Task Force that Senator Gina Walsh appointed me to last year. That task force heard from stakeholders at public hearings at seven locations voices their confidence in MODOT and the need for revenue for Highway infrastructure maintenance and construction.

The City Council, the Environmental Quality Commission and I are looking for a catchy theme for a campaign from the Fall Festival to next year's Valley of Flowers Festival to reduce litter in Florissant. We are soliciting support from our great business community and the Greater North County Chamber and asking them to volunteer to provide more trash receptacles and help us to encourage good manners and citizenship when it comes to disposal of that food cup or wrapper etc.

We hope to enlist the involvement of our public and parochial schools to help educate each member of every family to adopt manners that will advance a litter free city. Please send suggestions on a theme and ideas for a cleaner Florissant to City Hall or to your Council Representative listed on page two of this publication.

The Public Works Department is doing \$5,527,000 in street work which included \$990,000 in slurry seal resurfacing work on 112 different streets, \$450,000 in concrete pavement replacement and repairs on 23 streets, and \$1,700,000 in major street repairs on 19 different streets. Work also includes replacement of the St. Anthony Lane Bridge over Fountain creek estimated at \$550,000 and major street and storm water work on North Lafayette Street (N.Hwy.67 to Washington) estimated at \$2,327,000.

The street work on N. Lafayette Street and the replacement of St. Anthony Lane Bridge over Fountain creek are made possible from grants received from East-West Gateway Coordinating Council and the Missouri Department of Transportation. Recently MoDOT completed inspections of all bridge structures in the City and found no major problems on any of our structures. This comes as no surprise because former Florissant City Engineer Tom Schneider started a program of taking advantage of Federal Grants to systematically replace aging bridges almost every year 40 years ago in 1978! The City has been officially notified that the Insurance Services Office (ISO) an independent insurer-supported organization has upgraded our Building Code Effectiveness grade from a Class 4 to a Class 3 (Class 1 being the highest). Effective code enforcement helps keep insurance rates down and has a major influence on the economic well-being of a City. The new Municipal Court Florissant Division and Police Annex (Florissant bought and renovated the former Dick Weber Bowling Lanes on Washington Street) is complete and a building dedication was held on July 30th. The new

court facility will accommodate a large, modern municipal court-room, court office facility and a police annex and training facility.

The Public Works Department has implemented a new program to monitor and maintain vacant properties and residential rental properties in the City. If vacant residential property owners refuse to maintain the exterior of their properties, then the City will contract to have the work done and will bill the owner. Properties left vacant for over six months must have them registered with the City so the Police and Public Works departments can keep an eye on them.

Owners of residential rental properties must attend a Crime Free Seminar before they can renew their residential rental licenses for the year. These mandatory Crime Free Seminars have been well received and are very informative to landlords and explains in much more detail how the City partners with landlords to monitor and maintain their properties and help keep good tenants thereby increasing all property values.

It has been a very busy summer as I, and several members of the Florissant Police Department have visited numerous neighborhood events, and I am excited to see so many events on the calendar for this fall. Whether it was while unloading food donations at TEAM, a Coffee with a Cop, or one of our excellent summer concerts, these events allow for me and the police department to get to know the members of the community that I am proud to say that we serve.

The police department has been very busy lately with several initiatives that I would like to share with you. The first is our new "Cops N Schools" program. This program allows for patrol officers to stop in one elementary school within their patrol area per day to get to know the students and staff. The program has been well received with area school offi-

cials, and the officers enjoy the opportunity to spend a few minutes with our young people.

With the growing number of active shooter/workplace violence incidents across the country, I felt that it was necessary that the Florissant Police Department offers additional training for these events. The department has been very busy providing the workplace violence/active shooter training to area schools and businesses. The training program, "4E," instructs the participants on how to Educate, Evade, Escape, and Engage during an active shooter incident. The department has 6 instructors for this program, and it will give the participants the knowledge to survive such a traumatic incident. If you have a school, nursing home, daycare center, or any other business, and your employees have not had this training, I would encourage you to contact Officer Steve Johnson at 314-831-7000 or sjohnson@florissantmo.com.

The year has flown by, but the Holiday Shopping season will be here before we know it. The Florissant Police Department will once again increase patrols in Florissant Shopping Centers during the busy holiday season. Our goal is to provide peace of mind to our residents and visitors who utilize our great retail centers, as well as the employees.

In closing, I have one request-BE INVOLVED. Attend the many events that are taking place within our community this fall. These will allow you to get to know the members of our community better, which benefits everyone. Also, get to know your police department. Neighborhood Watch Program

This program encourages citizens to take an active role in keeping their neighborhoods safe by reporting suspicious activity, practicing effective personal safety techniques to reduce the risk of becoming a victim of a crime, watching out for each other in their neighborhood and staying in touch with fellow neighbors to encourage keeping your neighborhoods safe and free from crime. Chief Lowery says, "Our residents are our eyes and ears in the neighborhoods, I encourage every resident in the city to participate in this very important program." Those who volunteer to become a block captain will be trained on how to conduct a neighborhood watch meeting, pass along important safety information, discuss issues in the neighborhoods and keep their group members up to date on crime trends in their neighborhoods. Resident Camera Program

Do you currently utilize private video surveillance at your home or business? If you do, we'd like to hear from you.

Video surveillance is one of the best methods for apprehending criminals and convicting suspects who are caught in the act of committing a crime. Installing video surveillance is a great example of community-police partnerships and is something the Florissant Police Department values highly.

How Does it work?

The Resident Camera Program allows residents and business owners to register locations and capabilities of their security camera systems with the Florissant Police Department. Using this information when a crime occurs, the Florissant Police Department will know the locations of nearby video cameras and will be able to collect video evidence, and follow up on leads.

Benefits of Program

Because they are caught in the act of committing the crime, video surveillance is one of the best methods to catch suspects and convict them. As crimes occur nearby, many residents and business owners are unaware that their camera systems may have captured information that could help solve a crime. Likewise, police are not always aware of who may have potentially vital video evidence.

By registering your camera, officers can quickly identify nearby cameras that may have captured criminal activity. After registering your camera, you will only be contacted by the Florissant Police Department if there is a criminal incident in the vicinity of your security camera and police personnel believe viewing your video footage will assist in the investigation.





Safeguard Your Children Get them ID'd with MoCHIP! **IT'S FREE!**

The Florissant Police Department along with the Missouri Freemasons will be hosting a one day Missouri Child Identification Program (MoCHIP) during the Florissant Fall Festival on Sunday, October 14, 2018, 10:00 AM - 3:00 PM. The event will be held at the Florissant City Hall inside the Council Chambers.

This program, FREE OF CHARGE, provides parents with critical information on their children in the event their child turned up missing or abducted. This nationally recognized program provides parents with a digital photograph, digital fingerprints, DNA swab, child information and emergency contacts, a dental bite impression, and two (2) laminated ID cards. Most importantly, all information is turned over to a parent or legal guardian on completion of the process. No child information is stored or kept by the MoCHIP program or the Florissant Police.

If you've been through the MoCHIP program and have had your child ID'd, bring the mini CD back and we'll update it for you. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) strongly urges parents to have the most up-to-date information, including pictures - so if you've had your 0-4 year old ID'd in the last 6 months, it's time to do it again. It is recommended to have children ages 5-10 ID'd once a year,



and when children 10 and over enter puberty you should consider having them ID'd every 6-12 months, as their features and bodies are changing drastically. Often overlooked are older teens and young adults who are actually most at risk - please urge your 14 - 21 year olds to get ID'd. It typically takes only 10-15 minutes.

As a result of the efforts by the Missouri Freemason through the MoCHIP program, parents/legal guardians of over 125,000 have received this critical identification information free of charge.

Make sure you mark your calendars for this event and keep your eyes open as the date approaches for more information.

Voter Identification

The St. Louis County Election Board requires all voters to show some form of identification in order to vote. A government issued photo I.D. is the preferred form of identification because it can be scanned, allowing the lines to move quickly. If you forget your ID, or simply do not have a government issued photo I.D., YOU CAN STILL VOTE! However, you will need to either present some other approved form of identification or fill out a provisional ballot and sign a statement confirming your identity.

In general, there are 3 options for showing ID in order to vote:

Option 1: A Government Issued Photo ID. Provide a government issued photo ID (e.g. CURRENT Missouri Driver or Non-Driver License, Military ID, US Passport), you can show it to the Poll Worker at your polling place who will process you normally.

Option 2: Secondary form of ID

Provide a secondary form of identification (Voter Registration Card, ID from a MO University or College, Utility Bill, Bank Statement, Government Check, Government document showing your name and address) and sign a statement confirming your identity. **Option 3: No ID**

If you have neither of the above IDs, but are a registered voter, you will cast a provisional ballot. Your vote will only be counted if the signature on the ballot matches the signature we have on the Voter Registration file.

More information about the Voter ID law can be found at the Missouri Secretary of State's website.

Replacement Voter I.D. Cards may be requested by contacting the Election Board, giving your name and address. New I.D. Cards will be mailed to all voters in each even numbered year, to new voters when they register and to anyone who changes his or her address.

North County Inc. Board of Directors Supports Prop D

North County Inc. (NCI) Board of Directors voted to support Missouri Proposition D, the Gas Tax Increase, Olympic Prize Tax Exemption and Traffic Reduction Fund Measure. Proposition D will be on the ballot November 6, and NCI encourages the St. Louis community to support this critical measure for our state and local communities.



With the winter months fast approaching we at the Florissant Police Department would like our citizens to take a few minutes to review their winter driving habits. As we all know hazardous driving conditions due to rain, sleet and snow can result in hazardous highway conditions. Here are some tips from the American Automobile Association, AAA.

Severe weather can be both frightening and dangerous for automobile travel. Motorists should know the safety rules for dealing with winter road emergencies. AAA reminds motorists to be cautious while driving in adverse weather. For more information on winter driving, the association offers the How to Go on Ice and Snow brochure, available through most AAA offices. Contact your local AAA representative for more information.

AAA recommends the following winter driving tips:

• Avoid driving while you're fatigued. Getting the proper amount of rest before taking on winter weather tasks reduces driving risks.

• Never warm up a vehicle in an enclosed area, such as a garage.

• Make certain your tires are properly inflated.

• Never mix radial tires with other tire types.

• Keep your gas tank at least half full to avoid gas line freeze-up.

• If possible, avoid using your parking brake in cold, rainy and snowy weather.

• Do not use cruise control when driving on any slippery surface (wet, ice. sand).

• Always look and steer where you want to go.

• Use your seat belt every time you get into your vehicle.

If passed, the 10 cents tax increase is estimated to generate a revenue stream of \$50 to \$70 million transit and other multi-modal transportation and an additional \$430 million a year for roads and bridges. For nearly two decades, there has been no gas tax increase.

Proposition D will allow Missouri Department of Transportation to better maintain major corridors through our community, such as I-70 and I-270. It will also bring more than \$5 million to the North County communities and north St. Louis County to help improve local roads.

"North County highways are among Missouri's aging, deteriorating transportation infrastructure and are in dire need of repair, maintenance and upgrades. This investment in transportation would go a long way to improv-ing travel safety and economic development," said North County Inc. Board President Dr. Chris Kilbride.

Transit funding in Missouri was cut to \$1.7 million for State Fiscal Year 2018. Currently, Missouri ranks 46th in the country with respect to transit funding.

"It is critical MoDOT receives a revenue stream that provides the ability to maintain its roads and bridges as well as funds for major capital improvements such as the reconstruction of

I-270 in North County," said Florissant Mayor Tom Schneider.

NCI is an economic and community development advocacy organization serving the North St. Louis County community with a focus on economic investment, transportation, education and healthcare.



Can You Benefit From an Annuity?

Retirement isn't cheap. You may have heard that you will need 70 percent to 80 percent of your pre-retirement income, but the real figure might even be higher, depending on your circumstances. And retirement isn't short, either – you could spend two or three decades as a retiree. Taken together, these factors highlight the need to identify as many sources of retirement income as possible – and one of these sources might be an annuity.

A fixed annuity is an insurance product that allows you to make a lump-sum investment and can provide insured payments to you for a designated number of years, or for life. A fixed annuity guarantees a rate of interest for a stated period that will be unaffected by market fluctuations. Your principal investment and the specified interest rate are guaranteed based on the claims-paying ability of the issuing company.

A fixed annuity offers some key benefits, including the following: • No contribution limit – No IRS contribution limits apply to nonqualified annuities – that is, annuities held outside a tax-advantaged retirement plan, such as a defined benefit pension plan, Section 403(b) plan (TSA) or an IRA. This can be especially valuable if you are already close to retirement age and think you might be short on savings.

• Tax deferred accumulation – The interest you earn is tax deferred and will compound annually, meaning your money may accumulate faster than it would if it were placed in a taxable investment. Earnings will be taxed at your ordinary income rate once you start taking withdrawals, and withdrawals prior to age 59-1/2 may be subject to a 10% federal tax penalty. (You will want to consult with your tax advisor before withdrawing from your annuity.)


• Income for life – You can take your annuity payout as a lump sum or choose to receive payments for a set number of years, or for the rest of your life. Your income amount will be determined by the value in your contract and your life expectancy.

• Death benefit – If your annuity is still in the "accumulation" phase at the time of your death (meaning you haven't yet begun collecting payments), it might provide a death benefit to the beneficiary you've named. Typically, this lump sum will be the greater of your account balance or the total of all premiums paid, although some annuities provide additional options. Be aware, though, that the death benefit may be taxable.

As is the case with all investments, a fixed annuity does have some caveats. Most important, an annuity is a long-term investment – if you pull money out within the first several years after your purchase, you likely will face some prohibitive surrender charges. These charges decline each year, typically reaching zero after seven years. Such withdrawals also may be subject to a market value adjustment.

One more thing to keep in mind: Different annuities come with different fees, and the higher the fee, the lower your "real" return will be. Consequently, you will want to compare fees before investing. If a fixed annuity is appropriate for your situation, you may find it can join your other income pools – Social Security, 401(k), IRA, etc. – to provide you with the resources you need to enjoy the retirement lifestyle you've envisioned.



Autumn Leaves



As autumn approaches and the leaves begin to fall, the City of Florissant would like to remind its residents that raking, sweeping, or blowing leaves or grass onto the sidewalk or street is illegal.

Yard debris tends to clog our sewer systems and make our city streets unattractive to residents and visitors.

Please be considerate of your neighbors and dispose of all yard waste properly and in a timely manner.

Living In Harmony with Wildlife Tips on Preventing Conflicts

With the fall season upon us the City of Florissant encourages its residents and neighbors to live in harmony with wildlife. As suburban sprawl continues to displace wild animals, some conflicts with humans are inevitable. However, many can be avoided with little effort and planning.

The city's Health Department offers the following tips on preventing conflicts with our wild neighbors:

• The smell of garbage is a huge attraction to wildlife. Keep lids on trash containers and secured at all times. Store containers in garage if possible, especially overnight. Make sure to sani-

tize your containers often. Don't leave pet food outside, pick-up what your pet does not eat and remove animal waste from property daily.

• Clean below bird feeders, as seed can attract scavengers such as raccoons and skunks, squirrels, rats, etc.

- Pick up fruit as soon as it has fallen from the trees.
- Trim back overgrowth and any branches that overhang the roof. These branches provide easy access to your roof, vents and eventually the attic.
- Remove brush piles / yard waste from your property.

• Check your deck and block or screen off any entry points that allow wildlife access.

• Check your roof eaves, overhangs, vents, chimney stacks and even cracks around your windows or pipes that lead into the house. Caulk, screen, or make repairs if needed to prevent wildlife from entering your home.

• Make sure your chimney is capped or screened.

• Keep your lawn grub-free and you will prevent raccoons, skunks, moles, and opossums from tearing up your lawn to feast on them.

• Sprinkle plants with Epsom salts or cayenne pepper to deter wildlife from feasting on them.

• If a wild animal has made a nest on your property, you can try placing ammonia soaked rags near the nest site, shine a light continuously on the nest site and place a radio nearby tuned to loud music. In most cases, the parent will be encouraged to move the young elsewhere.

Be advised, trapping and relocating wildlife is not a solution. If your yard or home is appealing to wildlife and an animal is trapped and relocated, another animal will most likely take its place. The best long term solution is to keep your property in good repair and use appropriate and humane


