


## FLORISSANT CITY COUNCIL AGENDA

9	Due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic, the Florissant City Council met in a virtual
10	meeting through a Zoom platform on Monday, April 27, 2020 at 7:30 p.m. with Council President
11	Caputa presiding. The Chair asked everyone in attendance to stand and join in reciting the Pledge of
12	Allegiance.
13	On Roll Call the following Councilmembers were present: Eagan, Caputa, Henke, Pagano,
14	Parson, Siam, Harris and Manganelli. Councilman Schildroth (technical difficulties). Also present was
15	Mayor Timothy Lowery, City Clerk Karen Goodwin, and City Attorney John Hessel. A quorum being
16	present the Chair stated that the Council Meeting was in session for the transaction of business.
17	Mr. Hessel noted for the record that Councilman Schildroth joined the meeting at 7:34.
18	The City Attorney explained that the meeting was being conducted remotely because of the
19	Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic emergency. He stated that under the Sunshine Law, Section
20	610.015, when an emergency exists the members of the City Council who are not physically present in
21	the Council Chambers, can vote remotely on all matters.
22	Councilwoman Pagano moved to approve the Council Minutes of April 13, 2020 seconded by
23	Caputa. Motion carried.
24	The next item on the Agenda was Hearing from Citizens of which there were none.
25	The next item on the Agenda was Communications of which there was none.
26	The next item on the Agenda was Public Hearings.
27	The City Clerk reported that Public Hearing #20-04-015 to be held this night on a request to
28	Rezone to amend B-5 Ordinance No. 6266 (as amended by Ord. Nos. 6380, 8064, and 8224) to allow
29	for additional "Permitted Uses" in a B-5 Zoning District for the property located at 3180 N Highway 67

had been advertised in substantially the same form as appears in the foregoing publication and by

posting the property. The Chair declared the Public Hearing to be open and invited those who wished

to be heard to come forward.

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Mr. Dejan (Dan) Dokovic, petitioner, explained that Lowe's is attempting to put a deed restriction on their property, requiring that it not be used as a home improvement store. The current zoning will only allow a hardware store. Mr. Dejan has someone interested in the property, and this zoning difficulty has created problems. The proposed rezoning application would remove the restriction.

His company would like to improve and redevelop the site and lease it to various tenants. They currently have several possibilities, including a gym, self-storage enterprise and a trampoline park. The interior will be divided if necessary, but there are no major changes planned for the exterior. Lowes has taken very good care of the building and it is in good shape. The petitioner currently has no plans to request Tax Increment Financing. Mr. Hessel clarified that under a B-5 ordinance, a newly proposed enterprise would be required to submit a site plan to Planning & Zoning and Council.

The Chair asked if there were any other citizens would like to speak on said public hearing. Being no citizens who wished to speak, Councilman Siam moved to close P.H. #20-04-015, seconded by Eagan. Motion carried.

The City Clerk reported that Public Hearing #20-04-016 to be held this night on a request to authorize a Special Use Permit to Premier Auto Service, Inc. d/b/a Premier Auto Service to allow for an auto service and repair facility located at 1890 & 1990 N Highway 67 had been advertised in substantially the same form as appears in the foregoing publication and by posting the property. The Chair declared the Public Hearing to be open and invited those who wished to be heard to come forward.

Mr. Joe Dale, petitioner for Mission Hills Development, explained that Premier Auto does a considerable amount of business. They need more bays contiguous to their property. They want to take a portion of the existing building (1700 sf) down to the foundation and rebuild it with higher masonry walls. This would enable them to install four additional bays with lifts and larger service doors. The balance of the building will remain "as is." Mr. Dale stated he was aware of the restrictions on the number of cars allowed on site. The hours of operation will remain the same as they are at Premier Auto.

The Chair asked if there were any other citizens would like to speak on said public hearing. Being no citizens who wished to speak, Councilman Henke moved to close P.H. #20-04-016, seconded by Parson. Motion carried.

### WORK SESSION MEETING MINUTES

### **April 21, 2020**

Due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic, the Florissant City Council met in a virtual work session through a Zoom platform on Tuesday April 21, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. with Council President Caputa presiding. The Chair asked everyone in attendance to stand and join in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

On Roll Call the following Councilmembers were present: Eagan, Caputa, Henke, Pagano, Parson, Siam, Harris Manganelli and Councilman Schildroth. Also present was Mayor Timothy Lowery, City Clerk Karen Goodwin, and City Attorney John Hessel. A quorum being present the Chair stated that the Council Meeting was in session for the transaction of business.

Mayor Lowery stated that he felt it was important to inform the council about budget cuts that are being proposed by the department heads. He said that some things could be revisited in July or August because the city will not have actual numbers regarding reduced revenues until late June. Mayor Lowery stated that the budget is the Council's budget and he wants to keep them informed on any reduction in spending.

Mayor Lowery stated that he would like to start with Kimberlee Johnson, the Director of Finance to go over the numbers and projections. Then the department heads will discuss the proposed reductions in their prospective departments.

Mrs. Johnson, Director of Finance reviewed the revenue projections. She stated that they are projecting a 25% reduction in sales taxes and 15% reduction in utility taxes. At the current time the revenues are trending close to the budgeted numbers, but the city will not know actual numbers until June. She said that the deficit could be at \$3.6 million according to those projections. The proposed budget reductions are \$1.8 million so another \$1.8 million is needed. Mrs. Johnson reviewed the specific funds and projections for revenue deficits.

Mayor Lowery stated that he does not feel that we can bring the reserve down in the amount of the deficit. He feels that the city needs to cut where possible to reduce that number as much as possible.

Councilman Manganelli asked about the vehicle lease that was approved by the Council. Mayor Lowery stated that he is working to hold up the lease if possible.

Councilwoman Pagano asked about the financial reports, the last one was in November. Mrs. Johnson stated that she is hoping to have the financial statements through February by the end of the week.

Chief Fagan stated that they took a close look at their budget and reviewed the proposed projects and purchases that they will be putting on hold or eliminating. He also noted that they have 2 police officer positions open that they will not fill because they are able to utilize the school resource officers for the time being to maintain service.

Councilman Caputa asked if the Student Resource officers are still under contact with the School district. Chief Fagan stated that the officers are still under contract with the School District. Councilman Eagan clarified that there is a hiring freeze currently.

Councilman Henke asked if the number of calls for service has changed. Chief Fagan stated that they are able to handle the calls for service.

Councilwoman Pagano asked if all of the reductions mentioned by the Chief are included in the lists provided by the finance department. Mrs. Johnson explained what was included in the initial list of reductions.

Councilman Caputa asked for an itemized list of the reductions. Mayor Lowery stated that he would have a list by the end of the week.

Todd Hughes, Public Works Director reviewed his reductions by fund. He stated that out of the General fund they reduced several items in the amount of \$141,500. Mr. Hughes discussed the Street Improvement Fund, stating that there will be hold on the street projects and holding off on the purchase of the street sweeper at a total savings of \$1.44M. Capital Improvement Fund is being reduced by \$1.158 M.

Councilman Caputa asked about emergency repairs and road work being done in house. Mr. Hughes stated that patches can be done in house. Councilman Manganelli asked if there are additional cuts in the numbers presented by Mr. Hughes. Mr. Hughes stated that not all the cuts are included in the original numbers sent to the Council. Mayor Lowery stated that he feels that the city will be able to do street work, just everything is on hold for now.

Councilman Schildroth asked about the old street sweeper. Mr. Hughes stated that they did some repairs to the old street sweeper and they hope that it can make it through for the time being. Council discussed renting vs. leasing a street sweeper. Councilman Henke suggested that the street sweeping service might be a suspend able service in the current situation. Mr. Harris asked about the potential of insurance savings.

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Mayor Lowery stated that the renovations at City Hall will continue because we have already committed to finishing the project. Mr. Hughes stated that the work on City Hall will begin on Thursday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Cheryl Thompson-Stimage, Parks Director reviewed the reductions in the parks department. She reviewed staffing, staff shirts and the potential savings if the pools do not open or the summer playground is cancelled. She outlined the supplies that could be saved. She also mentioned that there is a question of whether or not to cancel the 4<sup>th</sup> of July fireworks. The Northwinds band has already cancelled. Mrs. Thompson reviewed the Capital Addition reductions and the General Fund. Mayor Lowery discussed the issues with opening the pool and the expenses. Mrs. Thompson stated that it takes about 4-6 weeks to open the pool.

Mayor Lowery stated that he is looking for direction on the closing of the pool, summer camp and the  $4^{th}$  of July event.

Councilman Manganelli asked about adjusting the mowing schedule. Mrs. Thompson-Stimage stated that they are using every full time person they have to make sure the grass gets cut. Adjustments are being made on a regular basis to accommodate the change in working hours.

Councilman Schildroth asked about the tree trimming that is being put on hold for now? Mrs. Thompson said yes. Some things will still be done because they are already under contract but they are stopping. Councilman Schildroth stated that he feels that the pool should be closed, the summer camp should be cancelled and the 4<sup>th</sup> of July fireworks display should be cancelled unless the situation drastically changes in the next 10 days to 2 weeks.

Councilwoman Pagano stated that she is apprehensive about closing Bangert and wants to wait and see on closing the pool or open it later and she is not necessarily in favor of cancelling the fireworks.

Councilman Eagan stated that there are no shows in June in Maryland Heights. He feels that the city can go without the pool, summer camp and fireworks this year. He suggested that the fireworks could possibly be pushed back to Fall Festival, the city needs to be conservative because there could be a second wave. Councilman Eagan asked about the concerts in the park. Mayor Lowery stated that they are looking into contracts and that the Valley of Flowers has not been cancelled, but postponed and the format has changed a bit.

Councilman Harris stated that he agreed with pushing back or cancelling the fireworks. He is concerned about the summer camp cancellation. Could the summer camp be consolidated?

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He is concerned about parents having to work. He understands the closing of the pool. Mrs. Thompson discussed the scheduling of the indoor pool. Mr. Harris asked about the golf course. Mrs. Thompsons stated that they allowing golf carts but requiring the golfers to clean the carts before and after they use them, they are providing cleaning supplies. They are only accepting credit card payments at this time.

Councilman Parson stated that he is in favor of cutting the fireworks for this year. With regard to the pool, he feels that the city should consult a health professional to determine if it is safe to swim. Mrs. Thompson stated that they have spoken to the Health Department and they said that the level of chlorine in the pool would kill the virus. Councilman Parson asked about a shorter season. He has concern about closing the summer camp.

Councilman Siam supports closing Bangert Pool, summer camp and the fireworks. He feels that the safety of large congregations could be dangerous, in addition to the budget concerns.

Councilman Manganelli stated that he supports not opening Bangert Pool. He feels that people won't want to attend summer camp or the pool. He is in favor of postponing the fireworks for a later celebration.

Councilwoman Pagano asked about tournaments at the golf course. Mrs. Thompson stated that all tournaments have either rescheduled or have been cancelled until the end of May. Mr. Hessel stated that he feels there will not be any tournaments this year at all.

Councilman Henke stated that he agrees with others that the fiscal responsibility and the social responsibility requires us to cancel the fireworks, the summer camp and the opening of Bangert pool.

Councilman Harris asked about making any other adjustments at the golf course. Mrs. Johnson stated that they did not include any revenue from tournaments in the projections.

Steve Weiersmueller, IT/Media Director, discussed the savings of \$35,000 in the General Fund with reductions in contractors, uniforms, office expense, training and professional services. \$34,000 savings were found in the Capital Improvement Fund. He stated that they are hoping that Charter Spectrum will return \$10,000 to the City. He discussed running fiber optic lines to save money.

Councilman Caputa reiterated that they would like an itemized list of expenditure reductions.

Councilman Harris asked how the process works for making changes. Mayor Lowery stated that these things are essentially on hold and can be put back if the situation changes.

Mr. Hessel stated that it is within the Mayor's authority to determine whether or not the money is spent that is in the budget. He recommended not making any formal changes to the budget at this time.

The Mayor asked for a closed session to discuss personnel.

Councilman Siam asked if all of the reductions have been accounted for in the sheet presented to the council.

Question: Robert Smith asked about having copies of the itemized reductions when it is available.

There being no further business to discuss Councilman Eagan moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:25 pm, seconded by Manganelli, motion carried.

### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This is a request for recommended approval to amend the provisions of a 'B-5', to allow for additional Permitted Uses in a 'B-5' District. The property is part of a 'B-5' District Lowe's ord.6266, however, this petition is to modify Uses within the 'B-5' district, therefore, an amendment to this 'B-5' is required for this parcel as it affects Ord. 6266, attached.

### II. EXISTING SITE CONDITIONS:

The existing property at **3180 N. Highway 67** is a lot of 15 acres, including wetlands and has been vacant since the closing of the Lowe's.

- 38 The proposed amendment proposes to add those uses that are Permitted Uses without a
- 39 special use permit. The application is accompanied by Site maps and Preliminary Plan
- 40 EX1 dated 10/10/19 by Uhlig Architecture.

### III. **SURROUNDING PROPERTIES**:

- The adjacent property to the North is 3200 N. Highway 67 in a B-3 District. Properties to
- the West are 14070 New Halls Ferry in a B-3 District and 3160 N. Highway 67 in a B-5
- District. The adjacent property to the East is 3184 N highway 67 Lowe's Retention areas
- in a B-5 District. The properties to the South include 3175 Cross Keys in a B-3 District,
- 47 3205 and 3202 Cross Keys Dr. for Cross Keys Apartments in an R-6 Zoning District.

### IV. STAFF ANALYSIS:

The Petitioner has responded to staff instructions for a 'B-5' amendment. Staff comments are:

### 1. Site Comments:

- a. **Current Parking for the Ordinance 6266**: plans indicate 722 parking are required for Lowe's and Ord. 6266 for Lowes, 709 were approved in an amendment commensurate with the outlot for Dollar Tree.
- b. Parking ratios have changed. Service Centers over 100,000 s.f. are now required to have 2.85/1000 s.f. therefore, the Lowe's is now required to have 386 parking spaces.
- c. Landscape calculations: The amendment does not seek to address landscape changes; 2 trees, shumard oaks along the west boundary line were affected by an amendment commensurate with the outlot for Dollar Tree.

## I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This is a request for recommended approval of a special use permit to allow for the operation of a Auto Repair Shop at 1890 N Highway 67.

## **II. EXISTING SITE CONDITIONS:**

The existing property at 1890 N Hwy 67 has been vacant for several years. The proposal is for GMT, an existing business within the city of Florissant that proposes to locate some auto repair to this new location from 225 N Hwy 67. The site has multiple structures. 1900 formerly occupied by a food store, 1920 and 1930. The site is 100% paved.

The building which fronts on N Highway 67 has about 3312 s.f. at 1890 N Hwy 67 and has a separation wall between it including 1900 N Highway 67. The front facing (North) wall of the building is brick veneer. The West and South Facing walls are stucco plaster over masonry, painted. There is an overhead door facing west. An existing roofmounted sign exists that is within the sign area limits, but is partially wood constructed,

39 40 which is not permitted.

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There are 2 parking spaces in front of this tenant space. On the site there are 5 parking in front of 1900 N Highway 67, 6 spaces along the west adjacent to N Highway 67 and 6 spaces in front of the building fronting N Highway 67. There are approximately 23 total parking provided.

## IV. STAFF ANALYSIS:

The petitioner proposes razing the building to the foundation and rebuilding taller walls to allow for 10 foot overhead doors and new roof construction. The application does not state how many cars will be on-site or parked at any one time, therefore, parking regulations may apply for public use, or as requested and approved for private use.

A survey which shows existing structures and property lines was presented with the auto detailing business. Plans received are A-1 and A-2 dated 3/12/20 by Joe A Dale, NCARB Architect.

Other recommendations by staff regarding the proposed structure:

- 1. Building already has an oil/debris interceptor inside facility.
- 2. Proposed exterior walls are brick in front and 14'-4" brick returns on side walls. The balance of the proposed structure is split-faced concrete block (CMU). Per the masonry ordinance, exterior walls that are non-masonry may be proposed under a petition for a Special Use Permit.
- 3. Metal doors and wood structure with shingle roofing is proposed.


## **VI. STAFF RECOMENDATIONS:**








## NORTHWEST ELEVATION



AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FLORISSANT, MISSOURI, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE SUBMISSION OF A BALLOT PROPOSITION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY OF FLORISSANT, MISSOURI, TO CONSIDER IMPOSING A LOCAL USE TAX AT THE SAME RATE AS THE LOCAL SALES TAX OF THE CITY OF FLORISSANT, MISSOURI, FOR PURCHASES FROM OUT-OF-STATE VENDORS THAT EXCEED TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS

 **WHEREAS**, the City of Florissant, Missouri, believes a local use tax will help level the economic playing field between local retail merchants and out-of-state vendors, and that the revenue from such a tax will support the provision of critical municipal services and, therefore seeks to have the ballot proposition hereinafter referenced presented to qualified voters of the City at an election to be held on August 4, 2020.

## NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLORISSANT, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

## Section 1.

Pursuant to the requirements of Article X, Section 22 of the Missouri Constitution and in accordance with Section 144.757, RSMo., the following proposition shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Florissant at the election to be held on August 4, 2020, to wit:

## **PROPOSITION 1**

"Shall the City of FLORISSANT be authorized to impose a local use tax at the same rate as the local sales tax by a vote of the governing body, provided that if any local sales tax is repealed, reduced or raised by voter approval, the respective local use tax shall also be repealed, reduced or raised by the same action? A use tax return shall not be required to be filed by persons whose purchases from out-of-state vendors do not in total exceed two thousand dollars in any calendar year".

#### WHAT IS A USE TAX?

The local use tax is applied, in lieu of the local sales tax, on transactions that individuals and businesses conduct with out-of-state vendors, including catalog and direct market sales.

Sections 144.757.144.761 RSMo. authorizes any incorporation city, town or village to impose a local use tax.

### WHAT IS THE RATE AT WHICH A USE TAX WOULD BE APPLIED?

The city may impose a use tax only at the same rate as its city sales tax rate. If the city's sales tax rate is repealed, reduced or increased, by voter approval, then the city's use tax rate is similarly repealed, reduced or increased.

#### HOW IS THE USE TAX COLLECTED?

If the out-of-state vendor has a facility in Missouri, the vendor will collect the local use tax, along with the state use tax, and remit both to the Missouri Department of Revenue (DOR). If the out-of-state vendor does not have a facility in Missouri, the purchaser must file a use tax return with DOR but only if the individual or business has more than \$2,000 in such purchases during the calendar year.

### WHAT IS THE PROCESS FOR IMPOSING A LOCAL CIGARETTE TAX?

RSMo 149.192, passed in 1993, prohibits municipalities from enacting any new cigarette tax.

#### IS THERE A LOCAL OPTION GASOLINE TAX?

Yes. Article IV Section 30(a) #3 provides municipalities with the authority to impose a local option tax on gasoline. The tax requires a two-thirds majority voter approval. Mathews, Missouri is the only known municipality in the state to currently impose this tax.

### IS A VOTE OF THE PEOPLE ALWAYS NEEDED TO INCREASE REVENUES?

It depends. In 1980, the voters of Missouri approved the Hancock Amendment to the Missouri Constitution. One of the key elements of this amendment is that any new license, tax or fee must be approved of by a majority of the local voters prior to imposition. Prior to the passage of Hancock city councils had been able to increase key funding sources such as property tax levies without seeking voter approval. In the wake of Hancock it looked like even minor revenue sources such as bus fares or concession pricing was going to require going through the election process. Luckily, the Missouri Supreme Court in is landmark case Keller v. Marion County Ambulance District developed a five point test to determine if a revenue source is really tax needing voter approval or a user fee that can be increased without voter approval. Determining if a particular revenue source is a user fee or a tax is something requires consultation with the city attorney. Generally, user fees are thought to include items such as utility fees, swimming pool passes, building permits, or bus fares. Revenue sources that clearly require a vote of the people under the amendment includes property tax levies, and sales taxes.
