Home Composting

Why start a household compost heap? I can reel off a long list of reasons for keeping your food scraps and other household waste out of the trash can. Compost adds nutrients and organic matter back into the soil. Composing methane-prodiverts ducing organic materials from landfills, and improves soil water retention when put into soil, so you don't need to water as much.

You just want to make the food break down. You can compost vegetable and fruit peelings and cores, left-over greens and grains. But don't add meat, poultry, fish or their bones and byproducts. Don't put animal feces in the pile. Some people add dead leaves and

To start a compost heap, buy or make bins or buckets to contain your compost and mix with a little dirt. (Some people recommend adding lime to help it break down, but it's not required.) Mix it with a small shovel and cover the bucket. Do this each time until the bin or bucket is full. Then about one week later, mix it up again and bury it in the ground about four inches deep.

When I compost, I separate my leaves and grass clippings from my other organic waste. I pile and mix dirt on my yard waste, and turn it over every week. Then I put it on top of my garden.

More and more local governments are recognizing that food waste is the bulk of what goes to their landfills and they are starting to do something about it. With landfills filling up quickly everyone should have some kind of plan to help reduce the land fill waste.

The 20th annual Florissant Old Town Fall Festival will be held on Sunday October 8th as the biggest block party in the state blocking off St. Francois Street from Florissant Road to St. Ferdinand Shrine. The festival is sponsored by Florissant Old Town Partners, the City of Florissant and the Missouri and Regional Arts Council. This important cultural community family friendly togetherness event runs from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and will feature the Bob Kuban Brass with a wide variety of other musical and performing arts entertainment. There will be a mile of arts and crafts and delicious food and beverages highlighted by the Florissant Police Antique and Classic Car Show and the famous Chili tasting contest in front of Click's Heating and Cooling.

The fourth and final Food Truck Knight sponsored by the Knights of Columbus and the City will be held on Friday, October 13th on the Knight's grounds from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. The August event was packed so come early and bring a donation for TEAM. There will be barrels to collect non-perishable canned and dry food for the nearby TEAM food pantry and proceeds from the event will benefit Knight's sponsored charities including TEAM.

The 4th annual Race to the Shrine 5K run will be held on Saturday, October 21st at the Old St. Ferdinand Shrine grounds. The 1 mile Fun Run starts at 3:30 p.m. - 5k Race starts at 4:00 p.m. Whether you are a runner, walker or just enjoy being a spectator, families can gather to enjoy the beauty of the City of Florissant. Experience the Shrine of St. Ferdinand, the oldest standing church in the Louisiana Purchase territory. Enjoy some delicious BBQ by the Knights of Columbus, live music by local musicians, and have a wonderful day outside.

Street Work: - The Public Works Department has nearly completed \$3,350,000 in street work this year 2017 which includes \$931,000 in slurry seal resurfacing work on 130+ different streets throughout the City, \$565,000 in concrete pavement replacement and repairs on 34+ streets, and \$1,854,000 in major street repairs with an asphalt overlay on 15+ different streets. Major street repairs have begun with the completion of major repairs, new curbing and an asphalt overlay on Keeven Lane.

Thanks to the passage of Prop S in November 2015 Florissant has the street maintenance funds available to keep up with our 167 miles of streets and to establish a program of restoration. These funds were used this year to make improvements to 13 different streets plus major improvements to Keven Lane (completed) and St. Marie Street which will include all new curbs, gutters, and asphalt overly and other needed improvements.

St. Louis County continues to make progress on the Shackelford Road Improvements and have just begun making much needed improvements to Washington Street.

The Public Works Department has three grant projects in progress this year that are funded at 80 percent by a federal grants received in 2014 and 2015.

- Design work is nearing completion for the replacement of St. Anthony Lane Bridge over Fountain Creek a \$550,000 project which will be out for bids this fall.
- Design work and pre-construction work continues for the North Lafayette Reconstruction project which will include repaving the street, installing storm sewers, and adding ADA-compliant sidewalk and bicycle facilities from North Highway



67 to Washington Street with a total estimated budget of approximately \$2.7 million. Construction is scheduled for 2018.

• Design work and pre-construction work continues for the Replacement of the Pedestrian Signal on Derhake Rd. at Robinwood Elementary. This project will replace the aging signal and bring the crossing into compliance with ADA requirements. It has a budget of approximately \$140,000 and will be complete in 2018.

The City has partnered with MODOT and has been awarded another 80 percent federally funded reimbursement grant to make improvements to the intersection of St. Ferdinand St. and N. Highway 67 ... the main entrance to our St. Ferdinand Park ... primarily to ease congestion entering and exiting St. Ferdinand Park and to improve safety and pedestrian access. Currently, we are in the preliminary stages of design.

Economic Development projects continue to be strong and very active. Companies of all sizes that include National brands and Developers' are proving that they believe in the future of Florissant.

Some of the businesses and companies are:

- Total Urgent Care @ Lindbergh atSt. Jean has opened.
- First Collinsville Bank will soon open a new facility in the former Bloomer's Florist on New Halls Ferry.
- **Regions Bank** has told the City they are "ready to build" the new facility on Lindbergh near **Dierbergs**.
- Mc Allister's Deli has opened with "record breaking sales" in the former **Bob Evans** location.
- Raising Canes is under construction with an expected opening the late November.
- D'Vita Dialysis will open a new facility in the former Beauty Brands location in Cross Keys.
 U-HAUL has started construction
- on Lindbergh. Estimated opening, late 2017.
- POPEYE'S CHICKEN will be starting construction very soon.
 Smoothie King has recently
- opened on Lindbergh and reported they are #5 out of 900 stores in the United States.

There are other projects in the Due Diligence and Planning Phase including Emo's Pizza on Halls Ferry at Greenway Chase. We are working with Developers to help in the assembly of properties for future locations.

I hope to see you at the Fall Festival on October 8th on St. Francois Street!

Many local electronics stores offer surveillance systems for less than \$500. If the business owner prefers to leave it to the professionals it would be a good idea to get multiple bids on a system with similar specifications and make sure to check out the companies you are getting bids from with the North County Chamber of Commerce and the Better Business Bureau.

If we could get most of our businesses in the city to have state-of-the-art surveillance systems it could be a deterrent to would-be criminals that are thinking of doing criminal activity within the City of Florissant. 

The Florissant Police Department along with the Missouri Freemasons will be hosting a one day Missouri Child Identification Program (MoCHIP) during the Florissant Fall Festival on Sunday, October 8, 2017, 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM. The event will be held at the Florissant City Hall inside the Council Chambers.

This program, FREE OF CHARGE, provides parents with critical information on their children in the event their child turned up missing or abducted. This nationally recognized program provides parents with a digital photograph, digital fingerprints, DNA swab, child information and emergency contacts, a dental bite impression, and two (2) laminated ID cards.

Most importantly, all information is turned over to a parent or legal guardian on completion of the process. No child information is stored or kept by the MoCHIP program or the Florissant Police.


If you've been through the MoCHIP program and have had your child ID'd, bring the mini CD back and we'll update it for you. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) strongly urges parents to have the most up-to-date information, including pictures - so if you've had your 0-4 year old ID'd in the last 6 months, it's time to do it again. It is recommended to have children ages 5-10 ID'd once a year, and when children 10 and over enter puberty you should consider having them ID'd every 6-12 months, as their features and bodies are changing drastically. Often overlooked are older teens and young adults who are actually most at risk – please urge your 14 - 21 year olds to get ID'd. It typically takes only 10-15 minutes.

As a result of the efforts by the Missouri Freemason through the MoCHIP program, parents/legal guardians of over 125,000 have received this critical identification information free of charge.

Make sure you mark your calendars for this event and keep your eyes open as the date approaches for more information.



Here's Your Retirement Countdown

If you want to enjoy a comfortable retirement lifestyle, you don't need to have been born rich or even to have earned scads of money during your working years. But you do need to make the right moves at the right time — which means you might want to start a "retirement countdown" well before you draw your final paycheck.

What might such a countdown look like? *Here are a few ideas:*

Ten years before retirement – At this stage of your career, you might be at, or at least near, your peak earning capacity. At the same time, your kids may have grown and left the home, and you might even have paid off your mortgage. All these factors, taken together, may mean that you can afford to "max out" on your IRA and your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan. And that's exactly what you should do, if you can, because these retirement accounts offer tax benefits and the opportunity to spread your dollars around a variety of investments.

Five years before retirement – Review your Social Security statement to see how much you can expect to receive each month at various ages. You can typically start collecting benefits as early as 62, but your monthly checks will be significantly larger if you wait until your "full" retirement age, which will likely be 66 (and a few months) or 67. Your payments will be bigger still if you can afford to wait until 70, at which point your benefits reach their ceiling. In any case, you'll need to weigh several factors - your health, your family history of longevity, your other sources of retirement income - before deciding on when to start taking Social Security.

One to three years before retirement – To help increase your income stream during retirement, you may want to convert some – but likely not all – of your growthoriented investments, such as stocks and stock-based vehicles, into income-producing ones, such as bonds. Keep in mind, though, that even during your retirement years, you'll still likely need your portfolio to provide you with some growth potential

to help keep you ahead of inflation.

One year before retirement – Evaluate your retirement income and expenses. It's particularly important that you assess your health-care costs. Depending on your age at retirement, you may be eligible for Medicare, but you will likely need to pay for some supplemental coverage as well, so you will need to budget for this.

Also, as you get closer to your actual retirement date, you will need to determine an appropriate withdrawal rate for your investments. How much should you take each year from your IRA, 401(k) and other retirement accounts? The answer depends on many factors: the size of these accounts, your retirement lifestyle, your projected longevity, whether you've started taking Social Security, whether your spouse is still working, and so on. A financial professional can help you determine an appropriate withdrawal rate.

These aren't the only steps you need to take before retirement, nor do they need to be taken in the precise order described above. But they can be useful as guidelines for a retirement countdown that can help ease your transition to the next phase of your life.



Fall Tips for Pets



Here come the changing seasons again. Crisp, cool air, luscious foliage and a welcome break from summer's hot sticky weather. As much as we enjoy it, there are lurking dangers for our furry family members as well.

Here are some tips to keep your pets happy and healthy during the autumn months.

• Be cautious of Rodenticides and **Cold Weather Poisons**

Rat and mouse poisons are used more in the winter to keep the rodents from attempting to move indoors. Rodenticides are highly toxic to pets and can be fatal if ingested. If you use these products, please do so with caution and put them in a location inaccessible to your pets.

In the fall when you are changing your car's engine coolant, the ethylene glycol based coolants are highly toxic so please make sure spills are cleaned up immediately and keep away from pets. Propylene glycol based coolants aren't completely nontoxic but much less than other engine coolants

School Supplies

We all know back to school time and time to stock up on school supplies. Most school supplies

(glue sticks, pencils, magic markers) are low toxicity to pets but can cause gastrointestinal upset and blockages can occur if ingested. Please keep school supplies out of reach of all pets

Mushrooms

Fall and spring are mushroom seasons. While 99% of mushrooms have little or no toxicity the 1% that are highly toxic can cause lifethreatening problems in pets. Since it is difficult to distinguish from nontoxic ones, the best way to prevent pets from ingesting these poisonous plants is to keep animals away from areas where mushrooms grow. Contact your vet or ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center at (888) 426-4435 immediately if you witness your pet eating a wild mushroom

Also, please remember ALL dogs and cats need to be registered with the City of Florissant Animal Control. The pet license is free to residents and can be obtained at the Florissant Health Department #1 Saint Ferdinand Park Dr. Florissant, MO 63031 by bringing in a valid proof of rabies shot from a licensed vet. Please call (314) 839-7654 with any questions.


