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COUNCIL MINUTES

February 22, 2021

Due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic, the Florissant City Council met in a virtual meeting through a Zoom platform on Monday, February 22, 2021 at 7:30 p.m. with Council President Schildroth presiding. The Chair asked everyone in attendance to stand and join in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

On Roll Call the following Councilmembers were present: Eagan, Caputa, Schildroth, Mulcahy, Pagano, Parson, Siam, Harris, and Manganelli. Also present was Mayor Timothy Lowery, City Clerk Karen Goodwin, and City Attorney John Hessel. A quorum being present the Chair stated that the Council Meeting was in session for the transaction of business.

The City Attorney explained that the meeting was being conducted remotely because of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic emergency. He stated that under the Sunshine Law, Section 610.015, when an emergency existed, the members of the City Council who are not physically present in the Council Chambers, can participate and vote remotely on all matters.

Councilman Siam moved to approve the City Council Minutes of February 8, 2021, seconded by Parson. Motion carried.

The next item on the Agenda was Certificate of Appreciation.

A Certificate of Appreciation was presented to Linda Rose, President of the Parks and Recreation Commission, to thank her for all the hard work she has done for the City of Florissant and the Parks and Recreation Commission and as the president of the commission. City Clerk read a letter from Mrs. Rose to the Council and Mayor.

The next item on the Agenda was Proclamations.

February 22nd, 2021 was proclaimed as Supermarket Employee Day to honor and thank Supermarket Employees for their hard work during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Ray Donohue, Florissant Schnucks, thanked Mayor Lowery and the City Council for the Proclamation. Kerry Shadley, Shackleford Schnucks, thanked everyone for inviting him and the honor of the proclamation.

32	Councilman Schildroth thanked the supermarket workers who live in the City of Florissant.
33	Councilman Caputa thanked the workers for their work during the pandemic and encouraged
34	residents to thank the employees.
35	Councilman Harris echoed his appreciation for the employees of supermarkets.
36	The next item on the Agenda was Hearing from Citizens
37	Marvin Tobias, 1826 Woodridge Ln, asked the Council to post a link to the City Budget in full
38	for government transparency to show why certain budget line items were increased.
39	Robert Smith, 2823 Chapel View, echoed Mr. Tobias' request for reports as well stating the last
40	monthly report was posted for October 2020.
41	The next item on the Agenda was Communications of which there were none.
42	The next item on the Agenda was Public Hearings
43	The City Clerk reported that Public Hearing 21-02-004 for the request to approve a Special Use
44	Permit to allow for a Carry-Out Restaurant located at 2170 N. Waterford. The Chair declared the Public
45	Hearing to be open.
46	Kayla Bailey, owner, wants to bring franchise the Nephew's restaurant in the area as it is a well-
47	known franchise for the area. She stated the hours are 10 am to 9 pm, with a minimum number of
48	employees since there will be no indoor seating and no alcohol will be served on the premise. Ms. Bailey
49	stated this is her first time working in a franchise however, her family has owned their own small
50	restaurants.
51	Being no further comments, Councilman Siam moved to close the Public Hearing, seconded by
52	Caputa. Motion carried.
53	The City Clerk reported that Public Hearing 21-02-005 for the request to amend Special Use
54	Ordinance no. 8376 to allow for adding a nightclub use with live performances and a cover charge located
55	at 1752-1756 N. New Florissant. The Chair declared the Public Hearing to be open.
56	Maurice Rankin, wanted to amend the special use permit to allow for a cover charge during the
57	band and comedy show nights. Mr. Rankin stated they are currently paying out of pocket for the
58	entertainment. He informed the City Council the cover charge would be \$5; the band comes once a week
59	on Wednesday nights and comedy shows take place once every month or every other month. Mr. Rankin
60	stated the business currently follows the St. Louis County Department of Health guidelines for masks,
61	capacity, and sanitizing. Shade Restaurant are currently working from 12pm to 11pm, but will want his

hours during the weekend to change depending on the pandemic. Mr. Ranking states two-man security,

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who are licensed, bonded and unarmed, is on the premises each night at this time and the number of officers will increase when the capacity restrictions end.

Councilman Harris stated he believes have an entertainment aspect to a restaurant/bar is a great addition to the area especially with a comedy show.

Councilman Eagan stated his concern with a nightclub use explaining that crime on Main Street in the City of St. Charles has increased around the nightclubs and asked Chief Fagan to give his opinion on the nightclub use. Eagan wished Mr. Rankin success as a restaurant but repeated his concern with the nightclub use.

Chief Fagan stated the Police Department's concern with the nightclub use based on negative experience with these uses. He informed everyone the City of St. Charles is now having difficulty trying to help fix the situation on Main Street. The Chief informed the City Council that in the 11 months that Club Envy was previously open, the Police Department saw 7 counts of assault two of which being Assault 1 and two calls involving unlawful use of a weapon concerns. Chief Fagan made note the concern has nothing to do with Mr. Rankin and his business however, the nightclub use is a concern rather than a comedy club use.

Councilwoman Pagano confirmed with Attorney Hessel that the Special Use Permit with the nightclub use would transfer if a new business were to take over the current location for Shade Restaurant.

Phil Lum, Building Commissioner, stated the Council could specify the nightclub use to specific nights and make the use secondary to the restaurant/bar use.

Being no further comments, Councilman Siam moved to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Harris. Motion carried.

The Chair stated that the next item on the agenda was Second Readings.

Councilwoman Pagano moved that Bill No. 9656 an Ordinance of the City of Florissant, Missouri, amending Title II "Public Health, Safety and Welfare", Chapter 210 "Offenses", Chapter 213 "Nuisances", Article II "Weeds", by adding a new Section 213-075 "Invasive Non-Native, Exotic Plant Species Declared a Public Nuisance" be read for a second time, seconded by Caputa. Motion carried and Bill No. 9656 was read for a second time. Councilwoman Pagano moved that Bill No. 9656 be read for a third time, seconded by Mulcahy. Motion carried and Bill No. 9656 was read for a third and final time and placed upon its passage. Robert Smith, 2823 Chapel View, questioned who would be responsible for informing and fining residents with the listed plant species. Phil Lum, Building Commissioner, stated the Health Department would be in charge of identifying and notifying residents.

Robert Smith, 2823 Chapel View, wanted verification of the total amount being \$89,000 for the Splash Pad. Cheryl Thompson, Parks Director, stated the project had three change orders during the project along with the playground equipment cost had increased. Marvin Tobias, 1826 Woodridge Ln, questioned how many part-time employees would be employed with the reduction in the budget. Cheryl Thompson stated the seasonal employee number dropped from ten to six seasonal employees on the updated budget.

Being no persons wishing to speak, on roll call the Council voted: Eagan yes, Caputa yes, Schildroth yes, Mulcahy yes, Pagano yes, Parson yes, Siam yes, Harris yes, and Manganelli yes.

Whereupon the Chair declared Bill No. 9664 to have passed and said Bill became Ordinance No.

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156 Councilman Schildroth introduced Bill No. 9665 an Ordinance authorizing an amendment to ordinance no. 8586, Establishing a compensation plan for Part-Time employees by adding the position 158 of "Senior Citizen Specialist" and said Bill was read for the first time by title only.

The next item on the Agenda was Council Announcements.

Councilman Harris congratulated retiring officers Busby, Conan, and Lt. Peters and the police department has posted hiring opportunities. He stated Human Resources and the Parks Department are all posting hiring positions recently. Harris informed residents that the Florissant Spotlight has information about Nerf Wars at the JJE ice rink.

Council Eagan reminded everyone of the TEAM food pantry donations. He stated Ward 3 resident, Ashley Pedibone, is a 15-year-old now holds the National Record for Bench-press at 127 lbs.

Councilman Caputa reminded residents to lock up firearms in a secure place and not in their vehicle and watch out for their neighbors through Neighborhood Watch Program.

Councilman Schildroth reminded resident of the work on Dunn Rd and the westbound 270 exit to New Florissant Rd which will close permanently starting March 1, 2021. He thanked the street department for their hard work during the weather

Councilwoman Pagano reminded residents of the major changes on the eastbound lanes of Dunn Rd due to construction through MoDOT and more information is available on MoDOT's website.

Councilman Parson recognized Pauli Murray for Black History Month noting her trailblazing for during the Civil Rights Movement and was arrested for sitting in the "Whites Only" section of the bus 15 years before Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat. Ms. Murray was a lawyer, women's rights activist, episcopal priest, and an author.

Councilman Siam encouraged people to use masks in public, social distancing, hand sanitizer and regular handwashing. He reminded residents to pre-register for the vaccine online through St. Louis County and local hospitals.

The next item was Mayor Announcements.

Mayor Lowery announced the city's website is updated and thanked Steve Weirsmueller and Chris Pease for their hard work on the city website. He stated the groundbreaking and check presentation for Angie's Playground was cancelled due to the weather and has been rescheduled for Tuesday, March 18 at 2pm.

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WORK SESSION MEETING MINUTES

February 2, 2021

Due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic, the Florissant City Council met in a virtual work session through a Zoom platform on Tuesday, February 2nd, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. with Council President Schildroth presiding.

On Roll Call the following Councilmembers were present: Caputa, Schildroth, Mulcahy, Pagano, Parson, Siam, Harris, Manganelli, and Eagan. Also present was Mayor Timothy Lowery, City Clerk Karen Goodwin, and City Attorney John Hessel. A quorum being present the Chair stated that the Council Meeting was in session for the transaction of business.

Council President Schildroth moved to amend the agenda to move the discussion of the Weise house to first on the agenda, seconded by Pagano, motion carried.

Cheryl Thompson-Stimage, Parks and Recreation Director described some of the work that had been done in the past on the Weise House.

Gina Siebe discussed the work that she and several volunteers were currently doing in the Weise House to include, removing mold on the walls, ceiling and the woodwork, removing brick in damaged areas, cleaning window wells, and dealing with water damage. She said that the water drainage has been located and mitigated for the moment. She added that there are many volunteers and donations from the community. She stated that there are two HVAC companies that would be donating an HVAC system and installing it at no cost.

Council asked Mrs. Thompson-Stimage and Mr. Green to put together the total cost of what the city needs to contribute to get the building to a functional state to include the roof, restrooms and possible kitchen configurations.

Council Procedures

Council President Schildroth stated that in the past there was an understanding with the Council members that they would not attend boards and commissions meetings. He feels that the boards and

commissions recommend actions to the council and council members can be intimidating to board and commission members, even if they are just there to observe. He recommended to the councilmembers that they refrain from attending boards and commissions meetings.

Council members discussed their opinions on whether or not to attend boards and commission meetings.

Transfers of Special Use Permits

Mr. Hessel explained the Special Use transfer process, he stated that most cities do not bring transfers of special use permits to the city council, they are approved at the staff level.

Councilman Manganelli asked if the transfers of special use permits could be eliminated completely and all applicants required to go through the process of getting a special use from the beginning. Mr. Hessel answered no. The special use is granted for a particular location and business owners need to be allowed to sell their business with the use that was approved. Additional restrictions can be placed on a transfer of a special use if there are issues that need to be addressed.

Air BnB regulations

Mr. Hessel explained that he has researched the Air B and B issues. He feels that if there are regulations proposed, they should be included in the residential rental license sections of the code. Mr. Hessel mentioned a company they were meeting with that monitors the locations of Air BnB's for a fee. He said he would report any information he obtained to the Mayor. Mr. Hessel suggested that the public works department needs to provide an opinion on where in the code they would like to see this and how it would be monitored and enforced. It was mentioned that Black Jack had an ordinance that could be reviewed.

Masonry Ordinance

Council discussed the potential for updating the masonry ordinance to allow newer materials that have been introduced. Council is willing to look at the possibility of allowing additional materials but does not want to lower the quality and appearance of new construction.

There being no further business to discuss, Councilman Caputa moved to adjourn the work session, seconded by Eagan, on voice vote the motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 9:15 pm.

To the Mayor and City Council, Thank you for your time in reading this letter,

I am writing to support Shade Restaurant and Bar's special use permit to be allowed to charge a cover fee on special event nights. The major reasons I support the special use are (in no particular order): (1) There is an added burden on the business and law enforcement, fire personnel and the city office to apply for, investigate and pay for a license each time an event is held. It is an anti-business model. (2) The restaurant already provides the services and is essentially changing a business model to improve the bottom line. That makes it primarily a business decision that is only hindered because of the limitations within the Florissant ordinances themselves. With so many restaurant/bar/lounge type places hurting with COVID, if an owner can find a way to increase revenue without changing or taxing the city's resources, I believe that it should be supported. (3) Shade is providing entertainment that is not found anywhere else in the city. Pre-COVID, multiple lounges, bars, taverns, pubs, etc have offered music, whether live or dj, and food, but comedy nights are relatively rare in this area. There is a demand for it and if a cover charge helps the business to continue those services, I do not see a reason it should be limited or declined.

In response to the petition, it seemed that the two biggest issues were "look at St. Charles" and comparisons to other non-similar businesses. It did seem that opposition centered around the term "night" club versus what the business is actually providing. It is true that St. Charles provides an example of both positives and negatives. A historic district with 20+ restaurants, antique shops, boutiques but also bars of varying types. Dive bars, lounges, some with open mic nights and some providing drinks and dancing as primary forms of entertainment. The negative, is when you have thousands descending to an area with so many restaurants and bars in such proximity, there can be chaos. The conversations are good to have when talking about planning and zoning and permits being issued. Florissant is fundamentally different, in that bars, taverns, clubs etc, must be issued a special use permit to operate. The council controls the oversaturation of bars and restaurants in an area. While Shade is near Show Me's and Meyer's café and lounge, I believe they serve different customers in an area not saturated with bars and restaurants. In Florissant's historic district, Bunkers is within walking distance to Red Oven Pizza or Sip and Smoke, but again, that isn't a saturation point. There are no dance clubs, so that is removed from the equation. Joe Momma's, Holeshotz, Toast Time, Coltrane's, Henke's, Al's Lounge, BJ's Bar, Privilege Lounge, Field Box North (Hall Pass), Streiler's, Jerry's lounge are a scattering of bars and watering holes in Florissant, Pre-COVID. Plus you have the restaurants with full bars. The biggest difference here is that they are scattered throughout Florissant. Zoning and the requirement of special use permits for any bar or tavern (only in B3, B4, or HB I believe) is a buffer that reduces the chances of concentrated people and alcohol. I would also add that Shade is ALREADY operating, so if there was a concern regarding oversaturation it was a conversation to have pre-opening, not when they want to simply charge a cover. (St. Charles was in the news in 2019 regarding business changes to reduce the number of bars, which is before Shade's approval).

The most embarrassing part of the discussion centered around comparing Shade to other businesses. It bothered me that once the term nightclub was "defined" (as the term itself is already in Florissant's code book) associations to NON similar businesses who only share a common ethnic consumer base were made. Club Envy for example. That was a dance club. Shade has never attempted to be such. Cuetopia was mentioned. That was a pool bar. Shade is not a pool bar. The Ambassador is a concert venue and event space. Shade is neither a concert venue nor event space. I thought it a remarkably bad faith argument to associate three different types of businesses with Shade and force them to bear the weight of transgressions that are not of their making. It is a standard that I have never seen applied at any city council meeting EVEN when you have had actual event centers in front of you to be approved. Streiler's pub has had bands before. If they wanted to charge a cover, would you have compared them to a dance club or event center? Or would you compare them to a similar business?

I know this letter was long. I thank those who have read it to its conclusion. I do hope the council and Mayor work with the owners and come up with a plan that can benefit them and the city.
