- Los Niños Kids Corner Several activities will be available for kids including piñatas, Mexican paper flowers and other fun crafts and games.
- Car show and Lowrider Bicycle Show The Hispanic Festival is happy to host a car show and bicycle show on Saturday, June 25 by Dedicated Car Club and a car meet up on Sunday, June 26 by Latin Adrenaline Car Club. Various cars are welcome including lowrider cars. Lowriders are a car culture started by the Mexican community in Los Angeles.
- "La Villita" Artist Village The St. Louis Art Museum sponsors Hispanic artists to showcase and sell their art and offer free art activities.
- Information booths Several cultural organizations and businesses will acquaint the public with their programs and services.

One of the Fair's purposes is to celebrate the common heritage of Hispanic nations particularly because of the rise of the Hispanic population in North County. The funds raised are used to fund scholarships distributed to college-bound students and underprivileged children.
