



15th Annual "Old Town Fall Festival"

Sunday, October 14th 11:00am to 5:00pm

The 15th Annual Florissant Old Town Fall Festival is set for Sunday October 14th, 2012. Once again the Florissant Old Town Partners has teamed up with the City of Florissant, the Missouri Arts Council and the Regional Arts Commission to co-sponsor the festival on rue St. Francois on Sunday October 14th. In the past few years over 35,000 visitors attended the weekend events and we expect this to be the biggest and best ever!

The Old Town Fall Festival kicks off at 11 am on Sunday October 14th and runs until 5pm on rue St. Francois Street in the heart of Old Town Florissant. This event covers eleven full blocks from Florissant Road down to the St. Ferdinand Shrine. All side streets will be blocked off to accommodate the festival. The street will be filled with activities for everyone with over 150 booths including games to play, sale items, food and beverages. We will have the old favorites like the Chili Cook-off, the wine garden, pumpkin decorating, silent auction, Kincaid Puppets, jewelry making and entertainment on almost every block.

Everyone's Favorite event the Fido Follies returns and for the past few years has been located at the Government Center at 1055 rue St. Francois at the very top of the street, as always water bowls will be provide on every block so you can bring your dogs (properly licensed and leashed of course) and enter them in to the dog show, we have categories such as smallest dog, best kisser, best costume, best trick and largest dog to name a few.

Once again, if you are looking for the Children's Art Festival sponsored by St. Louis Community College at Florissant Valley it will be up at the top of St.

Francois on the City Hall lawn. This event continues to grow with exhibits by artists, art activities and demonstrations through out the day. This year the children's corner returns with free activities including chalking, painting and collage. The Northern Arts Council and the Women's Caucus for Art will also showcase work by local artists. KCFV from Florissant Valley will be broadcasting live from the festival throughout the day.

The Police Department in conjunction with MOCHIPS, will be offering child identification kits free of charge. They



will be set up in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

This year we have a very special addition to our Fall Festival. The Police Welfare Association will be hosting a Car Show on the Knights of Columbus Grounds on the day of the Festival. All proceeds from this event will be donated to Officer Mike Vernon, who was recently injured in the line of duty, to help with his care and recovery.

The Craft Fair continues to grow each year!!! More than 60 crafters show off their talents with their hand crafted works for you to browse... the holidays are right around the corner...why not start your shopping a little early!!

This year we have a special treat; on the Lawyers Building lot in the 100 block of St. Francois on the band shell the Florissant Fine Arts Council with support from the Missouri Arts Council and Regional Arts Commission will present "Bob Kuban Brass". Performances will be at 1:00 and 3:00 p.m.

We also have many entertainers throughout the 11 blocks of fun to include the Dixie Rhythm Kings, Cookie the Clown, Dan Sproat, Pat and Anna Auberry, Carol Brady our Story Teller, North County Big Band, Dennis Schilligo, Seven Weeks After, Spent, The Buckhannon Brothers, Bryson Gerard and more...

Since our Festival has grown so much over the past 14 years we will again be providing a shuttle on St. Catherine for those Festival patrons who have difficulty navigating the St. Francois hill. The Flert bus will be transporting festival patrons from block to block on St. Catherine which is one street over from St. Francois. There will be signs directing you to the stops.

Chief William Karabas Announces Plans to Retire

Chief William Karabas has announced his retirement effective December 31, 2012. The Chief informed the Mayor of his decision in March but requested that the announcement be delayed until August 1. The Mayor would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the Chief for his outstanding career not only for his contributions to the safety of the City of Florissant but also to the success of law enforcement in the entire St. Louis Metropolitan community.

Chief Karabas has been in a police uniform for 52 years. Prior to his eleven years with Florissant he was the police chief of the City of Brentwood, Cool Valley and UMSL. He has served as Vice-Chairman of the Greater St. Louis Major Case Squad, committee member of LEPAC and a life member of the International

Association of Chiefs of Police, Missouri Police Chiefs Association and the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Academy.

Chief Karabas leaves us with two important career legacies. He is credited with bringing the first Drug Awareness and Resistance Education D.A.R.E. program to the State of Missouri which has created a great sense of cooperation between children and police officers to combat the scourge of illegal drugs, underage drinking and smoking as well as reduce the violence in youth conflict resolution. Chief Karabas was given the first ever St. Louis County Municipal League MUNI award for Public Safety last May for his vision and leadership to create the St. Louis County Emergency Management System.

Chief Karabas is Chairman of the St. Louis County Emergency Communications Management Commission which oversees the development of the system that was approved by the voters with the passage of a county wide bond issue two years ago. The need for systems like this became evident on September 11, 2001 after the terrorist attacks and William Karabas made sure that the dialogue resulted in a project. This system will become operational in 2014 and will enable coordinated radio communication between all first responders.

On behalf of the City Council and the Citizens of Florissant, Mayor Schneider would like to express our gratitude for a job well done and wish Chief Karabas continued good health and happiness in his well deserved retirement.

Ron Veach, Parks & Recreation Director Announces Retirement

Ron Veach, the Director of Parks and Recreation, has announced his retirement effective December 31, 2012. The Mayor would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Ron Veach for his dedication and his contributions to the City of Florissant in making our city parks what they are today.

Ron has over 50 years of parks and recreation experience which began when he was 12 years old in the Kansas City area. He knew then that this was a career he wanted to pursue. He graduated in 1969 from Central Missouri State with a B.S. in Recreation. He completed an internship with the St. Louis County Parks and Recreation department before being named Maryville's first Director of Parks and Recreation in 1970. In 1973 he left Maryville to become the Director of Parks and Recreation for the City of Florissant.

He has served on the MO Parks and Recreation Association, the Nominations and Bylaws Committee for the National Parks and Recreation Association, he was elected President of the Municipal Section twice and has served on the Nomination Committee for the MO Municipal League. In 1984 he was awarded the Outstanding Service Award from the MO Parks and Recreation Association. Ron has been the longest serving Director of a large park and recreation setting in the Metropolitan area.

He played a key role in the design and completion of the Nature Lodge at Sunset Park which all started from an idea he had in the early 70s. He was instrumental in the enlarging and improving both the JFK and JJE centers, enlarging and improving the swim facilities at Koch Park and Bangert Park, expanding the number of lighted ball fields and having the

wire installed underground for lightning protection. He helped to secure \$400,000 for playground upgrades in 2002, obtain the F101 Voodoo Jet from Victoria Falls, TX, install a roof over the ice rink for winter and summer activities, establish five miles of asphalt trails, create a premier lighted soccer facility at Florissant Valley Park, build seven new pavilions with electricity, acquire the bandwagon for department and city activities, renovate St. Ferdinand Lake and established the first dog park in north St. Louis County.

On behalf of the City Council and the Citizens of Florissant, Mayor Schneider would like to express our gratitude for a job well done and wish Ron Veach continued good health and happiness in his well deserved retirement.

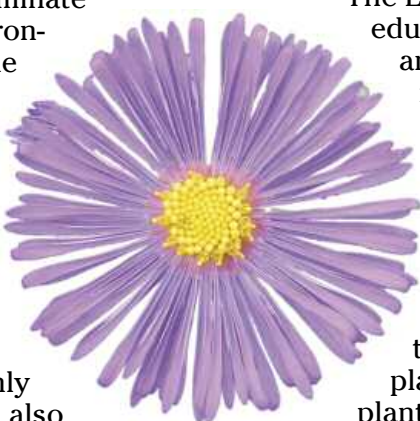


Bringing Back the Flowers to Florissant

In keeping with duties given to the Environmental Quality Commission by the City of Florissant to develop green areas within the city and disseminate educational information about the environment, the EQC is proud to announce the beginning of a new green Prairie Planting project. This project initiated and supported by Mayor Schneider, will begin soon in the back section of Koch Park near the archery range. We hope City residents will participate in the Fall Festival on Sunday, October 14, 2012, to learn more about how they can get involved.

The Prairie Planting project will not only provide a beautiful landscape, but will also attract butterflies and birds and reduce costs of park maintenance. Eventually, the EQC and the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board hope to work with City departments in developing other green areas around Florissant. Prairie planting is not an overnight phenomenon. It has a multi-year timeline with precise processes such as ground preparation, seed collection, seed sowing, and ground mowing for the first couple years. These processes will begin soon.

This project also entails some "hands on" volunteer work. This will be a collaboration with the Parks/Recreation Maintenance departments, the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board, with input from



Gardeners of Florissant, the EQC, Mayor Schneider, and, of course, the citizens of Florissant.

The EQC plans to develop an environmental education program around this project and others that help reduce our carbon footprint. Because timeline for the Prairie Planting project consists of years, not days, it will be a work in progress for two to three years. During that time it will allow our school students, scout troops, and citizens interested in developing green areas to monitor the progress of the project and learn more about native plants and prairie gardens. This type of planting may appeal especially to those homeowners who want to beautify their surroundings with a minimum of follow-up maintenance.

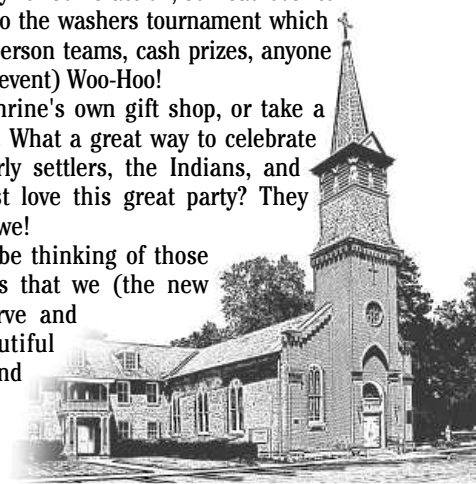

Congratulations to our very own Florissant Fish Swim Team who completed in their 10th season finishing undefeated for the second year in a row. I was able to attend several events and was amazed at the large number of parents, grandparents, brothers and sisters and friends that attended each competition despite the hot weather. This year's team comprised of 175 swimmers and 6 coaches. The swim program is designed to accommodate a wide range of physical talent and balances between competition, participation, family values and good old fashion fun.

I would also like to add that Ron Veach has announced his retirement as Director of Parks and Recreation after over fifty years in the parks and recreation field. Todd Schmidt who is currently the Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation has been named as Ron's replacement. We thank Ron for all that he has done and we would like to wish him the very best in his retirement.

As per a related article in this focus CNN Money a service of CNN Fortune and Money has ranked the City of Florissant in their top 100 best places to live, something we in the beautiful city already knew!

On September 15 MERS Goodwill joined the City of Florissant to host our second electronic recycling and household goods drive for our residents to safely and greenly dispose of computer, TV, stereo and other electronic components as well as reusable household goods. Thanks to all who participated.

The Public Works has again had and continues to have a very busy year. Counting to-date we have bid out over 32 separate projects totaling over \$3,148,000. Several of these projects are street and bridge repair projects totaling over \$1,320,000. Other projects include the Sidewalk Repair/Replacement project, street lighting projects, HVAC projects for City Hall, JFK Community Center, the Government Building, Koch Aquatic Center, and Police Headquarters ... new filters and pumps for our Aquatic Center ... energy conservation lighting projects at JJE Center ... a fencing project at Park Maintenance ... a Soccer Irrigation System at JJE ... Tower Park Remodeling project ... annual HVAC and Sewer Lateral maintenance projects ... testing of electrical equipment in our major City buildings ... and repair of parking lots and driveways in 8 of our City parks. We are also coordinating over \$8,000,000 in MSD sewer projects in the City. The City Council has passed more stringent ordinances for rental properties which have also increased inspections and enforcement in this particular area.

The Health Department continues to monitor mosquito inquiries in the City and continues to do mosquito fogging as weather permits.

Economic development in the City of Florissant continues to flourish. The Value City building is a \$10 million project. There will be 5 new national tenants and 2 relocations. The stores are expected to open at the end of the year.

The stores are Ashley Furniture, Ulta Spa & Cosmetics, Five Below, the two stores that are relocating are Michaels and Petco. Panda Express and Chipotle will open in the building on the front of the site.

The new Firestone Tire & Service Center has been open for a couple of months now on Lindbergh in a \$4 million a new prototype building which is one of the first of its kind.

Quik Trip has opened a \$4.5 million facility on the corner of Lindbergh and Thunderbird. The above mentioned projects created hundreds of construction jobs.

A complete remodeling was done to the interior of the former Brewskee's in preparation for the new Hot Shots Sports Bar



and Restaurant which opened last August. The Cornerstone Bakery is located in Surrey Plaza One owned and operated by 20 year old Pastry Chef Tisa Johnson.

A preferred developer has been named to demolish and redevelop the Plaza Madrid site at New Halls Ferry and Parker breaking ground next spring. 5th Third Bank will start construction next to Dierbergs next spring also after obtaining final banking regulatory approval. The former Lindbergh Sonic will be replaced by a new Eye Surgery Center. The old firehouse on St. Catherine will be the new home of an engineering company.

The City Council and Administration has placed a priority on commercial and residential property maintenance and have taken legislative and funding steps to enforce our housing codes. We have added personnel and equipment to bolster our property inspection capabilities in an effort to identify and eliminate problem property situations. Most of our residents are responsible homeowners but like any community we do have some who need to be compelled to take action. Please call City Hall at 921-5700 if you have any questions or problem properties to report. Our Community Development Office has resources to help qualified low income homeowners maintain their residential property. 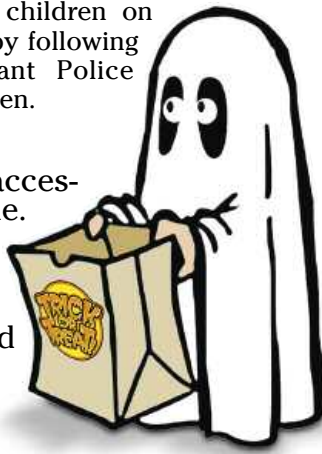

Falls are a leading cause of injuries among children on Halloween. Parents can help prevent these injuries by following the tips below. The employees of the Florissant Police Department wish everyone a safe and happy Halloween.



- S** - Swords, knives, or similar costume accessories should be short, soft and flexible.
- A** - Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.
- F** - Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see you.
- E** - Examine treats for choking hazards and tampering before eating them. Limit the amount of treats you eat.
- H** - Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and be seen. Always WALK, don't run from house to house.
- A** - Always test make-up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent possible skin and eye irritation.
- L** - Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible.
- L** - Lower your risk for serious eye injury by not wearing decorative contact lenses.
- O** - Only walk on sidewalks whenever possible, or on the far edge of the road facing traffic to stay safe.
- W** - Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.
- E** - Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating homemade treats made by strangers.
- E** - Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult.

Florissant Police Department Purchases Two Speed Shield Display Units

The Florissant Police Department recently purchased two Speed Shield Radar Display units in a continued effort to combat speeding within our neighborhoods. Like the two radar trailers that the police department has, these units have a built in radar unit which displays the speed of vehicles driving towards them.

The Speed Shield units also record the traffic data for the street, and the officers within the Traffic Unit can use the data to pinpoint when the violations are occurring. The Traffic Officers will then use this data try to be in the neighborhoods at those times to catch the violators. The signs also have a built in feature that flashes a white strobe light at vehicles going over a predetermined speed. These display units can be attached to a preexisting street sign.

Safeguard Your Children Get them ID'd with MoCHIP! IT'S FREE!

The Florissant Police Department along with the Missouri Freemasons will be hosting a one day Missouri Child Identification Program (MoCHIP) during the Florissant Fall Festival on Sunday, October 14, 2012, 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM. The event will be held at the Florissant City Hall inside the Council Chambers.

This program, FREE OF CHARGE, provides parents with critical information on their children in the event their child turned up missing or abducted. This nationally recognized program provides parents with a digital photograph, digital fingerprints, DNA swab, child information and emergency contacts, a dental bite impression, and two (2) laminated ID cards. Most importantly, all informa-



tion is turned over to a parent or legal guardian on completion of the process. No child information is

stored or kept by the MoCHIP program or the Florissant Police.

If you've been through the MoCHIP program and have had your child ID'd, bring the mini CD back and we'll update it for you. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) strongly urges parents to have the most up-to-date information, including pictures – so if you've had your 0-4 year old ID'd in the last 6 months, it's time to do it again. It is recommended to have children ages 5-10 ID'd once a year, and when children 10 and over enter puberty you should consider having them ID'd every 6-12 months, as their features and bodies are changing drastically. Often overlooked are older teens and young adults who are actually most at

risk – please urge your 14 - 21 year olds to get ID'd. It typically takes only 10-15 minutes.

As a result of the efforts by the Missouri Freemason through the MoCHIP program, parents/legal guardians of over 125,000 have received this critical identification information free of charge.

Make sure you mark your calendars for this event and keep your eyes open as the date approaches for more information.

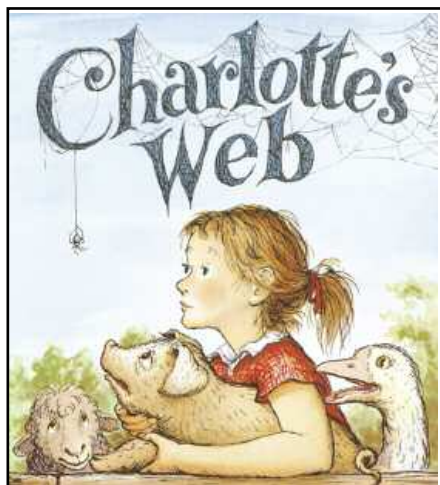

Should You Prepare for 'Fiscal Cliff'?

As an investor, you can sometimes still feel you're at the mercy of forces beyond your control. This may be especially true today, when the Federal Reserve has warned of an approaching "fiscal cliff." What can you do in the face of such a dire prediction?

First of all, you need to understand what led to the Fed's remarks. Here's the story: Some \$1.2 trillion in spending cuts are scheduled to begin in 2013 while, simultaneously, the Bush-era tax cuts — including the reduction in capital gains and dividend taxes — are set to expire. This combination of spending cuts and higher taxes could take some \$600 billion out of the economy, leading to a possible recession — and maybe something much worse, at least in the eyes of the Fed.

Still, there's no need for panic. Despite its political infighting, Congress is likely to reduce the "cliff" to a smaller bump, though it probably won't happen until after the election. But as an investor, you may need to be prepared for two significant events: market volatility, at least in the short term, and higher taxes, probably for the foreseeable future.

To combat market volatility, you need to own a broadly diversified portfolio that can handle "bumps," "cliffs" and other rugged investment terrain. This means you'll need a mix of stocks, bonds and other securities that are suitable for your needs. (Keep in mind, though, that while diversification can reduce the impact of market volatility, it cannot guarantee profits or protect against losses.) You may also need to "rebalance" your portfolio to ensure that it's still

aligned with your goals, risk tolerance and time horizon, despite the impact of volatility.

Now, let's turn to taxes. Even if taxes on income, capital gains and dividends do rise, they will still, in all likelihood, be much lower than they've been at various points in the past. Nonetheless, you may want to consider a variety of steps, including the following:

- Take advantage of tax-deferred vehicles. Contribute as much as possible to your traditional IRA, your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan, and any education savings accounts you may have, such as a 529 plan.

- Consider converting your traditional IRA to a Roth IRA. A Roth IRA provides tax-free earnings, provided you don't start taking withdrawals until you're 59½ and you've had your account for at least five years. (Be aware, though, that this conversion is taxable and may not be appropriate if you don't have money readily available to pay the taxes.)

- Consider municipal bonds. If you're in one of the upper tax brackets, you may benefit from investing in "munis," which pay interest that's free of federal taxes, and possibly state and local taxes as well.

Not all these choices will be suitable for your situation, of course. Before taking action on these items, you may want to consult with your tax and financial advisors. But give these options some thought because they may prove helpful in keeping your financial goals from going "over a cliff."

4 Easy Weight Loss Tips

Are you trying to shed some pounds this fall? There are four ways you can start adopting a healthier lifestyle with these simple steps.

1. Portion control. Throughout the years, portions have become super-sized and so have our waist lines. Try pre-portioning your snacks into small individual baggies. Look at the label to understand the true recommended portion size. Also make sure half of your plate is filled with colorful fruits and veggies at every meal.

2. Think ahead. Plan your meals ahead of time so that you are less likely to make an unhealthy last-minute food choice. Also, don't skip meals, which can cause your body to go into fat-storing starvation mode.

3. Switch to whole grains. Skip the white pastas, breads and flour. Switch to whole grains instead. They are packed with fiber to help keep you full longer and stabilize blood sugar. Plus they're packed with vitamins, minerals and antioxidants. Next time you're at the supermarket, be sure to stock up on quinoa, oatmeal, whole wheat bread, brown rice and whole grain pasta.



4. Start moving. Exercise doesn't have to be dull. Find something active that you enjoy and you'll stick with it longer. Join a recreational sports league, check out a new exercise video from your local library, go for a brisk walk, or take your kids for a bike ride after dinner. Also, remember muscle burns at least four times as many calories as fat does, so try for 20 minutes of strength training two to three times a week. If you're a Florissant resident and have visited St. Ferdinand Park, then you have probably driven by the City's Health Department.

Tucked back in the corner of St. Ferdinand Park near the recycling center is the Florissant Health Department and Animal Pound. For many years hundreds of area residents have experienced the joy of adopting a loving pet thanks to the city's Animal Control division.

Most of the animals housed at the city pound are stray animals that have been found running at large. These animals, when picked up by officers, are immediately scanned for ID microchips and checked for any other identifying marks or tags so the owners can be notified. On occasion animals are brought in that have no identifi-

cation. These dogs and cats are held for seven (7) days as required by law. This seven day period allows owners to claim their lost pets. If not claimed, suitable animals are made available for adoption.

Guidelines for adopting a pet are as follows:

- Animals are adopted on a first come, first served basis and no animals will be held for any one person unless that person found the animal and turned it over to animal control.
- Florissant residents will have first choice of adoption. If more than one resident is present at the same time then a drawing will be held.
- Individuals must be over the age of 18 to adopt.
- Valid State ID is required.
- An information form must be completed AND adopters must agree to and sign a spay/neuter contract.
- All animals must be vaccinated and city pet tags must be acquired within 30 days unless otherwise specified.

The City of Florissant Health Department and Animal Pound is located at #1 St. Ferdinand Park Drive and will be open Monday through Friday between the hours of 8am and 5pm. For further information regarding adoptions feel free to call our office at 314-839-7654.

Curbside Recycling

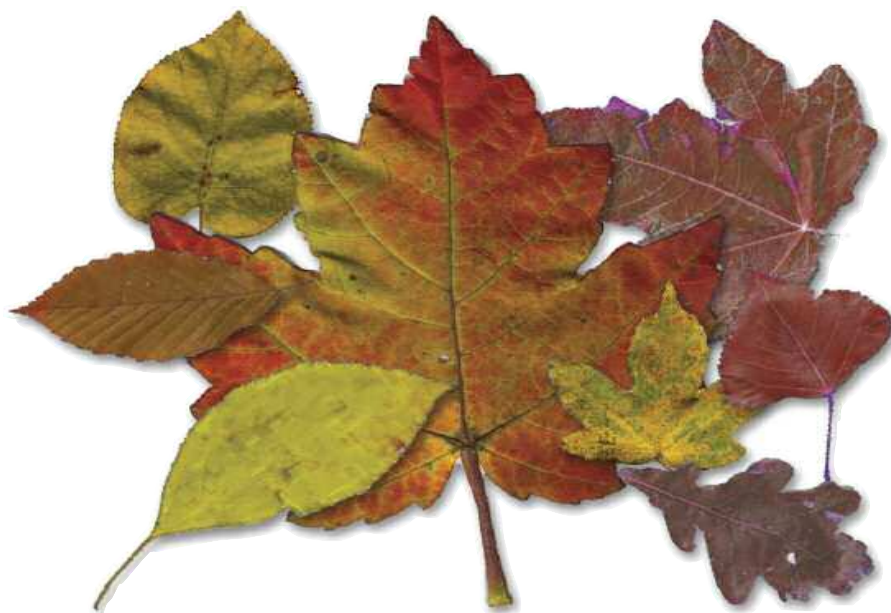


Since the City of Florissant began using a single waste hauler we have seen a steady increase of recycled material collected. These are materials that are not needlessly dumped in a landfill which would take thousands of years to decompose.

It is important to remember that there is only one landfill remaining in the St. Louis area. Anything we can keep out of the landfill is an investment in our future.

Remember, curbside recycling is included in your monthly trash bill. If you need a recycling tote call the Florissant Health Department at 839-7654. These containers are 65 gallon totes and are only used for recycling, no trash or yard waste allowed. The totes are FREE OF CHARGE and available to Florissant residents only.

Fall Clean Up



Autumn has arrived and the leaves have begun to fall. The City of Florissant would like to remind its residents that raking, sweeping, or blowing leaves or grass onto the sidewalk or street is illegal.

Yard debris tends to clog our sewer systems and makes our city streets unattractive to residents and visitors.

Now is also the time to clean-up that yard before putting out decorations. Cut back and trim up overgrown vegetation, cut and trim the grass and remove all clutter and debris that undesirable animals may find attractive during cold nights.

Be considerate of your neighbors, dispose of yard waste properly and help keep Florissant beautiful!
